Tickets for the '98 Raffle Car are available now. In the past we would get them in February/March and only have until convention in July to sell them. Cast year we achieved 100% ticket sales (sold 1 ticket per member). All the 100% clubs will be recognized in the winter issue of Blue Bars. WHAT WE DID ONE SUMMER DAY

SHOW & TELL AT THE CORVETTE MUSEUM & ASSEMBLY PLANT TOUR

Well, we just returned from Governor's Meeting in Louisville, KY on September 12/13. Weather was wonderful; car was running great; and I would like to share with you our activity filled day at the National Corvette Museum and the Bowling Green Assembly Plant that we attended prior to the weekend meetings.

As you know, the NCCC organized a tour for members that was self-supporting and allowed us to have a full day of the "corvette experience".

We started our day with members of other corvette clubs that had made their way to Smiths Grove, KY (just north of Bowling Green, KY). Everyone was up early, made sure the vettes were clean, washed, wiped down - you know, the things that we all say we are not obsessive about. We caravanned out at about 8:45a.m. Our group was about 12 cars; we were headed for Bowling Green.

We met up with the other folks from around the country at the Museum. We spent the morning wandering, looking, and wondering why we didn't have enough sense to hold on to those vettes we used to have...

The NCCC display was super. It depicted a diner, cars on display, Route 66, and the memorabilia that makes the early days of corvetting such fond memories.

There is a display area of NCCC member club patches. Ours was right there with all the rest. The museum is a wonderful place to spend time and showcase some of the best examples of our favorite car.

We had a quick box lunch in the Museum Auditorium, then off to the assembly plant - lots of corvettes caravanning to the plant. We arrived at the plant, parked all the corvettes together and walked into the plant - big lot, long walk. We met up with some of the folks that came down from Louisville - they were on their way to the Museum.

We went to an area and met up with our tour guide "Mike" and became a group of about 20 at that time. We entered a facility that is 1 million square feet of air conditioned space, filled with people, machines, robots, parts and computers all with the single purpose of producing Corvettes.

They told us it is about 4 days from start to finish to produce a vette, and takes about 1,000 people in the plant to accomplish it; not all working on the same car of course!

We started off in the area that produces frames and moved through all the stages until the body and chassis came together. Then wheels, cockpit, interior and all the other pieces came together just prior to filling all the fluids - oil, power steering, etc. Then the magic moment! They light it up! Elana Siebel from the Kalamazoo club was picked from our group to help give birth to a new C-5 convertible. Actually, she started it up for the first time right on the assembly line.

The amazing thing is, all of these pieces and parts of various colors and destinations get to where they are going and where they need to be at the right time and sequence.

Then continuing on down the line, all the final fit, finish, and inspections take place - and some bumps in the road to settle the suspension down. Then every corvette goes onto the Dynamometer and Test Acceleration Booth to go through a simulation of various speeds, acceleration and systems checks for a go/no go rating. While in this station, the car accelerates to over 60 MPH and does some serious jumping around as they check steering, brakes, transmission operations, to name a few.

Then...we had a surprise which was the highlight of our tour. We saw the '98 Indy 500 pace car prototype! It was outrageous - Laser Blue with Canary Yellow alloy wheels and Blue and Yellow leather interior. It surely will stand out in a crowd!!

Unfortunately, the 90 minute tour was over. Would I like to see it again? You bet! And probably will.

If you can fit this tour into your plans - do it. Wear comfortable shoes and be prepared to be impressed. We know there were 166 people, other than us, that were.


SPOTLIGHT OS OUR MEMBERS
