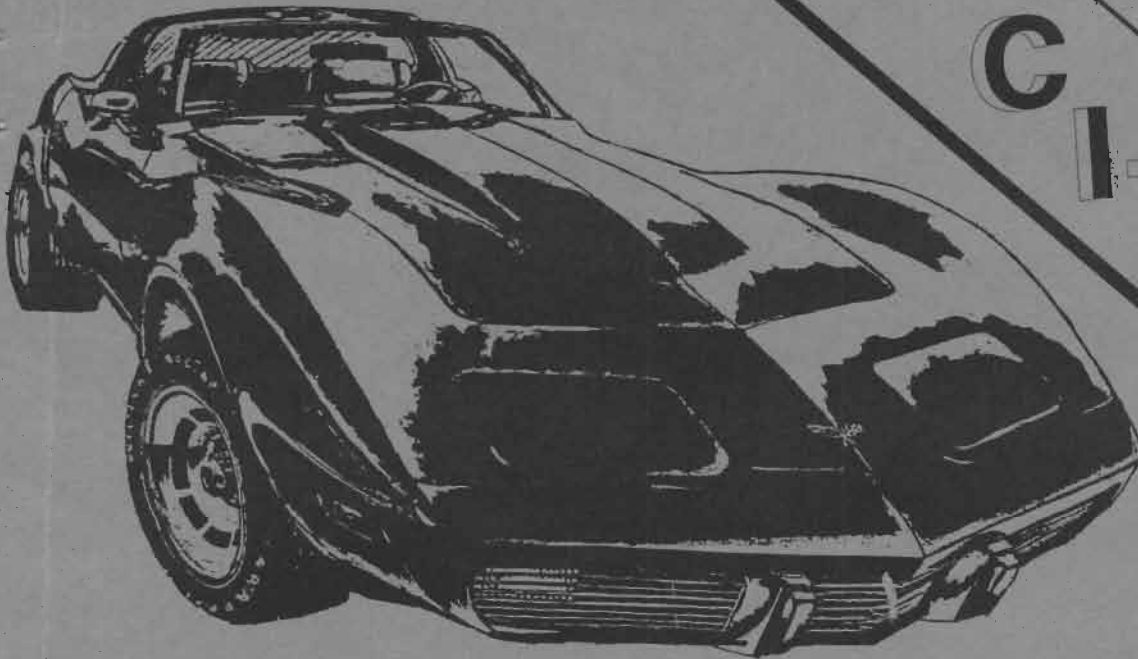
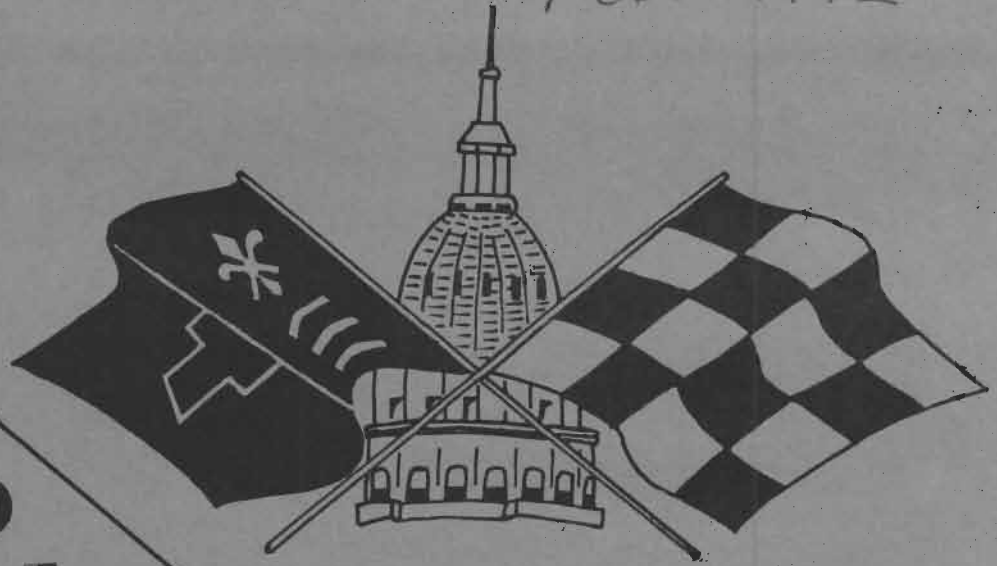

I would like to take this opportunity to welcome all of our members to the Club for the 1992 season.

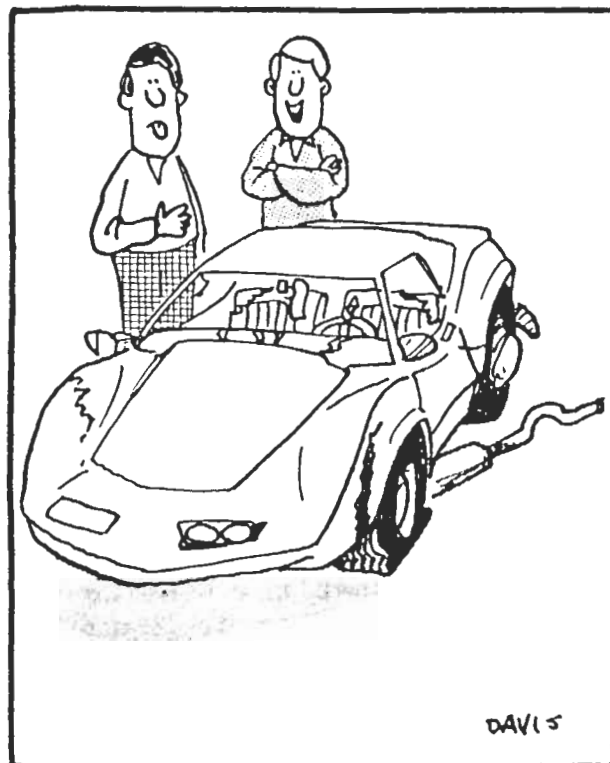
I hope this year can be a year of growth for our Club, and all of our members will enjoy whatever events they choose to participate in.
