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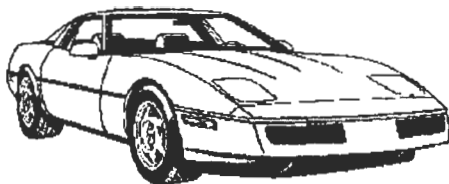

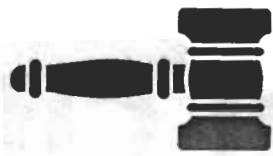

I want to remind you that the club will accept nominations at our next meeting for officers for 1996. Your input and support are very important as a club is only as strong as the membership and the membership looks to its officers for leadership. If you are interested in becoming an officer or would like to nominate someone, be sure to attend the meeting.



Competition

The competition information is normally included in my "competition update"; however, I have information specific to our club.

Points - There has been considerable confusion over the club's points system. Therefore, at our October meeting, Phil Hansas will be distributing a copy of your points sheet for your review.

Along with your individual sheet, Phil will distribute a Matrix that explains the points system and how the points will be awarded for each event this year. Please review your information and if you have any questions, be sure to talk to Phil or myself.

Competition Events -

Each year every National Council Club can host (7) sanctioned events.

Sanctioned events are those events eligible for national and regional points. In a last few years our club has sponsored (4) low speed events and (3) rallyes. The Board has decided to pursue the same for 1996 unless the membership has a problem with this decision. This will also be discussed at our October meeting.

LAS VEGAS

Here is the deal - we will depart from the Lansing airport (American Trans Air) on Thursday, March 7 and Return Sunday, March 9 (this is spring break for MSU). The price includes air fair and hotel. There is an additional \$28.90 air tax added on to each ticket. If we have 26 people we get one free air and hotel so I propose this be raffled to the participants.

At the time of booking there is a \$50 per person

deposit required. 60 days prior to departure an additional \$50 per person is required with the balance due 30 days prior to departure. The following are our possibilities:

Imperial Palace (4 key hotel) located midway on the strip is \$379 per person for double occupancy. This hotel offers 2700 luxurious rooms and suites, over 250 Antique and Classic Automobiles, 10 specialty restaurants, shopping arcade, piano bar and lounge and much more.

Flamingo Hilton (5 key hotel) is located next door to the Imperial Palace and is \$419 per person. This hotel offers 3671 rooms, massage and health spa, Radio City Music Hall Rockettes, and 8 restaurants.

MGM Grand Hotel and Theme Park (5 key and one of the best) has two different towers: Emerald Tower is \$429 per person and the Grand Tower is \$449 per person. This resort has 5005 rooms and 751 suites, health spa, 8 restaurants, tennis courts, theme park and much, much more.

The Mirage (Gold Key - the very best) is \$489 per person. The Mirage has a Polynesian theme with 3044 rooms, erupting volcano, tropical rain

forest, 20,000 gallon salt water aquarium, Dolphins, lagoons, golf course, health spa, 7 restaurants and much more.

All of the hotels sound great and all are on the strip. The packages are offered through Key Tours and Phil Zeller's mom (Phyllis) will be handling our reservations. As it is important for us to start planning this trip, please be prepared to discuss and make final decision at our October Membership Meeting.

Remember this trip will be in March just the right time to take care of your cabin fever.

If you have an idea for 1996 be sure to let me know and we will see what we can do to include it in our schedule.

What a day!

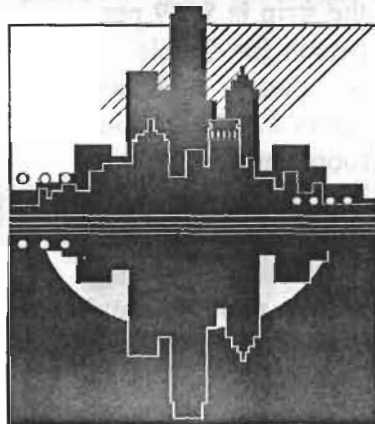
The sun was shining and the divots were flying as Capital City Corvette Club raced through Branson Bay Golf Club.

I apologize for not having the points standings in this issue. We have had a few events in September and I have not had an opportunity to review all of them and pass the information on to Sharon for compilation.

The November issue will have an update for you.

RCD Meeting September 8, 1995

The proposed Rulebook did pass and by a very large margin. I believe there were only 35 no votes.

There were a few minor changes:

1. Points will be awarded to attending the National Convention (15) and points will be awarded for entering an event (5 points for each event). No travel points or worker points will be awarded. These points will be for National points only and will not affect any Regional points programs.

2. Non-sanction events will be allowed on weekends associated with Convention. There was considerable discussion regarding this issue and it was felt that prohibiting non-sanction events from being held on these two weekends probably would not improve participation at the Convention, but would penalize those clubs and individuals that could not attend convention.

3. The 1996 Corvettes will be placed in the G Classes and the Callaway (RPO B2K only) will be placed in the F Classes. Mixing of parts between the Callaway and the ZR-1 will not be allowed.

Sectional Bids were presented and appropriate flyers are enclosed:

North Sectional (2) bids:
Mid Ohio 8/3-8/4 with 2 events (1) each day.

Putnam park 5/4-5/5 (4) events - (2) each day.

South Sectional (1)bid
Rockingham 5/25-5/26 (4) low speed and (3) high speed.

No other sectional bids were presented.

November Region Meeting - Please remember the calendar for 1996 will be organized at this meeting. At our September meeting we discussed large event weekends and the impact made on everyone. You may want to know that Michigan is not the only region discussing the large weekends. Under the new Rulebook, 7 events per day will be the maximum; however, there are regions looking at limiting events to 4 per day. There has been considerable concern expressed by people

running for points that large weekends are too much and they may begin to boycott these events in the future.

I also talked to the Indiana Region about sharing calendar information so we would not have conflicting weekends, therefore competing against each other for competitors. They were very open to this idea and looked forward to working with us.

Would you please take this information back to your clubs for discussion prior to the November meeting? If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me.

The month of October will be filled with Rallyes all over the state. I hope you and your fellow club members will be able to participate in some, if not all of them. Our trees will be turning soon which should provide great scenery for a nice afternoon drive (it just the questions that drive a people crazy).
