Well, we just returned from Louisville, KY and the second Governor's Meeting for 1997. The weather was great; considering it was raining when we left Michigain. Amagingly enough, the roads got smoother when we left Michigan - makes you wonder....

We had a good turnout at the Executive West Hotel in Louisville for the Governor's Meeting. I have some good informatino to share with you.

FCOA

Future Corvette Owners Association. This is a great opportunity to bring youngsters into our ranks to help build the future. Membership is being expanded to include nieces and nephews as well as children and grandchildren. I also have a copy of the "CORVETE" book for young people that you might like to get for your favorite youngster.

BLOOMINGTON

NCCC will have space at the Mid-America tent; have a '97 vette on display; and have folks from the NKF as part of our national membership drive.

MEMBERSHIP

Speaking of Membership...currently there are 11,890 of us nationally and with the formation of a new region in Arizona and New Mexico that will be recognized in January, 1998, there will be even more.

FACTORY TOUR

The postponed factory tour is back on again! It will be in September, the Friday prior to the Governor's Meeting. The tour will be in Bowling Green, KY, Friday, Sept. 12th at 9:00 a.m. Of the 200 tickets available, we were only allowed to purchase a total of 8 tickets at \$15.00 each. Currently, 4 are available for club members. The tour will include a box lunch and tickets to the Corvette Museum. Accommodations for Thursday night and Friday night are available...

CONVENTION

Currently, there are 543 adults registered for Convention and projected to be at 725+ total. They have a youth program and lots of fun stuff and tours for participants, as well as low speed, high speed and concours events. We also have our "Raffle Car"!! It is Torch Red with Black interior.

CHARITY

It was announced that we have our raffle car for '97 and should have our '98 raffle car for next year soon. There are 9 clubs that are have 100% of raffle tickets sold; currently we are at 56% with 27 tickets sold and 23 to go. I will have to have all our tickets and proceeds returned by mid-June, so, if you are thinking about it, buy one or two or how ever many tickets you can afford so we can envy you when you show up in your NEW C-5!!! During the past year there has been a total of \$118,294 donated by NCCC and various clubs throughout the country, to charities - it's good work for good causes.

We had a representative from the National Kidney Foundation (NKF) speak that told us about the program that will heighten awareness to increase organ donations. Annually, there are about 50,000 people on a waiting list for donations - in '96 there were 10,000 procedures performed. Of the 8-10 people that die per day during the waiting period, 4 will be children. So, you can see the importance of this program. The Transplant Games for 1998 will be in Columbus, Ohio and they expect 1,500+ athletes to participate. Loretta Spinrad has tapes that give us a more complete look at the NKF program.

MISCELLANEOUS

- Governor's Meetings will continue to be held in Louisville, KY for the next 3 years.
- There will be a "Return to the Road Route 66 Tour" more details to come.
- The NCCC display at the Corvette Museum will be a Route 66 Diner that was constructed and donated for this purpose. I saw a picture it is really cool!
- The September issue of Corvette Quarterly will feature the '98 C-5 convertible.
- Vision 2000 There is a committee of club Governors being formed to help plan a strategy for the future and changes that will affect the NCCC and its members. It will look at how we are structured and do business with a view to the future and how we can grow.
- Scholarships We had 15 total applications for 1997. If you know of a candidate that qualified, submit an application for 1998. Application deadline is May 1, 1998.

Corvette. They live in Lansing and have one son who is 17 and lives at home.


Joe enjoys most sports, especially Bowling and Softball.





FIGURE 8 WEEKEND
