For those clubs hosting multiple **event weeks**, one flyer can be used for all events as long as each Governor is listed and at least one chairperson from each club is listed as a contact person.

Important note to remember: You must offer two runs for each event. If you are running a Low Speed and MTT at the same time, you must offer four runs. You can count two, three, or all four runs for each event. You must announce your intent prior to the event as how the results will be calculated!

Chair people must be on site for the event and must

sign the waiver. Anyone not signing the waiver does not exist and will be removed from the results listing.

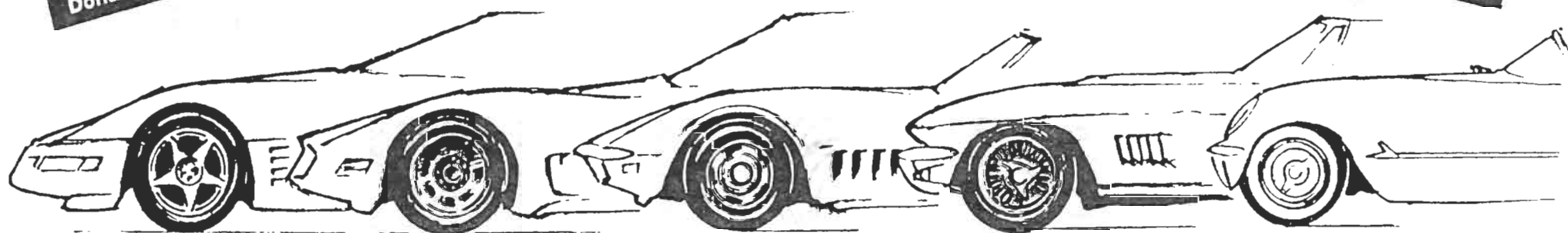

For people that are not interested in gambling we will have "Line Dancing" lessons available, free of charge.

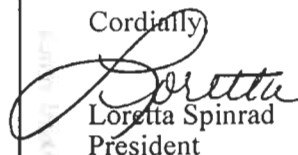
