She also referred members to the calendar of events on the back of the meeting agenda and our website. Upcoming events include: August 14th Cones & Bones; August 16th Spartan Speedway low speed event; August 21-24 Corvette Crossroads; September 6th Drive & Dine hosted by Ted & Julie Lasher; September 13th chassis dyno testing at Ram Racing, Saranac, MI, hosted by Gary Wyma; and the third-annual hayride and barbeque hosted by Randy & Carol Putmon on September 27th. Gloria Reiffer noted a sign-up sheet is circulating for people wishing to attend the September 20th open house at Paragon, Swartz Creek, MI.

Treasurer: Carol Putmon advised all bills are paid under the current approved budget. See her for specific account balances.

Editor: Chris Burke advised August 23rd is the deadline for submitting September newsletter information to her. John Bechtel explained that for the duration of 2008, hard copies of our newsletters will be provided free-of-charge to members unable to access them electronically. 
