Besides the competition events, the hikes in the mountains, and parties, I hear that Roger and Val Thomas had their own party. Something about being hot, outside with very little (or no) clothing and I never did hear the remainder of the story. I believe this should be investigated further at our next region meeting.

Bill Siebel was kind enough to represent Michigan at the RCD Meeting in my absence. Bill provided me with his notes, and I have received the minutes of the meeting from Gary Kelly.

Proposed Rulebook Changes

- 1. Novice Class points
- 2. Novice Class travel points
- 3. Class structure
- 4. Master Group Classes

I am enclosing a copy of minutes and proposed changes. As you can see the combining class issue has resurfaced. We did not discuss this at the last meeting as I thought it was a dead issue and apparently it is not. I need to hear from every club by August 5 so that I can respond to Gary by August 8.

As far as combining classes I would like to point out the following:

If you combine classes A & B and C & D that does not mean the cars can be updated or backdated across lines. It only means you will be competing in one class for points. If you have a 1978 "D" car you will not be able to utilize any parts or changes that would pertain to a "C" car in the same group or update a "C" car with "D" changes.

Another issue is high speed vs low speed, vs drags. If you feel that combining classes is a good idea it would not make since to combine classes in one event and not another. It would be just too hard to monitor. Personally I feel this is a step backward and not forward for NCCC, but I will vote according to the majority of the region.

The rule book will be presented at the September Meeting, your comments are needed. This is a five-year book that we will all have to live with. I would also like to remind you that we are trying to encourage new members. I mean new, new people. People that may have purchased their first Corvette and would like to give competition a try. Are we writing the book for a few or for the beginner as well as the experienced. Everyone has a right to their opinion. But make sure when you are voting for your club, it is your club's opinion that is being expressed, not just your own.

Other Matters

Please read the paragraph under Business Manager very carefully. It pertains to Car Shows. There have been a lot of questions this year regarding car shows, sanctions and insurance coverage. It would appear that insurance coverage is becoming more and more of an issue every day. So be careful. If you are sponsoring or co-sponsoring a car show you better make sure you have a sanction or non-sanction number. You may not think it is very important, but it appears it is and will continue to be. The last thing any of us want is an accident, but if something should happen, you certainly don't want to find out you have no insurance coverage.

Dale Samuelson has indicated his intention to run for the office of Vice President - Competition. Good Luck - Dale!


The Owosso Speedway is a 3/8 mile oval that creates a difference challenge.
