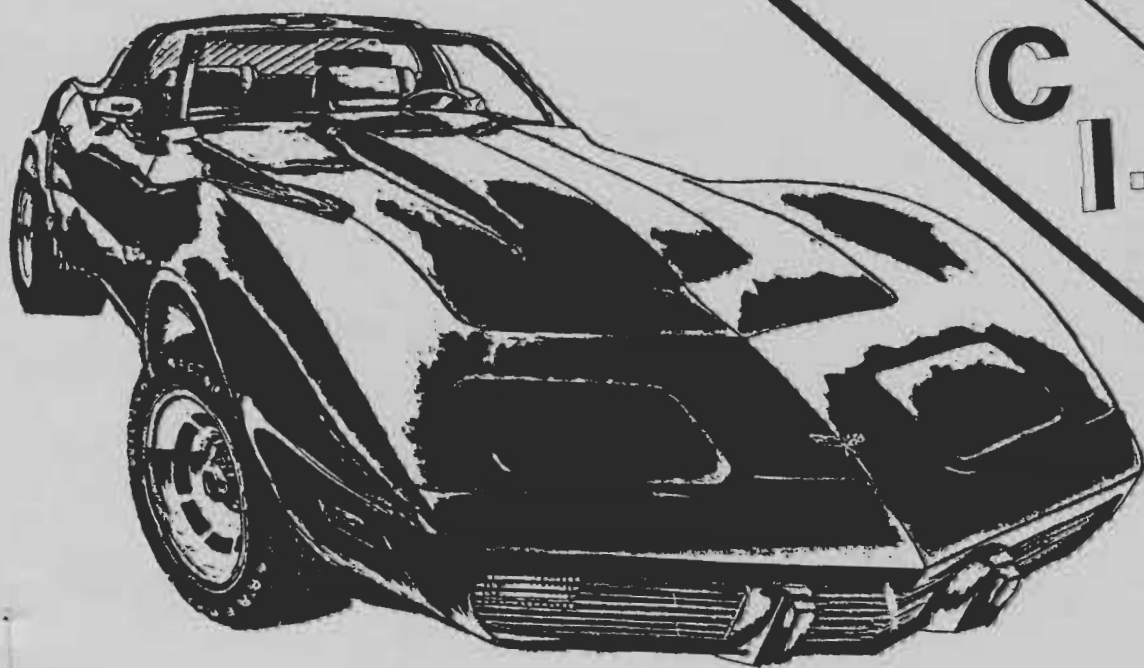
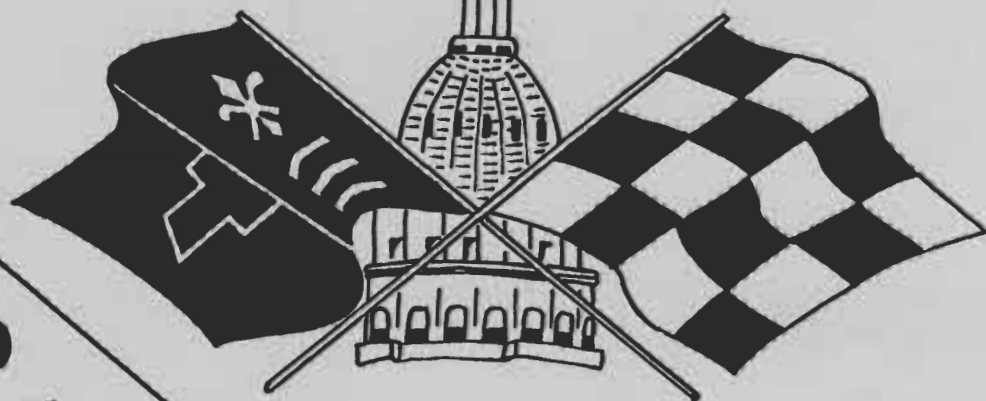

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

1991

ARTICLE I - Name and Purpose

Section A

Name - The name of the club shall be the Capital City Corvette Club, Incorporated.

Section B

Purpose - The purpose or purposes of this corporation are recited in part as follows;

1. To promote the sport of and pastime of, safe motoring in all its aspects; and
2. To promote the ownership of and to further the interest in Chevrolet Corvette sport vehicles; and
3. To promote, sponsor, organize and supervise motorcar outings, meetings, competitions, reliability trials, hill climbs and other events, whether motoring or otherwise; and
4. To offer prizes and awards in respect thereof or make such arrangements and commitments as may be necessary for any such purpose; and
5. To acquire by purchase, lease or otherwise, any property, real or personal or mixed; and to own, hold, improve, develop, manage, and sell, lease, exchange, mortgage, or otherwise dispose of any property so acquired; and in general to carry on any business in connection therewith and incident thereto not forbidden by the laws of the State of Michigan.

ARTICLE II - Membership and Dues

Section A

Membership

1. Active - Membership in the Club shall be restricted to owners of Chevrolet Corvettes who have reached the age of 18. An application for an active member shall be forwarded to the Board of Directors for approval. The applicant must submit to the Board for inspection a valid operator's license and proof of proper insurance. Any person approved by the Board and having paid such annual dues and fees as required shall be designated as an active member. Members who no longer own a Chevrolet Corvette may retain membership by non-lapsed payment of dues. The active membership allows renewal of only one associate or spouse membership per year. The Club mailings will be sent to the active member.

ARTICLE II - Membership and Dues

Section A

Membership (continued)

2. Honorary - Membership in the Club as an Honorary member shall be restricted to those persons appointed at the discretion of a quorum of the Board of Directors, and shall for a period no longer than one year. The Honorary member shall not hold office, vote or pay dues.

3. Spouse Member - (Restricted to Husband or Wife of Active member) Membership in the Club as a Spouse Member will have all the Club privileges of an active member. No Club dues are required to receive Club points, but NCCC spouse dues are required, in order to be chair person of any NCCC sanctioned event and to accumulate NCCC and Region points.

4. Associate Member - Friends of an active member must pay NCCC dues in order to receive club points. They may not hold office or vote. The renewal application must be signed by the original active member and renewed yearly. The Club mailings will be sent to the Active member only.

Section B

Dues

1. Active - Annual Club Dues shall be; \$15.00 new, \$12.00 renewal. Annual NCCC Dues are subject to change at the discretion of the National Council of Corvette Clubs.

2. Honorary - No dues.

3. Spouse - No Club dues required.

4. Associate - NCCC spouse member dues.

Section C

Expulsion

1. Non-payment of dues - Membership will automatically lapse to all Club Priviledges.

2. Infraction of Rules - Any member may be expelled for infraction of Club Rules, or such other causes as may be determined by the majority of a quorum of the Board of Directors as being in the best interest of the Club. However, before such action is taken, the member shall have an opportunity to submit in writing or in person their position on any charge of which they shall be notified in writing.

ARTICLE II - Membership and Dues

Section C

Expulsion (continued)

3. Insurance - Any member is automatically expelled at the time their proper insurance is not in force. They can be reinstated upon proof of the proper insurance has been renewed.

Section D

Resignation

1. Resignation - Any member may resign by directing a letter of resignation to the Secretary. The resignation shall be effective upon receipt, provided all indebtedness to the Club is paid, and all real club property tangible and or intangible, has been returned. In the event of resignation by a member, no rebate of dues previously paid to the club shall be made.

ARTICLE III

Section A

Meetings

1. General Membership Meetings - Meetings shall be held at a place and time to be specified by the Board of Directors: Monthly reports shall be presented by Officers and Committees as required by the President.

2. Special Meetings - In addition, special meetings of the Members may be called by the president, by a quorum of the Board of Directors or by petition by 10 (ten) active members.

3. Board Meetings - Meetings in addition to the General Membership meeting, which a quorum of the Board of Directors shall attend, at a place and time specified by a quorum of the Board of Directors. The Board Meeting is open to the General Membership for observation not participation.

Section B

1. Notice of Meetings - A written or printed notice, stating the place, day and hour of any meeting of members, including special meetings, shall be given to the Editor not less than 10 days before the last day of the preceding month for which the event will take place. The notice will be printed by the last day of the preceding month for which the publication is for. All contents are the responsibility of the Editor and/or the Board of Directors and will be mailed to each active member, postpaid, to the address appearing upon the records of the Club.

ARTICLE III

Section C

1. Quorum shall be the members present at any General Membership, Special or Board meeting where notice has been previously given as herein provided. At a Board of Directors Meeting a Quorum shall be the majority of the Board Members.

Section D

1. Each Board Member will have only 1 vote regardless of the number of offices held.

2. Proxy - Voting by proxy or absentee ballot in any meeting of the members or the Board of Directors shall not be allowed. In the Election of Officers, absentee ballots shall be allowed.

ARTICLE IV

Section A

1. Officers - Must be members in good standing.

Section B

1. The Elected Officers Of the Club shall be:

- 1) President - Must have held some prior office in the Club.
- 2) Governor - Vice President
- 3) Secretary
- 4) Treasurer
- 5) Competition Director
- 6) Membership
- 7) Social
- 8) Editor
- 9) Public Relations
- 10) Points

Section C

1. Vacancies - Any Vacancies of Officers or Members of the Board of Directors before July 1st shall be filled by nomination and election by membership. After July 1st such a vacancy shall be filled by appointment by the President, and subject to approval of the majority of the Board of Directors. In the event of the Presidents office being vacated after July 1st the Board of Directors shall elect a successor from the Board of Directors at a Board Meeting.

ARTICLE IV

Section D

1. Compensation and Reimbursement - No Officer shall be compensated by the Club for service in carrying out the duties of office. No Officer or member shall be reimbursed for automobile operating or allied expenses incurred in planning an event or in performing Club business, except as designated by the Board of Directors. Receipt for purchases of supplies for normal Club operations, stationary, postage, and the like, when made with the express consent of the President and/or the Treasurer, may be presented to the latter for payment. Any other purchase in excess of \$20.00 will be brought before the members for pre-approval.

2. The Govenor or NCCC Club Proxy shall be reimbursed for gas, one night's lodging and one main meal when attending all NCCC Govenor's meetings. Receipts should be presented when possible.

ARTICLE V

Duties of Officers

Section A

1. Duties of the President - The President shall preside at all meetings of the Members and officers, and shall perform the duties usually pertaining to this office. The President may call special meetings of the members of the Board of Directors, and may exercise special authority as noted elsewhere in this Constitution. The President shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the Club.

2. Duties of the Govenor - The Govenor shall attend at least 75% of the total scheduled meetings established by the National Council of Corvette Clubs and shall present to this Club all activities or communications regarding items to both. The Govenor shall report all items for publication, competition, membership and social functions to each respective Officer for their information. The Govenor will also serve as the Club's Vice President and will except the duties of the President during his/her absents.

3. Duties of the Secretary - The Secretary shall attend all meetings of the Members and Officers and shall record all minutes and votes in a book kept for that purpose. In the absense of the Secretary, another member shall be chosen by the President to perform said duties protempore. It shall be the responsibility of the Secretary to handle Club correspondence.

ARTICLE V

Duties of Officers

Section A (continued)

4. Duties of the Treasurer - The treasurer shall have custody of all monies, debts, and obligations belonging to the Club and shall make all payments of the Club debts upon the approval of the President and/or the board of Directors. All checks drafts, and other orders for payment of money shall be signed in the name of the Club by the treasurer and one of Three other Board Members specified by the President and approved by the Board of Directors. A report of the financial status of the Club monies shall be given at each regular meeting, and whenever requested by the President.

5. Duties of the Competition Director - The responsibility of all competition events sponsored by this Club and/or coordinated with any other organization pertaining directly to competition is appointed to the Competition Director. The Competition Director shall attend at least 75% of all the Michigan Region Meetings and report back to the general membership in writing. It is the responsibility of the Competition Director in performing the expected duties governed by the Michigan Region Sanctioned Events, Times, Dates and Locations must be made readily available in the newsletter and the General Membership meeting to all Club Members within a proper time prior to that said event. The Competition Director is responsible to select and purchase the year end awards and patches.

6. Duties of the Membership Director - The Membership Director shall perform such duties as shall be designated by the Board of Directors and assume the responsibilities of recruiting New Members putting up Promotional Displays at all Club functions involving the Public, collecting membership dues, submitting to the Club Governor the NCCC and Club renewals, and keeping membership records up to date. Membership shall also handle the promotional perks given out by NCCC to Master Members and perks given by the Club to New Members. Also the Membership Director is responsible to have published, in the newsletter at least twice a year, a membership list with addresses and phone numbers.

7. The Duties of the Social Director - The Social Director shall perform such duties as designated by the Board of Directors and shall assume the responsibilities of the coordination of all Club Social functions, including arranging restaurants after General Membership Meetings. The Social Director shall make readily available in the newsletter and General Membership meeting, times, dates and locations of all social events.

ARTICLE V

Duties of Officers

Section A (continued)

8. The Duties of the Editor - The Editor shall perform such duties designated by the Board of Directors. Also it is the Editors job to assume the responsibility of recruiting Advertisers for the Newsletter, also gathering, organizing and printing all pertinent data and information in a monthly newsletter. The newsletter shall contain reports from each officer with minutes from General Membership, Board or Special meeting and any other information of interest to the Membership as a whole. It shall be published within the last day of the preceeding month for the month the publication is intended. The Newsletter shall be taken to the Post Office, and mailed to every Active Member and Advertiser in good Club. Extra newsletters shall be printed for promotional use by the Membership and Public Relations Directors and any Club Member.

9. The Duties of the Public Relations Director - The Public Relations shall perform such duties as shall be designated by the Board of Directors to promote Club participation in Civic Activities and to Enhance the image of the Club and its events. It is also the responsibility for the safekeeping of the Club Artifacts.

10. The Duties of the Points Director - The Points Director shall perform such duties as shall be designated by the Board of Directors. Also it is their duty to provide a list possible points to be earned and to compile such points. Monthly Up - to - Date points are required to be made available to the General Members.

ARTICLE VI - Committees

Section A

1. Appointment of Committees - The President, with the concurrence of the Board of Directors, shall appoint such committees as desirable, from time to time, and shall outline the duties and responsibilities of such committees. All reports or action taken by a committee shall first be approved by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VII - Elections

Procedures

Section A

1. Nominations from the floor will be accepted at any regular business meeting in October. Nominations from the floor must be seconded and formally accepted by the nominee. Nominations will be formally closed at the adjournment of the last meeting of the meeting in October.

ARTICLE VII - Elections

Procedures

Section A (continued)

2. A list of all the candidates will be published in the November Newsletter and the formal elections shall be conducted at the first regular business meeting in December.

3. Only members who have renewed their dues for the following year may vote in election of officers, or be voted as an Officer.

4. Absentee Ballots should be placed in an envelope with the Voters name on the outside and placed into another envelope and mailed to the designated person.

5. Term of Office shall be from January 1 to December 31st.

ARTICLE VIII - Fiscal Year

Section A

1. The Fiscal Year of the Club shall run from December 1st to November 30th.

ARTICLE IX

Liability

Section A

1. All persons (corporations, partnerships, groups or associations) extending credit to, contracting with, or having any claim against the Club or the Officers thereof shall look only to the funds and property of the Club for payment of any such judgement, contract, claim, debt, damage or decree or any other monies that otherwise become due or payable to them from the Club or its Officers, so that neither the members of the Club nor the Officers present or future shall in any manner be personally liable thereof.

Section B

1. Under no circumstances shall the Club, its property, Board of Directors or members be responsible for any debts, damages or liabilities of any kind or nature, incurred or sustained by any individual member, or any person acting in its name, unless said individual has obtained prior approval in writing from the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE X - Indemnification

Section A

1. The Board of Directors shall indemnify and reimburse from the funds of the Club each Director or Officer of the Club, and their heirs, executors or administrators, for any judgement against them and for expenses necessarily incurred by them in connection with the defense or reasonable settlement of any action, suit or proceeding to which they are made a party by reason of their being a director or Officer of the Club or by reason of their conduct as such.

ARTICLE XI - Amendment of Constitution and By-laws

Section A

1. Procedure - The Board of Directors of the Club and/or ten (10) Members in good standing, by a written petition submitted to the Secretary, may propose an amendment to this Constitution. Upon such proposal being made, a copy thereof shall be distributed or mailed to each member no less than fourteen (14) days prior to the next General Membership meeting, and shall be voted upon at said meeting.

Called to order by President Patrick Dolan at 1:15 P.M. National officers are introduced. Regional officers introduced themselves & new clubs in their Regions. Michigan has a new club called Michigan Autocross Group (for competition die-hards).

By-laws committee was introduced. If you have a desire to present a by-law change get it to the Region Exec Jean Morrison, thru me if you so desire.

Gary Kozier made motion secretary's minutes be approved as printed. (This has been Gary's role at the meetings for at least 10 years.) Motion passed.

Competition - Concours rule changes will be presented at July meeting at convention. They are suggesting a judging change so that 6 people will look at each car - 2 for engine, interior & exterior, one class change will be to divide '68-'77 from '78-'82.

Other recommendations - Helmets must be Snell 85 (no equivalent)

Fire suits required in ~~Group~~^{GROUP} III at high speed events

Drag record events - 3 per region - 2 after convention - 1 per date over country

Clarifications - Parade laps are required for high speed events only.

Must cars be jacked up for tech? Must we answer that? Only if you want to do it right. Must cars in car shows - club discretion if shown inside or out.

Memberships currently at 8277 - highest it's been in May in 8 years. Michigan has 14 clubs with about 381 members.

Treasurer stated budget looks good now but an expected insurance increase of 20% for 1992.

Convention - Charlotte, North Carolina July '92 - 20 See schedule enclosed.

Registration is up to 570 High speed event at Charlotte Motor Speedway

Children's program (2 age groups) sounds great with day at Caverns, live bands, etc.

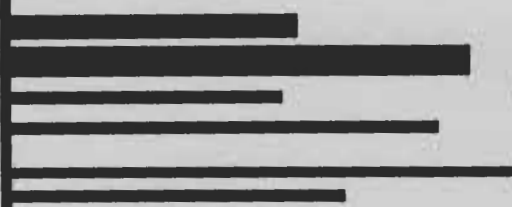

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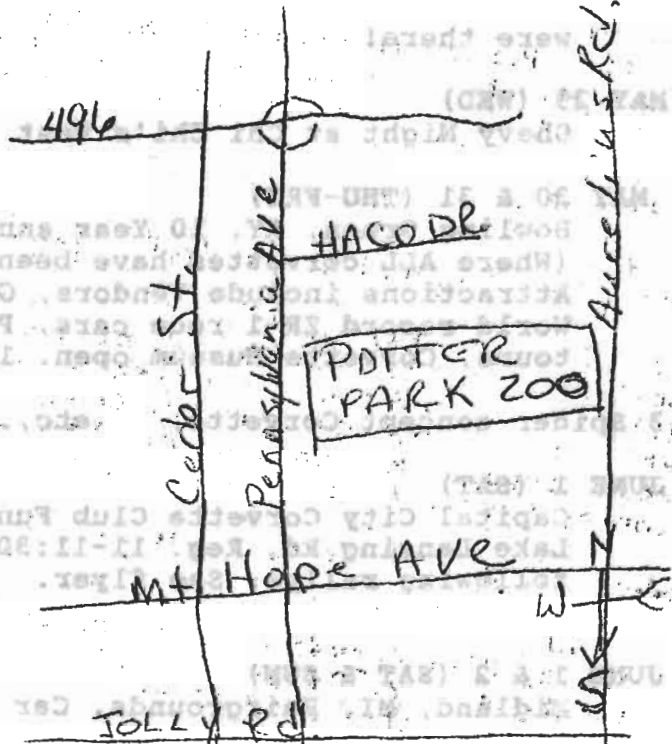

May has certainly been a busy month so far. And ALOT of fun too! I have been to several events and I am making plans to attend more yet.

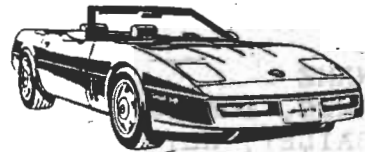
