The designated event for March is the bowling challenge to be held March 26.

#### Bloomington

We have discussed the possibility of our club travelling to the Bloomington Show as a group. The Bloomington Gold people have changed their attitude about the show as well as the show itself. This year the festivities actually start on Thursday, which is a day earlier for the swap meet.

This year the Workshops will be held on Thursday, with the Swap Meet being held Thursday thru Saturday, and the Road Tour on Sunday morning.

The cost this year is \$33.00 per person with a \$10.00 fee for the Road Tour. The "Glass Pack" which is the tent and special parking for clubs will be \$210.00 with the deadline for registration May 1, 1995.

## **Competition Update**

Loretta Spinrad, Region Competition Director

The Michigan Region Meeting was held in conjunction with the Awards Banquet on March 18 and most of you were there, but for those that weren't I would like to take a few minutes to recap the Competition portion of the meeting.

We discussed some of the proposed changes to the 1996 NCCC Rule Book. I think it is important that everyone that is interested in competing be familiar with not only the current rules, but the proposed rules.

Fire Suits for Group III. This topic received a lot of discussion and the consensus was Group III should not be singled out. If fire suits are required (which there is argument for both sides of the issue) then they should be required by everyone, but at the high speed events only.

It was also suggested that RCDs should consider bringing in experts for discussion at the RCD meeting. It would appear that we are trying to make decisions without adequate information to base our decisions on. This point was very well received and I will be writing Gary Kelly a letter from the Michigan Region suggesting this.

It was also suggested that participants in race events should be wearing long pants and full shirts (no shorts or halter tops).

Helmets - Consideration is being given to a requirement for updating helmets on a regular basis. Information was shared that helmets do not wear out unless dropped or the padding becomes wet. It was also noted that Bell will recertify helmets. It was suggested that helmets should be checked at tech for proper fit; this seems to be more of a problem than the helmet itself.

Proposed Street Class - Overall there is support for the idea, but the majority of people would like to see some restrictions. Restrict to Low Speed only, restrict to two classes pre-1984 and 1984 and up, reduced points.

In conjunction with the idea of a new group, consolidating existing classes was also discussed. Perhaps A & B and C & D could be consolidated. This would eliminate so many one car classes.

Hoosier Radials - Mention was made that Hoosier is coming out with radial tires, and this will have to be addressed at the competition meeting. Hoosiers are currently Group II, but radials should technically be classified as Group I.

Your comments were greatly appreciated and will be shared at the May RCD meeting.

#### Calendar Update

You will note there is a change in the Competition Calendar. Corvette Coventry and MAG will be combining their events this season. Therefore, there will be 14 events the weekend of July 22 and 23. Coventry will not be running the Weekend of August 19 and 20 as originally planned.

Gordon Wilcox reported that a new High Speed Track is under construction near South Haven. This may be a possible site for future Sectional High Speed Events, or even Low Speed events with some modification to slow the speeds.

Gordon also stated that Grand Valley is planning a trip to the Corvette Museum April 28th. If you have not seen the museum and have an interest in going with another club, please contact Gordon.

National Council is also planning a trip to the Museum and the Bowling Green assembly plant in September in conjunction with the Governor's meeting.

In the last newsletter I reported on the progress of the competition events to be held during convention. Jim Harris reported at the meeting there has been no further update regarding the Drag Event. At this time they are still considering an 1/8 mile track.

The Michigan Competition season officially begins with the Drag Race Events on May 20 at Stanton and I would encourage your club's participation.

At the Region Meeting Roger made mention of the attendance for the Region Banquet. We have all experienced the ups and downs of good and bad weather, good and better attendance at our events and I feel a lot of what we experience is due to a lack of understanding.

I would like to see us work on improving the overall understanding of the Region and our many events as a group. Therefore, I am encouraging each of you to promote at least one competition or social event in the region that is not sponsored by your club.

#### Important Notice for Rallyes

There is a new waiver form for Rallyes. Be sure if you are hosting rallyes this season you have the correct forms.

Capital City offers our club members additional club points for participating in a "Designated Club Event of the Month". If every club did this for an event outside your club this could prove to be very exciting for the region.

In addition to supporting another club and the region, you are encouraging your members to expand their normal area of communication and participation. It will give them the opportunity to meet people from other clubs, participate in new activities, and hopefully encourage future participation.

At next year's banquet I will be honoring the club(s) that had the greatest participation for an event sponsored by another club in the Region.

As I stated earlier, our first competition event in Michigan is the Drags on May 20th, but don't forget about Huron Valley's Swap Meet on Mother's Day. After all there may be something there for your mother, especially if she is a Corvette enthusiast.

Now back to the Drags on May 20th. Be sure to mention to your friends and anyone else you know, the Royals are encouraging Test Cars also. If you know of people that like to drag race, bring them along. You know that Gary and the Royal Group run a very good event, and the more the merrier.

Don't forget about the Potluck afterwards. You do not have to be a racer to participate in the potluck. This may be a perfect opportunity to get those new club members out to a new event.

The month draws to a close with autocross events in Kalamazoo on Memorial Day. For those people not familiar with the Kalamazoo event, it is a rather large parking lot offering a number of turns and quite a straight away on the back of the course.

In addition to the race, if you come early enough, you can stop in Marshall to get a glimpse of the Corvette parade to be held at the same time.

If you are interested in attending the National Convention in July Phil Zeller from the Capital City Corvette Club has been working on possible travel arrangements



## Membership Spotlight

Indepth interview with Steve Pavlik by Linda Roberts, Membersip Director

Seems like these last few weeks have been a sign from Mother Nature that we can soon get our Corvettes prepped and ready to start cruising down the road.

What better person to focus on this month than our very own MeGuiar Wax expert - Steve Pavlik.

When you think of Steve, a picture of a tall, thin, blue-eyed man that always seems to have a smile and a vehicle for sale, comes to mind. I was once told that Steve is the only driver known to break his car at the track and say "Oh!Well! maybe next time;" he is so easy going!

Steve grew up in the Lansing area with his two sisters Pat and Karen; both are tall like him. He told me when he graduated from Everett High School he was 5'8". Now look at him! Lucky Steve, most of us have grown out instead of up!

After graduation, Steve attended the Creative Center of Arts for Transportation Design in Detroit. He has a degree in Industrial Design, and has obtained two Journeyman cards. One in Diemaking and one in Die Design. He has been employed with General Motors since 1976 where he is a Senior Designer/Checker in Pontiac.

Some of you might have seen Steve in his younger days working at Steffin's Bakery which was owned and operated by his father. Steve's mom is an author and has published several articles. Just recently she had a book published about Lansing's Polish history.

In 1987 he was a National Concours Champion winning first place with his 1967 Dangurney Special XR7 Mercury Cougar. At the present time he is dealing on a 1970 Superbird that has been in storage since 1973.

After several moves Steve settled in Williamston in 1988. He tells me his place has been struck by lightening on three different occasions. Maybe he should buy lotto tickets. His winter months are spent working on his home and getting his cars ready for summer. 
