



Check Out the Chevrolet Corvette Stringray Pace Car for the 105th Indianapolis 500

For the 18th time in race history, Chevrolet Corvette will serve as the pace car for the Indianapolis 500.

This time, it's the 2021 mid-engine Chevrolet Corvette Stingray hardtop convertible that will lead the 33-car field for the 105th Running of the Indianapolis 500 presented by Gainbridge on May 30.

The Arctic White Stingray will be the first convertible since 2008 to pace the 500.

Chevrolet and Corvette have led the starting field more than any other manufacturer and nameplate, respectively. The 2021 race marks the 32nd time for Chevrolet to pace the 500 dating back to 1948, and the 18th time since 1978.

The car will feature sky cool gray and strike yellow upholstery. The car includes an exclusive stripe package and unique Stingray decals. The Corvette also strobe lights in the headlights, front louvers and taillights. This makes the car even more visible during its pace-car duties.
