#### MICHIGAN REGION MEETING MINUTES

#### February 25, 1992

The meeting was called to order at 7:45 by RCD Deb Corbin at the Holiday Inn, Lansing, Michigan.

#### Secretary - Susan Butters

The previous minutes were approved as written.

#### Treasurer - Susan Butters

Susan passed out copies of the Treasurer's report and the final 1991 statement.

Balance as of February 25, 1992 \$1,361.68

Ways of increasing the treasury balance were discussed. Several ideas were suggested, start having 50/50 drawings again, at Region Meeting and also have various events; Sell T-Shirts. Loretta Ames will assist Susan in working up ideas to increase treasury.

#### Points Director - Sharon Meesseman

Sharon announced that she had final points standings but hadn't had time to separate them. If you want a copy now, see her otherwise copies will be available at the next meeting.

#### Regional Executive - Roger Thomas

Deb announced that Roger wasn't in attendance (something about going to Las Vegas for someone's birthday). However, he will be attending Governor's meeting this weekend. If you aren't going to Governor's meeting see Susan for a proxy.

#### Regional Membership Director - Jim Harris

Renewals were mostly in on time - not a great deal of problems. GVCA still the largest club in Michigan with 59 members. Memberships are downs in MAL. Reminded everyone that if they plan on attending May governor's meeting, should get reservations in right away, because we have an excellent room rate for Indy time trials. Membership packets have been received by some people but not all. Will find out more information this weekend on this.

#### Regional Competition Director - Deb Corbin

Deb reviewed a letter she has received from Vice President - Competition regarding what he expects from all RCD's. In turn, she requires the same from all Competition Reps.

- Sanction Requests must be received postmarked 70 days prior to the event.
- Flyers must be postmarked at least 50 days prior to the event and must be in the correct format.

If the other RCD's and VP - Competition do not receive the flyer at least thirty (30) days prior to the event, it will not count for National Points.

- 3. The VP-Comp is to receive correct results within 30 days of the event or points will be pulled.
- 4. Non-Sanctioned Events A club may host a non-sanctioned event and be covered by NCCC insurance if there are no NCCC sanctioned events (of any type) within 100 miles in the Region and if there is NO CONFLICT WITH NCCC SAFETY GUIDELINES. However, the club must request a non-sanctioned event authorization from me postmarked at least 15 days prior to the event and receive a non-sanctioned event number. Non-sanctioned requests will be held until 65 days before the event to insure that no sanctioned event gets requested that would be in conflict with the requested non-sanctioned event. Signed waivers must be sent to me within 15 days of the event. If waivers are not received, I will not grant anymore non-sanction requests to that club.
- 5. An updated Calendar of Sanctioned events is to be sent to each club monthly and also bi-monthly an updated Region Points standings is to be sent.

Deb stressed to all reps that they are responsible for sanction requests, flyers and results being submitted right and in a timely manner. If they are not, club points will be pulled.

Deb reviewed rulebook changes. She asked for the reps to take back the concours rules to their clubs for review. Loretta Ames submitted a copy of a letter from CCCC membership asking NCCC to suspend the rulebook for one year since new rulebooks have not been received. Concerned about not receiving the new rulebook in time for the season. A copy of this letter was sent to NCCC officers, RCD's and Governors.

Jim Harris stated he planned on proposing that any future rulebooks be available 60 days before the season starts.

Reviewed clarifications to be discussed at Competition Meeting.

#### Convention - Jim Harris

Pat Dolan stated that the Michigan State Police track was not available to rent out for the low speed event.

Jim Harris stated chairpersons are still needed for: Beverages, Corvette Mall, Concours and Rallye. If you know of anyone who might be interested, contact Jim.

Jeff Wixom and Dave Cripe's written proposals on handling t-shirt sales, etc. for convention were passed out and reviewed. Jeff stated his proposal was based on screen printing. Dave stated he prefers to do transfers. After discussing the proposals, Jim stated that each club would have one vote. Ballots were passed out for the clubs present to vote and Susan will send information to the three clubs not present asking them to vote and return ballot to Jim by March 13. The results will be announced at the March meeting.



#### WHAT IS A RALLY?

For those of you who have never participated in a Rallye you will want to read the NCCC Rule Book for the pertinent rules; however, this will give you a brief overview of what to expect on a Rallye.

First, in order to compete in a Rallye you need a driver and a navigator. The driver is responsible for driving the car and the navigator is responsible for keeping the driver on the right course. (The navigator reads the directors and looks for clues).

Everyone is given an instruction sheet. Be sure to write your time and mileage down when starting. DO NOT depend on your trip-o-meter. All cars are different and you can get hung up real easily.

The rules/directions will lead you through the course. Right turn, left turn, straight, etc. In order for the rallye to be a sanctioned event it must be a least 50 miles in length. Sometimes, you run the same roads over and over. There are usually clues to look for and questions to answer based on these clues. As I said this is usually the navigator's job.

#### Things to remember:

- (1)If you miss a clue, don't back up. When you discover you have made a mistake, STOP. Write down your mileage. Go back to the last place you know was correct, write down you mileage again, and start over from that point. When you return to the same place you noted your error write down your mileage for the 3rd time, now you can subtract the mileage accumulated in error.
- (2) Don't yell at your partner!!
- (3) Look for clues on both the left and right side of the street. Clues on the left are supposed to be so designated, but don't take anything for granted.
- (4) Don't yell at your partner!!
- (5) If you miss a clue, go back and look for it immediately. Clues are in succession. Therefore, if you find number one and number three, you have obviously missed number two, go back before going to the next clue.
- (6) Don't yell at your partner!
- (7) When you finish the course, write down your completed mileage. You will want to subtract any mileage for the times you turned around.
- (8) Have a good time and remember don't yell at your partner!!!!

There is more to running a rallye than I have presented, I am just trying to highlight the main ideas.

Maryanne is having a fun rallye on the 25th of April. Even though this rallye will not be as stringent, it will give the newcomers the opportunity to get their feet wet.
