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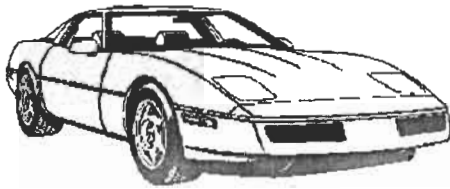

February, 1996

I will be attending my first Governor's Meeting in Louisville, Kentucky on February 24th, and will be providing you with an update about that meeting -- but, in the meantime, there are a few other things that I can pass along.

- I received a renewal roster for NCCC from Barb Harris, Region Membership Director, for review, and will be providing copies to Jim Gossum.

- You should all have received your renewal packets from NCCC; if you haven't, let us know. There is lots of neat stuff in the renewal packet this year. According to a letter from Jerry Britner, President of NCCC, this has been the largest mass mailing ever by NCCC. NCCC membership is projected to be 11,000 by the first Governor's meeting in February. That number is certainly a testament to the ongoing carryover member renewals, as well as new members.

- We received a letter and brochure from the Detroit Historical Museum regarding a new interactive exhibit now on display entitled "MOTOR CITY EXHIBITION." It marks the official celebration of 100 years of automobile manufacturing in the United States. This exhibit may not be CORVETTE-specific, but it sounds very interesting and large enough to be worthwhile. It covers 8,000 square feet and has a 60-foot length of actual assembly line from GM's Clark assembly plant. INDUSTRY UPDATE

Well, here we are, 1996 and looking at the last year for the CORVETTE to appear pretty much as it has since 1984. And, with that thought in mind, I have an artist's rendering and a spy photo to share with you of what the '97 CORVETTE will look like...



Vital statistics on the next Vette

These illustrations are a close approximation of what the next-generation Corvette, due out in 1997, looks like.

Some vital stats: Overall length shrinks about 8 inches to 170, but the wheelbase stretches 6 inches to 102. A transaxle will be mounted in the back, similar to the Porsche 928, for better weight distribution. Styling is more rounded, but evolutionary, not revolutionary. The 5.7-liter V8 will make 350 horsepower; run-flat tires will be standard.

The new CORVETTE is tentatively scheduled to be available Fall of 1996.

If any of you out there are thinking about a new, last-of-this-body-style, purchase, here are a couple of bits of information for you...

I was talking with Dick Iding at Bud Kouts Chevrolet and he tells me that GM/Chevrolet is offering a \$2,000 rebate on new Vettes purchased by the end of March, 1996, plus an additional discount from him up to \$4,500 for a total discount of \$6,500. Not bad for those of you that are thinking about it.

And, if you are considering a new purchase... great news from the Internal Revenue Service. They have ruled that the threshold at which the 10 percent luxury tax on automobiles begins is now \$34,000, as of January 1st. Another thing that new owners will want to remember... if you plan on installing a lot of aftermarket goodies on your Vette, wait at least six months after you purchase it. The IRS says that any amount of the transaction price exceeding \$34,000 -- plus any parts or accessories installed on the car within its first six month of service -- are subject to the luxury tax.



New Vette

This spy shot of the redesigned 1997 Chevrolet Corvette shows just how much of the current Corvette's lines are still visible in the new car. Overall, the car appears longer and lower than the current Vette. Sources say stylists will abandon the round taillight, replacing them with oval-shaped lenses. According to the photographer, this photo was computer enhanced, but the only disguises removed were the car's front and rear bras.

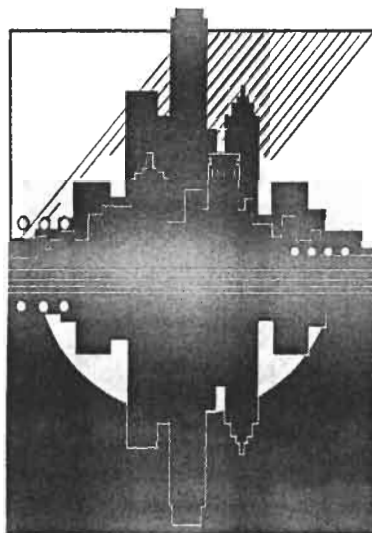
Better than the Golden Globe Awards!

Capital City Corvette Club 1996 Points Program

1. All events sponsored by the Capital City Corvette Club (CCCC) or NCCC Regionally Sanctioned, will be considered for point. These are the only events which will be considered CCCC sanctioned.
2. Thirty days notice must be given before an event. Under special circumstances, The competition director can make exceptions. In most cases, "notice" is defined as an announcement in the CCCC newsletter.
3. CCCC points will be awarded on the following basis:
 - A. **Competition Points** - Available to NCCC members with their NCCC number through the Capital City Corvette Club.
 - Travel points will not be included in the CCCC totals.
 - Club members participating without a corvette will awarded points as if they were in a corvette.
 - Points will be awarded using the following NCCC tables:

 6. Each member is responsible for getting non-club sponsored events points information to the points director in a timely manner.
 7. Chairpersons are responsible for submitting an attendance list and/or workers list to the Points Director.
