Nominations

Nominations for Club Officers will be held at the October and November General Membership Meetings, with the election of officers at the December Meeting.

The Board of Directors meet once a month, and they are responsible for the overall direction of the club and the activities and events pursued and participated in. If you have an interest in becoming more involved in the club and having a voice in how it operates, you may want to consider holding an office. I can assure you, your enthusiasm and commitment will be welcomed.

The following is a brief synopsis of the positions and responsibilities. The By-laws of the club give a more formal description. If you do not have a copy of the published By-laws, please let me know and I will make sure you receive one.

President - the president is ultimately responsible for all the activities of the club. The president should be willing to attend all of the clubs activities and events and be willing to step in and assume responsibility for every activity if necessary. The only mandatory requirement for the president is the person must have held a former office in the club.

Vice President Competition - The competition director is the club's representative to the Michigan Region and is responsible for all the competition events and the club calendar. In addition, the competition director is ultimately responsible for the points program administered by the points director including the year end awards.

The competition director is required to attend the Region meetings and report back to the club.

The competition director schedules the clubs competition events in accordance with the Michigan Region Calendar and is responsible for each event's chairperson, flyers, and points. It is also necessary the competition director be familiar with the NCCC rules and requirements for competition events.

The competition director is also the vice president and must be ready and willing to assume the duties of president in the absence of the president.

Governor

The governor is the club's representative to the National Council and is required to attend the governor's meetings that are held 5 times a year. The governor is responsible to report back to the club on the happenings at the national level.

The secretary has the responsibility of taking minutes at the general membership meetings and the board meetings and having the minutes published in the club newsletter each month.

The treasurer is responsible for the club's funds. The treasurer pays the club's bills and balances the check book each month. The treasurer is responsible for a report at each meeting.

Membership Director

This person is responsible for all membership responsibilities including the collection of dues, soliciting new members, and promoting the club.

Social Director

The social director is responsible for the club's social activities. The social director, along with the Board of Directors, sets the social calendar and plans social events to meet the needs of the membership.

Public Relations

The public relations director is responsible for the club's promotional events and activities including those events that interact with the public. This person also solicits advertisers for the club's newsletters and promotes the club and its activities.

Points Director

The points director is responsible for the administration of the club points system. The points director collects the points from the membership and keeps track of each member's total points for the year. The points director also assists the competition director with the year end awards.

The points director publishes the points in the club's newsletter on a monthly basis.

Editor

The editor is responsible for the publication and mailing of the newsletter each month. This includes obtaining the articles from the officers and other members, collating, and mailing.

In addition to the specific duties of each office, each officer should be willing to attend the general membership meetings and the board of directors meetings each month.

It is important to remember this club is only as strong as the leadership supported by the membership. Your support and participation will be welcomed.

Region Meeting

The Michigan Region Meeting was held on Tuesday, September 13th.

The region currently has \$11,499.75 in its treasury thanks to the Convention and the Dream and Drive activities.

In addition to the Corvette and Cadillac

Dream and Drive events, the region has been asked to participate with Oldsmobile.

Barb Harris reported that Corvette Coventry is now Michigan's largest club with 86 National Council Members.

Tiretown is the currently the number one club in the nation with MAG being number two. Sharon Meesseman is currently in 3rd place in the national points standing.

Sharon Meesseman distributed the region's points standings. A copy can be found in this issue.

Sue Butters gave the competition report on behalf of Deb Corbin.

Gary Kelly will no longer accept names of participants or workers without NCCC membership numbers.

The new NCCC rule book that is under consideration would limit the number of events that can be held on the same day. The suggestion was made for 6, but was later changed to 7. There are a number of clubs and regions that try to hold so many events on the same day the quality of the event is jeopardized. An example of this is the combining of matching times and low speed events. Currently there are no restrictions. The proposal would limit one matching time with one speed event to be combined.

Capital City holds only one event at a time.

The 16 year old driver was also discussed. National Council rules now allow 16 year olds, accompanied by and with the permission of their parents, to participate in speed events. However, there are some tracks including GM parking lots that do not allow anyone to participate under the age of 18. Even though NCCC allows the 16 year old driver, if the facility limits participation to 18 year olds, the event must adhere to facility rules.

There were complaints about the parking, high speed, and various minor things with the banquet, youth program, registration, door prizes, and Corvette mall. Jim said the criticism was meant to be a helpful tool for the next convention, but as one listening to the letter, it is a little disheartening to hear especially after all the hard work.
