


We will meet at 8:30 a.m. at the **Quality Dairy** on W. Saginaw (by Art Van).



The 50/50 Drawing was won by Scott Bauries.


The meeting was adjourned at exactly 8:00 P.M.





April 20, 2011 Board Meeting Minutes



Social Time & Dining started around 5:30 P.M.

Meeting called to order at 6:30 PM by President Craig lansiti.

President - Craig lansiti opened the meeting with a synopsis of current things going on with club members. A discussion followed by the group as to what to do to help members who are afflicted with an incapacitating illness.

He also informed board members of a Corvette which is for sale and passed around a flyer he had received for this car.

Craig reported the addition of 2 new members, Dennis & Sandy Burt.

Craig reported on emails he has received from different clubs. One of the more interesting events to take place June 3rd thru the 5th was received from Kalamazoo Chamber of Commerce. The chamber is inviting some decision makers from different car clubs to come discover Kalamazoo with the hopes that they will frequent Kalamazoo for possible future car shows, etc. They plan to give a lot of 'free' accommodations, entrance fees, etc. to stir up interest.

Craig passed around an application for our two Career Center Scholarships just to let Board Members know what all is involved in getting a scholarship since our club funds two such scholarships.

Craig also showed a sign-up sheet for volunteers for the Bud Kout's Car Show. The emphasis will be to get volunteers early! He will have this sign-up sheet prominently displayed at future meetings.

Craig showed a Draft Ballot for the Horsepower at the Zoo. He said he will send it out for review and suggestions in an email to Board members.

A discussion followed on how to treat notices of other club's events. He is continually sent notices about events occurring in the area and wanted to have suggestions as to how to present them to membership. Gloria volunteered information on how she displayed these events on the website. She lists our club's events, other local club's events, state events, and a few national events. Out of state events are not as widely advertised.

Craig said he would follow up with Scott Bauries about club business cards which the club had previously discussed.

Secretary - Connie Britz asked for approval of March board meeting minutes. These were approved.

Treasurer - **Mike Britz** reported balance in current account since opening new account with MSU Credit Union. It was noted that there was a mistake in the printing of the checks. He said after checking with the bank, they did not see any problem with the minor mistake made in the club name by the printing company.

Governor - Simon Reiffer reported he will attend the regional meeting to be held in Lansing on April 26th and the National governors meeting to be held in St. Louis on April 30th. It will be announced at that meeting whether future meetings will be held in Indianapolis instead of St. Louis. Simon also stated he had lapel pins and could probably still get more if warranted.

Points - Kim Keith reported that points were current but still needed to be sent to webmaster, Gloria. He would get the updates to Gloria as soon as possible.

Public Relations - Sandy Bechtel had nothing to report.

Social - Carol Putmon reported she had 12 cars for the Vermontville Parade. She also said Ted Lasher had gotten a flyer together to be included in the newsletter about the upcoming Heritage Tour. She asked for suggestions and volunteers for future breakfast gettogethers.

Hearts and Flowers - Julie Lasher was not in attendance but Sue Keith had spoken with her and agreed to lead a discussion about the Hearts & Flowers Budget. Sue told members that upon investigating old records, there were a lot of things previously mentioned that we are not currently doing. It was decided to revise procedures and there was discussion about the possibility of increasing the amount in the 2012 budget from the current \$100.00 to \$300.00. This will again be discussed at next month's general membership meeting.

Historian - Sue Keith told board members about the wealth of 'goodies' found in the box of archives. She is currently composing lists of club officers which date back to 1973!

Sue also asked Board Members to write a job description for Executive and Appointed offices to be included in a Procedure Manual. Tweel New Airless Tire From Michelin

he all new airless tire from Michelin recently came out into the publics eye early in , 2005. Although it appears to be a pretty good idea and concept, they probably will not be available to the general public soon. I have looked at the idea and think it is cool, although I don't know what to think of the center rim selection that you haven't got a choice with. I'm sure that the police will probably not like the idea because the spike strips will definitely be ineffective with a set of these on your ride. The ride and handling seem to be very effective.

The first automobile to use air-filled tires was a race car built by André and Edouard Michelin in the early 1890s. More than a century later, the French company founded by the Michelin brothers is so identified with pneumatic tires that its mascot, Bibendum, is a man made of little else.



The tire maker has high expectations for the Tweel. The concept of a single-piece tire and wheel assembly is one that the company expects to spread to passenger cars and construction equipment and aircraft. The Tweel offers a number of benefits beyond being impervious to nails in the road. The tread will last two to three times as long as current radial tires, Michelin says, and when it does wear thin, it can be retreaded. For manufacturers, the Tweel offers an opportunity to reduce the number of parts, eliminating most of the 23 components of a typical new tire as well as the costly air-pressure monitors that will soon be required on new vehicles in the United States. Manufacturers have devoted an increasing amount of attention to tires that allow motorists to continue driving, at a reduced speed, for at least 100 miles, or 160 kilometers after a puncture. Several such designs are available, providing peace of mind for travelers and cutting the need for spare tires. Michelin sells them under the Pax name.



The Tweel, mounted on a car, is a single unit, though it actually begins as an assembly of four pieces bonded together: the hub, a polyurethane spoke section, a "shear band" surrounding the spokes and the tread band - the rubber layer that wraps around the circumference and touches the pavement. While the Tweel's hub functions as it would in a normal wheel - a rigid piece that attaches to the axle - the polyurethane spokes are flexible, to help absorb road impacts. The shear band surrounding the spokes effectively takes the place of the air pressure, distributing the load. The tread is similar in appearance to a conventional tire. One shortcoming of a tire filled with air is that the pressure is distributed equally around the tire, both up and down as well as side to side. That property keeps the tire round, but it also means that raising the pressure to improve cornering - increasing lateral stiffness - also adds up-down stiffness, making the ride harsher. The Tweel is in its infancy - "version 1.0," Thompson said, and only one set of car Tweels exists. A test drive in a Tweel-equipped Audi A4 sedan on roads around Michelin's research center proved to be far less exotic than the construction method or appearance would suggest. The prototype Tweels are noisy, as Thompson warned they would be, because the spokes vibrate.
