The Competition Director for each club is responsible for all the events. Chairpeople are not to submit anything to the Region directly. Everything must be reviewed and submitted by the Competition Director.

All drivers (participants) MUST sign the waiver! If a participant does not sign the waiver, they will lose their points.

There are new guide lines for Concours Judging and they will be made available as soon as possible.
