WINTER BREAK

This winter if you are looking for something different to do on your way to the Grand Ole Opry or Florida, stop at the National Corvette Museum.

It is the largest and most comprehensive non-profit museum ever dedicated to a single automotive nameplate. Corvette is America's premier sports car and is an international symbol of U.S. automotive innovation.

It is located in Bowling Green, Kentucky, a quarter mile south of the General Motors Corvette Assembly Plant, the only facility that builds the Corvette. The combination of the new museum and the plant is expected to establish Bowling Green as "Corvette City U.S.A." and become one of Kentucky's leading tourist attractions.

It opened Labor Day weekend 1994 with four days of roundthe-clock celebration by Corvette enthusiasts, including owners from Canada and overseas, plus a caravan of 4,000 Corvettes from all parts of the United States.

The museum has over 50 Corvettes — production and one-of-a-kind concept cars — spanning Corvette's 41-year history. Also, thousands of Corvette-related photos, movies and videos, advertisements, scale models, and memorabilia can be found in the museum. Spotlighted are the people who have made the Corvette great. A gift shop offers a wide variety of Corvette items.

The \$15 million museum has 68,000 square feet of exhibit and Corvette archive space. It is located on a 33-acre attractively landscaped site. Its free-form design matches the uniqueness of the car it honors. It is quickly identified by its illuminated, red Mobil 1 signature spire, which soars 11 stories into the sky.

The museum is just west of Exit 28 on I-65. It is an 85-minute drive south from Louisville and a 65-minute drive north from Nashville. There is ample free parking adjacent to the building.

The museum is open daily and Sunday from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Admission is \$8 for adults, \$6 for seniors, and \$4 for children. For information, call (502) 781-7973.






