- 4) ATTEND A CAPITAL CITY CORVETTE CLUB SOCIAL EVENT!! ☺*

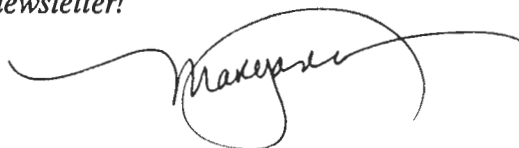
Coming up THIS WEEKEND is the Kalamazoo Swap Meet on February 28th. I'll report on our H-U-G-E caravan next month.

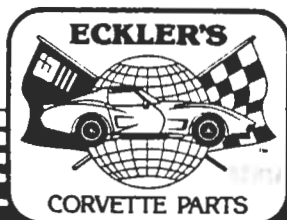

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS FOR R-10710 SPRAY GELCOAT

The proper application of Spray Gelcoat is an absolute must when working with fiberglass. Spray Gelcoat forms a hard surface over bare fiberglass, body fillers or previous gelcoating. Properly applied, Spray Gelcoat provides the **best** foundation for painting.

Spray Gelcoat is the best medium for repairing most surface "checking" or "crazing" on older Corvette bodies, and it will **seal-down** loose fibers that have popped through the original gelcoat. Loose fibers have spoiled many otherwise excellent paint jobs.

Most hairline cracks can be repaired with Spray Gelcoat, provided these cracks are not in stress areas such as wheel well openings, hood openings, or areas subject to flexing or vibration. In addition, Spray Gelcoat will help to inhibit the raising or sinking of seams and small spot repairs.

Spray Gelcoat may be applied over **bare fiberglass**, body fillers or other gelcoat. It must **NOT** be applied over **paint, primer or metal surfaces**. . . it will not adhere to these surfaces.

Any area to be gelcoated must first be sanded thoroughly with 80 grit sandpaper. It should be noted that Spray Gelcoat has a wax catalyst that rises to the surface as it cures, therefore, if a second application of Spray Gelcoat is to be made over an area that has been previously gelcoated and allowed to cure, this area must be **thoroughly sanded** again to remove the wax.

Step 1. Sand area to be gelcoated thoroughly with 80 grit sandpaper. Be sure to sand all surface checking, hairline cracks, and sand away old deteriorated gelcoating.

Step 2. Mask off large enough area to be sprayed to feather-out edges where possible. Sharp, built-up edges are difficult to sand out.

Step 3. Clean area with 3812 DuPont enamel reducer or equivalent. (See Photo #1)



Step 4. Mix gelcoat according to instructions on container and spray a mist coat to provide a tacky base, similar to spraying enamel. (See Photo #2) Follow with four to six heavy wet coats. Let cure 4-6 hours or overnight.

NOTE: Clean spray equipment immediately after use — Gelcoat will harden in the gun if allowed to sit.



Step 5. Block sand gelcoated area with 80 grit sandpaper. Make sure edges are feathered out smoothly. Follow with 220 grit sandpaper (wet). Work out rough or "orange peel" appearance until gelcoat is smooth. (If "orange peel" is not sanded smooth it will eventually show through paint.) If you sand through your gelcoat, spot these areas in with more gelcoat, let cure, and sand again.

NOTE: A helpful trick here is to mist coat the gelcoated area with a contrasting color of lacquer paint. (A spray can will do nicely. See Photo #3) When paint dries, begin sanding. When all traces of paint are gone, "orange peel" should be gone.



Step 6. Apply primer in normal fashion to area.

Step 7. Block sand (wet) entire area. Area is now ready for finishing.

Eckler's Corvette Parts

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ADDITIONAL INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Storage

To prolong the life and quality of Spray Gelcoat it should be tightly sealed and stored in a cool place or refrigerated. (40° to 65° is ideal — Do not allow Spray Gelcoat to freeze.) Several hours before spraying (preferably the day before) remove the Spray Gelcoat from storage and allow it to warm up to room temperature. **Never** use a stove or any artificial heat source to warm Spray Gelcoat.

2. Spray Temperature

Spray Gelcoat should not be applied in an atmosphere of less than 60° or over 100°. If temperature is in the 60° range, a heat gun or heat lamps may also be necessary to aid curing of Spray Gelcoat after it is applied. Care must be taken to avoid "hot spots" as erratic curing will cause uneven shrinkage of Spray Gelcoat (resulting in cracks or blisters). Do not apply Spray Gelcoat in direct sunlight; direct sunlight may also cause "hot spots".

3. Mixing Recommendations

During storage the solid particles in Spray Gelcoat will settle to the bottom. Therefore, the entire container of Spray Gelcoat must be stirred or agitated thoroughly before use.

After the Spray Gelcoat has been thoroughly stirred, pour the amount needed into a separate wide-mouthed container for mixing. (Coffee cans or plastic bowls are excellent mixing containers. Paper cups or bowls may be used providing they are not the wax-coated type.) Do not mix Spray Gelcoat and hardener in the spray gun cup.

The amount of liquid hardener needed is dictated by atmospheric temperature. If shop temperature is 60° to 70°, use 15cc (1½ measure on tube) of liquid hardener for each quart of Spray Gelcoat.

If shop temperature is 71° to 80°, use 10cc (one measure on tube) of liquid hardener for each quart of Spray Gelcoat.

81° to 90°, use 7.5cc; 91° to 100°, use 5cc.

These ratios will give approximately 30 to 45 minutes of pot life and about 2 hour set up time on parts being sprayed.

Mix hardener and Spray Gelcoat thoroughly. If hardener is not mixed in thoroughly, Spray Gelcoat will not harden properly. Stir mixture vigorously with a paint paddle for 2 full minutes before loading spray gun.

NOTE: Curing time may be adjusted by adding more hardener. However, if more than 3 times the recommended amount of hardener is used, Spray Gelcoat will become rubbery and will not cure completely.

4. Equipment and Pressure Recommendations

Spray Gelcoat may be applied with an ordinary siphon-feed spray gun or with a pressure pot system. If a siphon-feed gun is used, it must be one with ample fluid flow to allow Spray Gelcoat to be applied in even wet coats (such as a Binks Model 69 or equivalent or larger). If there is some doubt that available spray equipment will work satisfactorily with Spray Gelcoat, experiment on a piece of scrap material.

Start with 45 to 55 PSI and adjust pattern, flow, and pressure accordingly. With pressure pot systems, use 40 PSI. Pressure recommendations may vary slightly depending on job application and equipment used.

5. Spraying Tips

Spray Gelcoat must be applied as evenly as possible. Thick and thin spots will cause erratic curing of the surface. (Spots that are too thin may not cure at all!) Also, thin spots will be subject to "sand through" necessitating a second application of Spray Gelcoat (four to six wet coats is ideal).

6. Clean Up

As soon as spraying is complete, discard leftover Spray Gelcoat mixture. Do not pour it back into original container as it will contaminate un-mixed Spray Gelcoat. (Dispose of any activated mixture outdoors—mixture is volatile and may cause spontaneous fire!)

Spray equipment must be cleaned immediately with acetone or lacquer thinner.

7. Preparing for Paint

After Spray Gelcoat has cured thoroughly, there may be a tacky residue on the surface. To ease the sanding process somewhat, this residue may be removed by wiping the surface with acetone or lacquer thinner and then washing it with detergent and water.

Although Spray Gelcoat may be sanded a few hours after application, it should not be primed or painted for at least a full 48 hours. This will allow ample time for the styrene vapors to escape from the Gelcoat. (If trapped beneath the paint, styrene vapors may cause blistering or peeling of the finish.)



Step 5: Apply primer in narrow band to area.
Step 6: Block sand (well) entire area and is now ready for finishing.
