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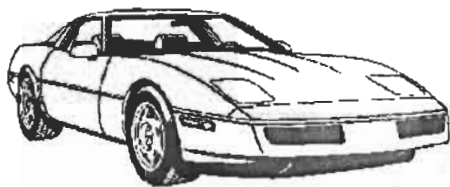

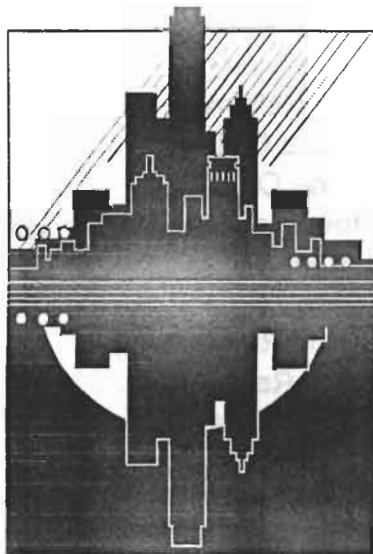

Little Numbers Mean A Lot

Taken from the Lansing State Journal: Delhi Township -- Car theft ring cracked: A state auto-theft hotline awarded \$6,000 to a tipster who helped police crack a Corvette theft and retagging ring in Delhi Township.

The August tip eventually led to the January arrest of Robert Underhill, 49, of Holt, after police found a Delhi Township garage with two stolen Corvettes and body parts from as many as 30 or 40 other Corvettes.

Underhill, owner of Hill Auto Sales, 1900 N. Cedar St., Holt, was charged with altering vehicle identification numbers and filing a false title application. His trial is scheduled to start Thursday [February].

The case remains open, and Michigan State Police are still investigating other leads, Lt. Harvey Jarriell of the State Police's auto theft unit said.

The state hotline, Help Eliminate Auto Thefts, has received 4,328 calls since it was launched in 1985. The tips have led to the recovery of 2,010 vehicles valued at \$21 million and the arrest of 1,639 suspects.

The hotline has made a significant [effect], said Bill Liddane, director of the HEAT program.

"Michigan, as I recall, was No. 2 or 3 in vehicle thefts across the country," Liddane said. "We're off the top 10 now."

Insurance companies pitch in to pay the rewards. HEAT's budget this year is \$350,000. A panel awards up to \$10,000 for tips leading to the discovery of theft rings and chop shops. As much as \$1,000 is paid for arrests and prosecution of individuals.

Anyone with information about a theft can call 1-800-242-HEAT. *Compiled by staff writer Mark Mayes*

Prior to going to Louisville I attended the region meeting, much of which was covered in the region report, but a couple of things that I would like to point out are...

1. Scholarship help for college bound students, the Royals from Muskegon now have a Michigan only scholarship. The region voted for the \$500 unrestricted scholarship. If you are interested, I have the application forms.
2. Discussed the Corvette Museum and a plan to have a brick for each club surrounding a tile that represents the region... more to come.

At the NCCC meeting...

3. Hopefully there will be enough participants to pay a \$1000 death claim benefit. Attached is the form with complete details.
4. Next issue of Corvette Quarterly will have coverage of the '97 Vette -- according to George Swift, Director of Public Relations.
5. NO Dream & Drives scheduled for '96.
6. Pro Team has goodie bags available for events. If you are interested, they need 30-45 days to fill your order. Make your next event a little different -- have some stuff to give away.
7. Convention '96 -- anyone interested?? I have forms and prices available.
8. As a result of model changeover, ALL Corvette plant tours will suspend as of April 4th.
9. 4th of July will be American Heritage Festival in conjunction with Harley Davidson. Homecoming June 6th at the plant will be discontinued.
10. Last, but not least... Elaine found a neat cookbook that helps support Disaster Relief Fund. We will take orders and money and bring them back from NCCC -- SAVE \$2.50.

This covers the events at some fast-paced meetings. More to come, I'm sure.

NCCC MEMORIAL PROGRAM



The National Council of Corvette Clubs, Inc., working with the NCCC Charity Committee, has added a new program to the Grants division; the NCCC MEMORIAL PROGRAM. This program is designed to help OUR members in their time of need.

The program will be administered by Kara Kosier who also oversees the Grants division of the Charity Committee. The Grants division includes the Disaster Relief Fund and the Scholarship Fund.

There is a one time fee of \$4.00 to join. When one of the enrollees passes away, you will be mailed an assessment notice for \$3.00 to be sent to Kara Kosier. If we have a good response to this new program, we will be able to pay at least \$1,000.00 death claim benefit on each death to the stated beneficiary. The remaining funds would then be used for our Disaster and Scholarship programs.
