The trouble with driving too fast boils down to laws: The laws of motion and physics entice us. Civil, criminal, and insurance laws warn and protect us. Does this mean we can't enjoy America's Sportscar to its full potential? No, we just have to be smart about it.

If you still want more, you can always add a trip to the National Corvette Museum in Bowling Green, Kentucky, to your summer schedule. Its new motorsports park is very popular. Although it quite busy, walk-up rides and drives are apparently available most week days.

So, we really can enjoy putting our Corvettes through their paces, and keep everyone safe.

Historic Perfection = Gold Certification

Gorgeous, pristine and wow are some of the words you will hear to describe the Corvettes that are on display and waiting to be judged at Bloomington Gold. Certification judging became a part of Bloomington Gold in 1978. Over 200 components on each vehicle are examined by judges from the National Corvette Certification Board.

The criteria is outlined as follows: "A Gold Certified car appears as it would just after completion of "typical factory production". It means that a Corvette has been preserved or restored within 95% of the way if appeared when it left the factory – no better, no worse, no different." Originality comprises 45% of the scoring, damage and deterioration 33%, numbers: casting, stamping and V.I.N. 10%, technical inspection 8% and cleanliness 4%.

This year the Bloomington Gold event was held at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway from June 25 - 27. The teams of judges, each with a clipboard and scoring forms, began their inspections promptly at 8AM on Friday. The Corvettes that have registered for judging were lined up in production year order. This offers an excellent opportunity to compare the changes that have occurred from year to year. The judging fee for 1953-1972 vehicles is \$600 and the fee for 1973-2015 cars is \$500.

Seeing Corvettes that have been maintained or restored to this level of originality is thrilling and educational. Watching the judges inspect these cars is amazing as they scrutinize the minutest details of the various components. The cars registered for Gold Certification remain on display throughout the three day event. Bloomington Gold offers a great variety of activities and experiences and will return to the Indianapolis Motor Speedway June 23 - 25, 2016.
