Around the Tower and Up Your Strip

By now, the snow has started backing away from the starting lines at the midwest drag strips and the Corvettes that were hidden away in the barns for the winter are being readied for 1993. Nearly forgotten is the 1992 NCCC 1/4 mile record book still smoldering from an unprecedented onslaught by a little club in Omaha, Nebraska.

Let this rattle around in your Snell 90. Fifteen different members of the Cornhusker Corvette Club (CCC) held a total of fifteen different NCCC class records at some time in 1992. A quick look back thru 20 years of *Blue Bars* indicates that the previous total that any one club had during any one year was not more than half a dozen. What's even more astounding is that with more cooperation from Mother Nature and stronger axles, the number could have easily exceeded twenty.

How can this happen? Most clubs have a dwindling number of members actively doing any kind of racing. The key word here is "most." CCC has always been competitive (especially in speed events) and remains so today. They are a close knit group that simply are not satisfied with just doing concours. rallys, and parades. They do do those (no pun intended). Several of these cars will be in the '93 Convention concours. However, they still believe Vettes are made to run and make them run they do.

Now at this point, some slalom racer has rounded the first pylon and says "Hey, the reason so many CCC'ers can set records is because the number of serious competitors is less, therefore the task is easier." NOT! How many LIID's have you seen run 11.90's. How many LIIB's ever recorded 11 teens. How many LIIA's break in new tires at 10.72. How many of you even know that many fast women? Actually, the three ladies that did the above are good looking grandmothers. True, the rainouts in '91 contributed to some lighter than normal indexes but in most cases, it simply wouldn't have made any difference whether it was 1992 or 1972.

So back to the question: "How can this happen?" Maybe it's because they are so far out on the prairie that the pony express hasn't delivered the word that Corvettes are now only to be restored and placed under a \$100 car cover. Maybe it's because if

there were ten perfectly restored '67 tripower's lined up at a show, after being shown that the first one has gold line tires and factory correct intake manifold bolts, a Cornhusker would coldly walk on past the other nine. Animals.

Want to watch an NCRS'er faint? Put him on a stage coach to Omaha to witness a '66 big block, power window roadster being turned into an RPA. Or a '62 340 horse car having 300 lbs. of unneeded trinkets stripped off of a soon to be CLA. Better yet, watch an NCRS certified, three time Concours Prepared A National Convention winner, and LCL record holder, cruise through the burnout box.

Or, are those Cornhuskers actually ahead of time? Could it be that when everyone has a perfectly restored '67

tripower under the car cover, their slightly modified. mean sounding, fat tired. somewhat unique machines will actually get all the attention at a show? Wouldn't that spot your chrome?

Want to confuse a Cornhusker? Show him the '69 that you competed with for a number of years and have now restored back to "show room condition." When he asks you "why," tell him "because it is now worth more money." When he asks you "why you don't use it any more," tell him "you can't chance breaking the "original" parts and reducing its market value." When he says "oh, so you're going to sell it," tell him "never!" That's how you confuse a Cornhusker.

How do you out drag race a Cornhusker? Now that's not so easy. Will being younger or older do it? Nope. The '92 record holders range from early 20's to early 50's. Will having a sex change do any good? No. Eight guys and seven gals. How about running Group III? Maybe. Would have worked in '92 but look for CCC to start in on that Group in '93. Will tearing their cars down to see if they are legal stop them? May a deranged buffalo take offense to your hubcap. This bunch has been thru 50 plus technical teardowns in five different

So come on down Michigan and come on up Southwest Region (since there aren't drags even scheduled in the East anymore, the Cornhuskers assume there aren't any cars back there that are quicker than a 5 page rally). Cold animals!

All-kidding aside, drag racing is as popular as ever in the USA and it is a disappointment to the Cornhuskers that the number of NCCC drag events and entrants is declining. Cost of the tracks is a contributing factor but CCC has found ways to keep it reasonable. It usually involves sharing the track with other car clubs or with NHRA/IHRA racers test and tuning tin cars. It also helps big time that NCCC does cover the insurance.

So, if you used to do a little dragging, consider going again. If you never have, then give it a try at least once. If you never have doesn't sponsor drags, try to get them interested. With all the hard running CCC did in 1992, which involves a lot of members not included in this article, none of the Group I cars had any mechanical failures. For that matter, none of the Group II cars popped an engine, which is the greatest fear.

One thing CCC does to maintain interest is to keep club drag records for each class. Under their rules, a record can never be retired, only broken. Of the 34 Group I & II classes, 20 of the Cornhusker Corvette Club records are quicker than or equal to the current NCCC records or indexes. Not bad considering that none of their membership have ever run half of the remaining 14.

In closing, the CCC record holders offer a friendly challenge to the rest of NCCC to try and "clean their plow" at the '93 Convention. They also extend sincere thanks to their club membership for putting on drag events and supporting them in general.

Have a good tree in '93.
