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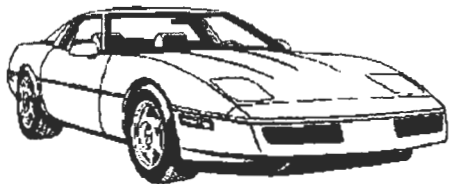

If you have ever considered or would like to **consider being an officer** of our club I would like to take a few minutes to briefly outline what each position entails.

The Board of Directors is comprised of the club officers. In addition to the specific responsibilities for **each office,** the Board meets once per **month for planning** purposes. Each officer is expected to provide a report at the General Membership Meeting pertaining to his/her areas of

responsibility.



President - the president is responsible for the meetings and the overall operation of the club.

If for some reason an officer or chairperson is not able to fulfill his/her responsibilities, the president must be willing to step in. The president must be a NCCC member and have held office in the Capital City Corvette Club prior to holding the office of president.

Vice President Competition - the vice president of competition is responsible for all competition events. This person is responsible for the calendar, sanctioning events with the region, the flyers, and the results. If for some reason the chairperson for any event is unable to fulfill his/her responsibilities, the competition director must step in to make sure the event is completed. The competition director is the Club's representative to the region and is required to attend the Region meetings and provide the club with an update each month as to competition events and happenings in the Region.



Secretary - the secretary is responsible for taking minutes at **the general membership meetings and the board meetings.** These minutes will be provided to the membership on a monthly basis, via the club newsletter.

Treasurer - The treasurer is responsible for the club treasury. The treasurer collects all receipts and pays all the bills. The treasurer is responsible for **monthly** reporting to the club regarding income and expenditures.



Governor - the governor is the club's representative to the National. The governor is responsible for all **communications** between the club and the National and is expected to attend the National Governor's meeting which is currently held in Louisville.



Membership Director - the membership director is responsible for **all membership** activities for the club. He/She is responsible for recruiting members and providing membership information at events. The membership director is **also responsible** for the **collection of annual dues**.



Social Director - the social director coordinates all the club's social events. This includes **enlisting chair people for events** and making sure flyers are in the newsletter for social events. The social director coordinates the social calendar with the **competition calendar to eliminate the possibility of any conflicts**.



Public Relations - the public relations director is responsible for the club's interaction with outside entities. This entails non-sanctioned car show or parade participation for example. Public relations is also



responsible for the club raffles.



Points Director - the points director is responsible for keeping track of points for the membership. The points director will **provide a points report** to the general membership on a monthly basis via the newsletter or the monthly meetings.

Newsletter Editor - the newsletter editor is responsible for the distribution of the newsletter. This entails coordinating officer reports, printing, collating, and mailing the newsletter on a monthly basis.



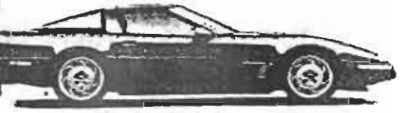

GOVERNOR'S REPORT



Dennis O'Hara, Capital City Corvette Club Governor

Well, here we are... it's Autumn, we are all closer to storing our Corvettes for the winter and we have just returned from the September Board of Governor's Meeting in Louisville.

Since this is the first meeting after the convention, we had a lot to cover. The meeting was very long and covered a lot of ground... and was very well attended -- the largest number of rooms reserved at Executive West, to date.

Meeting report highlights follow:

Dale Samuelson, Director of Competition reported that over 1000 events were processed in 1996 -- what a competition year! NCCC is looking to expand competition National Awards to the top 15. Also, at any High Speed Event, certification must be checked. If they are not certified, it could affect insurance.

Nancy Sable, Director of Membership reminded us that renewal time is upon us. We need to have our renewal information to Region by the 2nd week in November. Renewal costs are \$45 Master Member, \$20.00 Spouse. Our goal in 1997 is 100% NCCC membership.

George Swift, Director of P.R. The 1997 Corvette is slated to debut at the '97 North American Auto Show -- that's DETROIT!! -- in January. At this point the '97 production schedule calls for 10-12,000 units, get in line early with your checkbook... Corvette Quarterly will have an overview of the C-5 in the January '97 issue. Dream and Drive looks

like a possibility in Spring of '97 and continue through '98, with the convertible announcement and release in the future.

Dennis Patrick, Business Manager. As I mentioned earlier, we had the most rooms reserved for NCCC to date. We had two claims submitted to K & K Insurance -- one denied, one approved. Ours was the approved one.

Patrick Dolan, Director of Charity had a great report on our new charity -- the National Kidney Foundation Transplant Games that were held in Salt Lake City. He told us that there were over 1200 athletes ranging in age from 3 years to 78 years old. Even though we have just started our relationship with the National Kidney Foundation, we were able to present them with a check for \$68,640. He shared with us the warm feeling and level of appreciation that he was shown as our representative at the games... in fact, he became known as "The Corvette Guy" by everyone at the games. As a major sponsor,

our name and logo was everywhere, on banners, shirts and signs.

Pat talked about the goal for '97 -- to have 100% club participation for the car raffle -- meaning one ticket per member for the car raffle. Clubs that achieve that goal will receive a plaque from NCCC and the recognition that goes with it. What that means to the NATIONAL KIDNEY FOUNDATION is the potential to receive \$130,000 next year at the

convention from NCCC.

Windy City Corvette Club donated \$22,500 to Spina Bifida in 1997.

John Osborn, Director of Publications announced that 11 scholarships were awarded nationally. 32 applications were submitted, 22 were complete and correct. He also reminded us that you must have a minimum of 3 years affiliation with NCCC to qualify for scholarship consideration.

CONVENTION

1996 - Great turnout. We had 710 reservations and 690 attendees... and, 69 children. 554 people attended the banquet. Overall it looks like it was a profitable convention.

1997 Convention - We had a presentation from Cleveland. Dates will be July 12-18, 1997. Registration forms will be included in your Membership Renewal packet this year and will NOT be in Blue Bars as in the past. If you want to order '97 convention stuff, i.e.: T-shirts, etc., I have an order form that you can use. You can be the first one in your neighborhood to have the "OFFICIAL" '97 Convention stuff.

High Speed Events will be at Nelson Ledges -- about 35 minutes away.
Low Speed/Drags -- held at Norwalk, about 45 miles away. For those real serious Drag Event folks, Norwalk is 831 ft. above sea level.
Concourse will be held at the Cleveland Zoo... complete details will be announced at the November Governor's meeting.

1998 St. Louis -- proposal was presented.

1999 Not announced.

2000 May be Rocky Mountain region.
