RALLYE AROUND


More miles than any other month!







For reservations made within 30 days of departure full payment is due immediately. All cheques and money orders are to be made payable to KEYTOURS/REPUBLIC BANK. Clients are to make cheques payable to your travel agent who in turn will issue his own cheque payable to KEYTOUR/REPUBLIC BANK. Credit card bookings are for full payment only.

CANCELLATION & REFUND: You have the right to cancel your reservation and receive a full refund less \$10.00 per person it cancelled up to 21 days prior to departure. Cancellations made within 21 days of departure will forfeit full amount. Group/ special request hotel policies may vary.

REVISIONS & CHANGES: If you wish to provide a substitute after we have confirmed your booking, you may do so without penalty. You are permitted to change your travel date up to 21 days prior to scheduled departure at no penalty, however, within 21 days, full amount will be forfeited.

UNUSED SERVICE: No refunds or adjustments will be considered for any tour arrangements, or attendant services, not taken or used.

DIRECT AIR CARRIER: Air Transportation for this Public Charter will be provided by American Trans Air, Inc. The air carrier reserves the right to substitute equivalent aircraft or equipment if necessary.

TRAVEL DOCUMENTS: Regulations specifically state that all passengers must present positive identification when boarding a public charter (both ways). Any person who cannot prove that he or she is the person on this form will not be allowed to board the aircraft.

BAGGAGE: The air carrier allows each passenger to bring on the flight 44 lbs. of luggage. You are, however, only allowed to put 2 bags through check-in services. For each bag over 2, a charge of \$25.00 per bag will be assessed. For domestic flights, the liability is limited to \$750.00 per passenger for both checked and unchecked baggage. 


