Jean announced an increase of 20% on NCCC insurance rates. Discussion concerning job classification of R.Es. was brought up by Jim Harris and reviewed.

Jim reported that as of September 14,1991, the Michigan Region had 400 members in 14 clubs, GVCA being the largest club. NCCC membership is 8,956 (highest in 10 years). Renewals should be to Jim by December 1, 1991.

You will be getting 2 print-out sheets, one is for your records and the other is sent to Jim. Use a black felt-tip marker over the entire line of anyone not renewing. Keep it to one Club check. As for your 51% Sheet, make a copy for yourself for reference and keep a work sheet. Check the Print-out Sheet for any changes. There will be a sticker for your 1991 membership cards. Rose Schmitt will be handling an NCCC central mailing for membership. Jim needs a list of Governors for 1992. It is strongly recommended that each club is incorporated in case of a lawsuit. You will need your membership card to vote at NCCC meetings.

COMPETITION REPORT

The competition season is upon us and there are several things happening that you will want to be aware of.

First, I received a copy of the NCCC changes at the Region Meeting, Tuesday, February 25th. If you would like a copy, please contact me. There are several pages so I will not be putting them in the Newsletter.

Second, the points system for CCCC has been changed. There was much deliberation regarding the points system and we wanted to be as fair as possible to everyone. In the past it would appear the points were designed for a few, leaving others without much hope for achieving recognition in the points standing. We hope this has been alleviated.

A copy of the new points system has been included in this newsletter. Please note the changes with probably the most obvious one being the worker points or lack of. There will be NO worker points for the chairpeople of an event. The chairpeople are expected to work the event that is why they are the chairpeople. The workers of the event are the only members eligible for worker points.

If you are wondering how this came about it is an attempt to give every member the same opportunity to finish in the top ten in the points standings. There are not enough events each year for every member to have an opportunity to chair something, but there are plenty of members who work very hard at these events.

For those of you who are not familiar with the points system, this is a brief explanation.

There are awards given out each year at the Annual Awards Banquet. These awards are based on the top ten points leaders in the following categories: All around (points for everything), race, rally, and concours. These points are earned according to the published rules.

This issue contains the Points Standings as of Mid February. These standings may or may not change as Phil has not had an opportunity to adjust his figures based on the new rules. If you have any questions regarding points, please contact Phil or myself.

I have also received the final points standings for the Region. As they have not been published yet, I will just recap them for you.

CCCC finished 3rd in the overall points 234 points from 1st place, 3rd place in the Speed Trails, and 2nd in Matching Times.

Our individual winners were:

Art Doty - 3rd overall, 5th speed, 2nd matching times, 9th rallye Steve Spinrad - 4th overall, 6th speed, 3rd matching times, and 6th rallye Nancy Doty - 3rd overall, 5th speed, 1st matching times, and 9th rallye Loretta Ames - 5th overall, 4th speed, 5th matching times, and 6th rallye James Myers - 3rd concours Penny Myers - 4th concours Marty Riel - 1st Rallye Linda Riel - 3rd Rallye Pat Spinrad - 12th Rallye The complete finalized list will be available in March at the Banquet.

As I stated earlier this year, the calendar in the region is determined by the club point standings. This year CCCC finished 3rd, lets go for #1 in 1992!!!

As stated earlier, the Region Meeting was held Tuesday, February 25th and several things were discussed.

Deb Corbin highlighted the rule book changes and I presented the letter (published in this Newsletter) written by the Club. There were a number of people in agreement with us that it is pretty hard to comply with rules no one has seen. Our concerns will be relayed to the powers to be this weekend's Governor's Meeting, however, I wouldn't hold out much hope.

The Region is quickly running out of money and we are looking for ways to improve the treasury. There was a strong appeal made to all Competition Directors to inquire of their club members about fund raising ideas.

There were several items to discuss and to cover everything at this time would be redundant as I will publish the minutes as soon as I receive them. The minutes of the last meeting are in this publication and I have covered the highlighted areas.

Jim Harris is still looking for Convention Chairpeople if anyone is interested. He still needs someone to handle beverages, Corvette Mall, Door Prizes and Raffle, Concours, and Rallye. Please, if you are at all interested contact Jim Harris, FCC or myself and I will relay your interest on to Jim.

The Raffle Ticket for the free room at the Region Banquet was raffled and unfortunately no one from our club won. However, Bob Reeve did when the 50/50 raffle for a total of \$16.00

As a Charter Club of NCCC we are writing to express our deep concerns and great dissatisfaction in regards to a still non-published Rule Book for 1992.

As stated in the 1990/1991 Rule Book the purpose of the sanction program "is to encourage inter-activity between individual Corvette Clubs within the National Council. The National Council is operating the Sanctioned Program to provide uniform and <u>fair standards</u> under which competition events may be sponsored by individual Corvette Clubs."

The 1992 Competition Season started January 1 and is well underway and not one of our members has seen a completed rule book for 1992. As rumor has it, the rules have been changed substantially, therefore putting everyone <u>unfamiliar with the rule changes</u> at a severe disadvantage for competitive purposes.

We do not want to believe National Council is trying to promote dissention among its members, but that is exactly what is happening. Consideration must be taken as to hardship this has and will cause all clubs and their members that participate in NCCC Sanctioned Events.

In reviewing past rule books, the first thing we read is how our organization is trying to promote sportsmanship and competition that is fair to all participants. Is this really true or are we just reading empty words? No one should be put at a handicap to compete in any sanctioned event, but that is exactly what is happening. You cannot expect the players to play by the rules, if they don't know what the rules are.

We are therefore requesting the 1992 competition rules for all categories be suspended and revert back to the 1991 competition rules for the 1992 competition season.
