



Reports:

Secretary/Ambassador: Sandy Bechtel presented minutes of the April 1, 2009, general membership meeting. Harold Leeman moved to approve them as written. Sue Keith seconded. Motion passed. Sandy advised four individuals, including Tony DeLarenzo, will be inducted into the museum's Hall of Fame during the Labor Day Celebration. Please consider attending the ceremony.

Points: Ted Lasher advised points are up-to-date on our website. He also reminded members to sign in at meetings/events so they get credit for attendance.

Membership/Historian: Angela Hyde noted we have one new member – John Manning. She reported we have 70 FCOA members and 104 members (broken down as follows): 55 Primary Members, 36 Secondary Members, 10 Members with NCCC membership elsewhere, 2 Lifetime Members, and 1 Honorary Member. Membership includes 62 Men and 42 Women.

He also noted it is not too late to register for the June 25-28 Bloomington Gold swap meet in St. Charles, IL. Dave Cripe advised their car auction will be televised this year.







