

Social-After the meeting we will meet at Deluca's. The first meeting in October we will have a mini-golf outing with the Jackson Club at the mini-golf near Mason on Cedar Street.

Govenor-There is a Region meeting 9/10/91 at the Holiday Inn -South, starting at 7:30pm. There is a Govenors meeting on 9/13 & 14/91; highlights of the last meeting minutes; Competition - The new helmet rule requires approved helmets must be SNELL APPROVED 85. The National Association introduced the Future Corvette Owners Association, which has a \$5.00 membership fee and is for kids 18 and under. Concourse rules were accepted and published in the last Blue Bars. Final rule changes were made in September to be voted on in Novembers meeting. Membership currently has 8706 members. Currently National is setting up a distribution center for NCCC items. Treasurer says they are currently running budget. If the bylaws are not accepted in the present form they must be changed to reflect our opinions, republished in the newsletter, and revoted again.

ARTICLE V

Duties of Officers

Section A (continued)

- 8. The Duties of the Editor The Editor shall perform such duties designated by the Board of Directors. It is the Editors job to assume the responsibility of gathering, organizing and printing all pertinent data and information in a monthly newsletter. The newsletter shall contain reports from each officer with minutes from General Membership, Board or Special meeting and any other information of interest to the Membership as a whole. It shall be published within the last day of the preceeding month for the month the publication is intended. The Newsletter shall be taken to the Post Office, and mailed to every Active Member and Advertiser in good Club. Extra newsletters shall be printed for promotional use by the Membership and Public Relations Directors and any Club Member.
- 9. The Duties of the Public Relations Director The Public Relations shall perform such duties as shall be designated by the Board of Directors to promote Club participation in Civic Activities and to Enhance the image of the Club and its events.
