AWARDS

Steve Spinrad fourth place men's overall and fourth place speed.

Ray and Sharon Meesseman won first place nationally, with Laura Losert winning second for women, Sandy Carpenter third.

COMPETITION REPORT

The Michigan Region meeting was also held on Saturday, March 26, 1994.

National Council is looking for a vendor for a Lapel Pin approximately 1" in diameter. If you are interested or know someone that may be interested, please let me know.



National is also soliciting car related items for next year's mailing. Business card advertisements, etc.

Regions are beginning to donate \$500 to the national scholarship fund. These scholarships will be presented at the National Awards Banquet. The recipient will be from the region the money came from. If Michigan donates \$500, a scholarship will be awarded to a Michigan resident. This item will be discussed at the next region meeting, and I would appreciate hearing your comments about Michigan being an active participant in this program.

Bids are once again being submitted for the Governor's meetings which are held five times a year. They are currently held in Indianapolis, and the current bids are for Indianapolis and Louisville. Michigan's vote for this will also be held at the Region's May meeting.

Chevrolet will be hosting Dream and Drive across the country again this year for the Corvette. There will be two programs going on simultaneously this year, east coast and west coast. When they will be in Michigan is not known at this time, but they will be here and the Region will need to supply drivers for this event. Drivers will be needed for

Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. You can volunteer for one, two, or three days. Roger stressed the fact if you volunteer, you must be there at your scheduled time. If you would be interested please let me know, and when we receive more details you will be notified right away.

Patrick Dolan reported Council is looking at the possibility of a new position "Executive Liaison". This would be an appointed position approved by the Executive Board to deal with large sponsors and possibly the Corvette Museum. This will take a bylaw change.

The Corvette Museum is under construction and hopefully will be completed by Labor Day. Chevrolet plans to become much more involved in the museum. People ordering new Corvettes will be able to take delivery of them at the Museum if they so chose. All Corvette Plant tours will now start from the Museum. If you are planning to attend the opening celebration over Labor Day, all rooms in Bowling Green are full. They are now **booking rooms** up and down I-65. For information see the flyer in this month's newsletter.

Membership Report

Barb Harris reported National Membership is now 10,100 members. Michigan has 14 clubs with 474 members. If you have lost your 1994 sticker for your National Council Membership card, please let me know. You will need your card for Convention.

The west coast region is really growing. They have signed 9 new clubs with over 400 members.

If you would like to run for National Office the positions open are President, Membership, Public Relations, and Parliamentarian.

Competition Report

Debbie Corbin is still working on the help-net publication. If you would like to be listed as someone to contact in case of

emergency to Corvette travelers coming to Michigan please let me know. This publication is to help people when they are travelling and break down. It is helpful if you have a trailer and are mechanical. Having your name and phone number published isn't going to be of benefit if you can't really help them.

As of this date there are no changes to the Region Calendar.

The Mackinaw weekend was discussed, and the region will be pursuing a sanctioned low speed event again this year. Debbie will be looking for a chairperson for the race event. The sanction will probably come from the Ypsilanti or Battle Creek clubs. Workers will be needed to work the event. Capital City has offered to help as we will be sponsoring a club road tour for the Mackinaw Weekend.

There are corrections to technically speaking as they pertain to the National Council Rules. Debbie will mail this information, along with the proposed changes to the '97 rule book to me. Upon receipt I will make sure all interested parties are informed, and input will be requested.

Weekends promoting several events has been discussed at the National Level. It is recognized clubs and/or regions should be promoting quality, not quantity. Council is encouraging a gentleman's agreement to enforce the quality of all events that are nationally sanctioned.



Convention Update

Registrations for Convention are coming in as anticipated. So far we have received 266 adult and 39 children registrations. Of the

competition events the low speed has the highest count of 107 with the high speed with 76, drags 69, rally 37, funkhana 31, and concours 17.

Workers are still needed for the High Speed Event, Concours, and Las Vegas Night. Capital City is committed to the low speed event, but if you would like to work in any of these other areas, please let me know.

Worker passes will be available, at no charge, to anyone not wanting to register for convention but would like to help out. The worker pass is for the day only and for the event you are working on. The worker pass will also allow you access to the hospitality room for free beer and pop. If you would like to attend the evening party, you will have to purchase a day pass for \$20.00

The Road Tour is on schedule, and we are expecting a very good turn out. Of the 266 reservations received, at least half will arrive on Saturday. Remember - this event will also be open to the public and will be highly publicized as such.
