Our Competition Season in Michigan will be off to a great start with the Drags on May 20th in Stanton. As my personal favorite (in reality how could you not enjoy the drags when you drive a 10 second car) the drags is a perfect place for new competitors to start as there are no turns and most of us have plenty of practice on the street every day! Remember there is a potluck at the track after the event. This is a great opportunity to socialize with members from other clubs and share all of our stories (fish tales)!

On Sunday, May 21 CCM and Huron Valley will be hosting autocross events in the Livonia area. I say in the area because the lot is still somewhat questionable due to GM working overtime. There are 6 low speed events scheduled for the day starting at 10:00 a.m. If you plan to attend you may want to call Gordon McCann at 313-455-3060 the day before to verify the location of the event.

Now that I have covered the good stuff we need to get down to business, that means rules and paperwork.

There have been some problems with the sanctions and the flyers

so I would like to remind you of the following:

The Sanctions are due to me 70 days prior to an event. The sanctions must be complete and include the name of the chairpeople. These people must be National Members of the club hosting the event.

The Flyers are due to me 50 days prior to the event and the flyers must match the sanctions. If your sanction says you are having a matching time for example, your flyer needs to say matching time or the sanction will be cancelled. If you are having multiple events, please indicate all the events being held.

Flyers for rallyes must state the type of rally it is, if it doesn't the sanction(s) will be cancelled.

Every nationally sanctioned event must be chaired by a National Council member of the host club. If there is no chairman from the hosting club on site at the event, the event does not exist and will be cancelled.

Being new to this position I have a lot to learn. I appreciate the encouragement I received from most of you and the time Gary Kelly has given me in making sure that Michigan is conforming with the rules, your support and cooperation is needed and will be appreciated.

In addition, if you have requested a non-sanction event and I have indicated waivers are required please be sure to have the waivers returned in the time period requested or future non-sanctions will be cancelled. If for some reason you cancel the event, please let me know so that I will not be looking for waivers.

#### Rule Book Changes

Based on the our discussion at the last region meeting I did send Gary Kelly a letter voicing our comments, suggestions, and

concerns. In response to comments made by several RCD's Gary has requested our preference regarding the class structure. As time is running out and our meeting is not scheduled until May 9, I am enclosing a copy of Gary's letter for your review. Gary would like Michigan's response by April 30, so please review and call me with your comments A.S.A.P. so that I can respond to Gary.

I am also enclosing updated sheets for the Proposed Rule Book. I would appreciate your comments being returned to me prior to the May 9 Region Meeting so I can combine them and present them to the group as a whole. I would like my comments at the RCD meeting to reflect Michigan's views as a whole.

#### Rulebook Clarification Request

Is an electric water pump or an electric driven waterpump driven by an electric motor and small belt legal? A question has risen about a clarification in 1990 about being able to remove the belt and then drive the waterpump electrically.

Group III Classes A & B.

The 1963 Corvette Sting Ray brought an all new look to the Corvette. The first coupe and a split window to boot, the elimination of the trunk, independent rear suspension, and aluminum knockoff wheels to mention a few of the changes.

And of course the car was more aerodynamically designed - Duntov still having a production race car in mind.

The story goes (Duntov told this at one of his convention speeches to NCCC members) the side exhaust pipes were another feature that was going to be put on the Z06 race option, but Zora's wife burned her leg on the side pipe on the prototype, so the option was redesigned with fiberglass insulation inside the covers and not released until 1964.

There were several cosmetic features unique to the '63. The Split Window being the most notable along with the hood grilles that were also unique to the 1963.

The introduction of the aluminum knockoff wheels widened the vette suspension by 2", which in turn lowered the center of gravity for better cornering, and allowed for quick changing of tires (i.e. during a race). Of course being aluminum, they made the car lighter and more importantly, lighten the unsprung weight, meaning better handling - another race car must.


The Fuel Injection was also redesigned for better durability and probably more horsepower, but this was never advertised.

Have you ever wondered why the first Corvettes had trunks and all of a sudden they disappeared with the '63 model?

Time and Money!!!!

The rear-end was being redesigned and GM would not budget the engineering hours needed for the design of both the rear axle and the new trunk placement, so Duntov opted for the rear-end.

The trunk was eliminated to make room for the gas tank which had to be moved to make room for the new suspension design. So the trunk disappeared with the birth of the independent rear suspension.



As with any new product design there are always changes and more changes, until the right combination is found. The 1963 Sting Ray was no exception to the rule. Everything from the glove box to rear hold-down locks were continually being changed throughout the production

year, striving for perfection in the new design.

For example did you know the 1963 had one of four types of inside rearview mirrors? We are not talking about four different options, the mirror design was actually changed 4 times and the buyer had no choice as to which mirror came with the car.

The 1963 has a lot of odysseys for its particular year, so if you are considering the restoration of a 1963 you had better do your homework, as I do not believe any other model in history had so many components change throughout the production year.

It is definitely a beautiful car, but what a nightmare to find the correct parts for each particular car.

There were 21,513 1963 Corvettes produced with the coupes taking a slight edge over the convertibles.

Why is it then we seem to see more convertibles than coupes. I know you are not going to believe this, but the 1964 seemed more attractive without the center window split, (and more functional) so you guessed it. People started removing the center section on the 1963 to look like the new '64.

Imagine that - you never know what some people will do to their Corvettes, the next thing you know they will be cutting the fender wells for race tires!

There is a lot to learn about the '63, I have only scratched the surface, but I hope it provides you with some incite to the complexity of the car and its history.
