



Capital City Corvette Club Celebrates 65 Years

The Capital City Corvette Club of Lansing, MI was formed in 1958 and has continued a tradition of fun and fellowship for sixty-five years.



Capital City Corvette Club is a charter member of the National Council of Corvette Clubs and is designated as club number MI-003. When the club was formed in 1958, Jim Hoppin was its first president. Jim was also secretary for NCCC when it was formed in 1959 and was instrumental in creating the NCCC steering wheel logo. Jim Hoppin continued his role with NCCC by serving as

president in 1962 and 1963. The club was delighted to have Jim as a guest speaker at one of our monthly membership meetings in 2011.

When the NCCC convention was held in St Louis in 1961, thirty-three members of Capital City Corvette Club made the trip in twenty-three Corvettes. In 1962, the convention was held in Lansing, MI and hosted by Capital City Corvette Club. The July 1962 issue of "Blue Bars" featured an article about the Capital City Corvette Club and the upcoming convention. Their guest speaker was Zora Duntov who was accompanied by his wife, Elfi. Participants caravanned in their Corvettes to the assembly plant in Flint, MI.

Other club members also played an active role in NCCC. Art Miller was NCCC president in 1964 and 1965. Gary Cross was president in 1966. The NCCC President's Award was given to Darwin Thomas in 1964, to Gary Cross in 1965 and to Simon Reiffer in 2022.

The club's first sponsor was Lee MacGillivray Chevrolet in Haslett, Michigan. The early meetings were held at the dealership which allowed the members to use the service bays to wash and work on their Corvettes. A real plus during



Michigan winters! Early club members enjoyed car shows, rallyes and racing. Some of them even raced their Corvettes on frozen Lake Lansing. Josh Joslin had a 1963 Corvette that he raced at Virginia International Raceway, the SCCA Divisional at Meadowdale and the Road America 500 in Elkhart, Wisconsin.

The Owens-Corning Fiberglas Corporation had a close relationship with General Motors and the early Corvette clubs because Owens-Corning was producing the body panels for

the Corvette. Members of the Capital City Corvette Club traveled to their manufacturing facility for a tour. Owens-Corning gave an annual award to the club that had shown the most enthusiastic support of the Corvette hobby. Capital City Corvette Club was given a Steuben crystal bowl in 1961 and 1962 in recognition of receiving this honor.





We are part of the Michigan Region of NCCC. The club's 99 members enjoy a wide range of activities including car shows, rallyes, parades, region events and road tours, which typically result in a unique dining experience. Our current sponsor is Shaheen Chevrolet in Lansing, Michigan. We host numerous events to raise funds for local charities such as VFW National Home for Children, the Greater Lansing Food Bank, Toys for Tots and Children's Miracle Network.

The Capital City Corvette Club has touched many lives in the past sixty-five years. Its current members look forward to continuing our rich legacy of friendships, service and the enjoyment of Corvette ownership.

As we head into another season of fun activities with our Corvettes, here are some things to remember if you are participating in a caravan.

NCCC CARAVAN GUIDELINES (1/10)

1.1 GENERAL

- 1. All cars in the Caravan should drive with their headlights **ON**.
- 2. IF ANY MEMBERS OF THE CARAVAN HAVE TWO-WAY RADIOS, IT IS A GOOD IDEA TO HAVE ONE FOR THE LEAD CAR AND ANOTHER FOR THE END CAR.
- 3. The use of waivers and an assigned Non-Sanction number are recommended.

1.2 CARAVAN ORGANIZATION

1.2.1 DRIVING FROM PLACE TO PLACE IN TOWN

- 1. A lead car should be designated.
- 2. Keep in sight of the car behind you.
- 3. Re-group after several stop lights or stop signs.
- 4. Absolutely no passing other members of the Caravan unless the member waves you around.
- 5. Use had signal for slowing down to stop.
- 6. Obey all speed signs and other traffic signs.

1.2.2 DRIVING FROM ONE TOWN TO ANOTHER

- 1. A lead car should be designated.
- 2. Keep in sight of the car behind you.
- 3. Re-group at the city limits of town where open highway speed signs are posted.
- 4. Absolutely no passing other members of the Caravan unless the member waves you around.
- 5. Allow car passing space between cars, one car length for every ten (10) miles per hour.
- 6. Use hand signal for slowing down, stopping or turning.
- 7. Obey all speed signs and other traffic signs.
