



# Removing Cone Marks after an Autocross Weekend





As much as I would like to tell you how good of a driver I am on track days, the truth is the cones get more scared than other competitors do when I come up to the start line. Due to this, I often have cone scuff marks on my car. This is just some plastic transfer and does not hurt the finish, but sure does look unsightly for those of us who use our autocross car for other purposes than just track events. I have developed a pretty quick and easy way to remove them without too much elbow grease. Follow below for the process, the is usually 10-15 minutes for me after each event.



Meguiar's Cleaner Wax Mothers Power Ball (Or Cone)



Dab the wax on the area where the scuff marks are

Use Drill on high speed setting to buff the marks with the wax using light pressure. Let the speed and the cone do the work. You can follow up with any wax you want and it works on ceramic coated vehicles as well.



Buff off with a microfiber towel to a nice shine and you are good to head off to the car show next.

### V/P Governor: Simon Reiffer

- The Governor's meeting was on September 9, 2023. From the meeting: Shannon Davis the FCOA Director resigned. Let me know if you are interested in this position. You can get online and fill out the application.
- From Bill Docherty, VP of Competition, the highlights of the proposed rulebook changes are:
  - 2022-R5 Allow Friday events after a Thursday holiday but no 4-day event weekends.
  - 2022-R8 Updated flyer section, removing Governor addresses and requiring only overall chair person.
  - o 2022-R10 Increase club sanctions from 10 to 14 per year.
  - 2023-R1 Change People's Choice Concourse to Car Show and delete paragraphs on awards and class.
  - 2023-R2 Divide Men's and Ladies standings into speed and non-speed standings. Clubs will remain as total point standings. Top 15 competitors in both speed and non-speed standings will receive awards.
- Steve Johnson, VP Membership, reported that in September 2022 we had 18,901 members, 237 clubs. We now have 19,198 members, 240 clubs.
- Walt Jenkins, Director of IT stated that 14,000 emails go out each month.

- Dale Samuelson, 2023 Convention Chair reported that the convention had 735 adults 13 youth, and 108-day passes. \$39,587.63 in profits to be split between St. Jude and NCCC. They had \$1,187 in merchandise sales.
- Jeff Bruggeman & Jim Walton, 2024 Convention Co-Chairs reported next year's convention will be May 13-19 in Joplin, MO. Holiday Inn and LaQuinta Inn are the host hotels. Comfort Inn will be the overrun hotel. Banquet will be at Down Stream Casino and instead of the usual bus trips they are planning on Corvette cruises.
- 2024 NCCC Officer Elections: VP of Competition candidates are Rene Cardenas and "Captain Jack" Alexander; Secretary, Ellen Schwartz; Business Manager, Allen Morris; and Sargeant at Arms, Tom West.
- The voting is posted and Simon will be voting online.
- You can go to the National website and read through all of the bylaw changes. There are also 12 rule book changes.
- Members discussed the increase sanctioned events from 10 to 14. If you have any opinions as to the way you would like to see Simon vote, please contact him.
- Insurances are getting extremely picky because of so many lawsuits.


