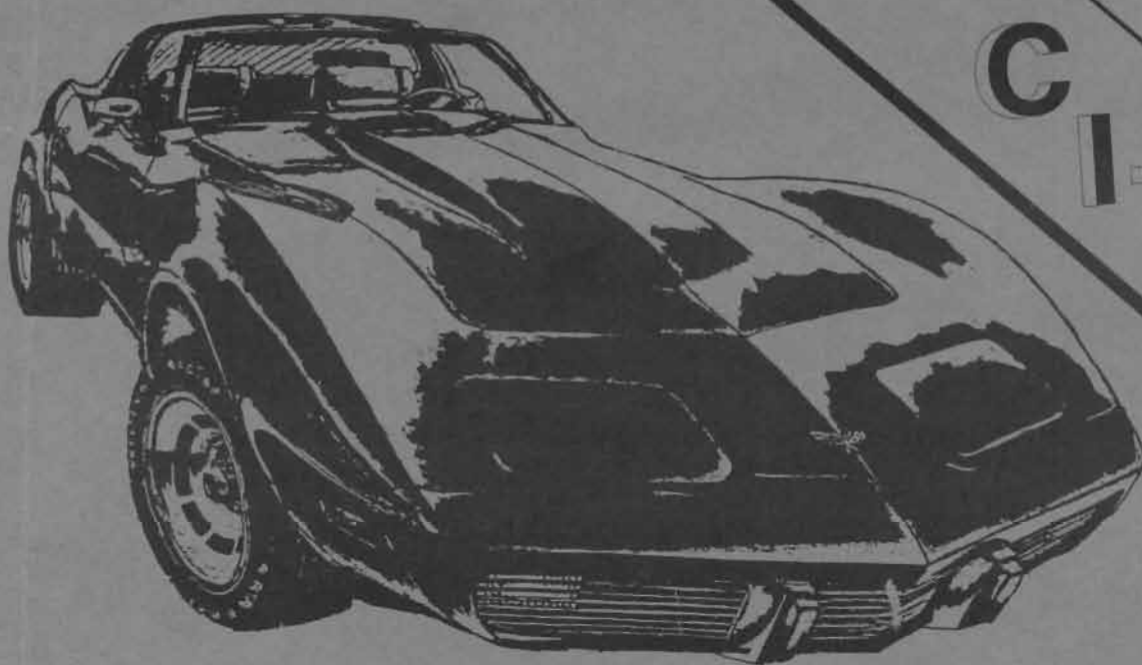

Treasurer

Treasurer reported the balance in the account and what activity had happened during the month.

Membership

There were no new members to report. Matt reported he has made a new membership application and has sent new 1992 membership stickers to Penny and Jim Myers.

Social

Maryann has results from the slot car races and will put them in the newsletter.

The Ice Cream Run will be April 25 as planned.

She reported some people involved in IMSA Race Cars asked if they could participate in our low speed events at the end of May. The Board agreed if they pass tech, they can race.

Richards will be having a Vette Cruise Night on June 14, 1992. This is the same night as the previously planned Go Cart Racing and a decision will have to be made as to what event the club would like to pursue.

Vette night at the Olds Museum is July 29, 1992.

Governor

Banc One is providing a better rate (15.38%) and no annual fee for the Corvette Credit Card. A small amount of revenue will go to NCCC. It was also noted that Banc One will be donating \$1,000 to the Convention this year.

Auto Accessories of America will give NCCC members a discount. NCCC is also working on magazine and airline discounts for members.

Competition

Loretta has received flyers for the upcoming events. The June 6th date has been lost and we have requested the date of September 20 for the 2nd concours.

Loretta presented a proposed budget form to be used when proposing or chairing a event. This form was approved by the Board and is to be submitted to the Board prior to any approval for events.

COMPETITION REPORT

As promised, the competition season has arrived! The Michigan Region will officially start it's season with Huron Valley's Rallye on April 26th as the first sanctioned event of the year.

As April slowly leads us into the swing of things, May certainly picks up the pace. The Record and Bracket Drags will be held May 16th at Central Michigan Dragway in Stanton. If you have never been to a drag race, you must come out! What an experience. I think we all have had a tendency to be a little heavy on the pedal at times. And you know how you feel when you are sitting at a traffic light, and one of those imitation metal sports cars pulls up next to you and gets a little excited. I don't know about you, but I can't seem to resist the temptation most of the time. Anyway, the drag strip is the place to vent those frustrations, not the local street corner.

Seriously, the drags are one heck of a great time. Everyone has a equal chance as you run in your class against cars of equal (or supposedly equal) power. All you need is a helmet (Snell 85 approved) and seat belts.

If you don't have this burning desire to run you car down the track, come out and enjoy the day and cheer on your fellow club members. There is a flyer enclosed in this edition that gives all the details.

Our Club will be sponsoring 4 low speed events on Saturday May 30 and Sunday May 31 at Spartan Speedway. Once again, if you are interested in participating on the track all you need is a Snell approved helmet and seat belts. Your car will be placed in a class based on your horsepower, year, and tires. (It is a little more complicated than this, but you can read the NCCC Rule Book for exact details).

At Spartan we will be running the Figure 8 and if you have never been to a low speed event feel free to come out and try or come out and observe. We run one car at a time against the clock so there is no reason for anyone to feel intimidated, that is until Spinrad gets his monster off the trailer and blows your ear drums out. But hey, there has to be one in every crowd, right?

These are Capital City's events, therefore workers will be needed. If you don't want to race, perhaps you would be willing to work. We will need people to help with the timing, starters, flag people, and corner workers. If you are interested, please contact me.

In addition to the race events, we will be sponsoring a party at the track Saturday night. The beverages, hamburgers, and hot dogs will be furnished by the club. Get you hat and sunglasses, come out to the track, work up an appetite and enjoy yourself. Besides, this is one of the two club events this month that you will get extra points for participation.

In addition, to our Club's Events, Jackson Corvette Club will be sponsoring a total of 6 events at Mottville on Saturday and Sunday May 23 and 24 and Kalamazoo will be sponsoring a Low Speed and Matching Time Event on Monday the 25th in Kalamazoo.
