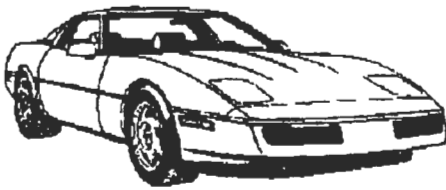

1 pts	Additional point for arriving at the meeting or social event with a corvette (either riding in, driving, or towing it)!!!
2 pts	Spectating at any CCCC or regionally sanctioned, sponsored competition event (maximum of 4 points per day).
3 pts	Participation in any CCCC or regionally sanctioned, sponsored competition event (maximum of 6 points per day).
2 pts	Additional participation points if the designated club event of the month (social or competition).
10 pts	Attending the CCCC Banquet.
10 pts	Entering your corvette in any club sanctioned car show or parade.

THE NOT

OFFICIAL CORVETTE HISTORY

1958, the Corvette had survived another year; gotten more power; a four-speed gearbox; fuel injection; and a host of other refinements.

The '58 corvette introduced a new body style that now was longer, wider, and....**heavier** - not the direction a sports car should be going! There were decisions that were made earlier as a result of the racing experience such as heavier brakes and suspension that predicted this. It was styling and performance, and not steroids that caused the corvette to become a bigger and better car.

Styling included quad headlights, real bumpers and other by-products of previous design reviews, such as louvers on the hood (fake); side vents; chrome trim around the headlights; chrome trim bands on the trunk; and the introduction of the use of Acrylic Lacquer. The interior included a new dash with a 160 MPH speedometer and a 6000 RPM tachometer.

Then to move the whole package down the road, a new 290 H.P. fuel injected engine. However, at this time, GM and Chevrolet still were not (officially) promoting performance or racing as a result of the AMA racing ban. Despite the no promotion of racing, all you had to do was order the RPO 579D option and you were in business!

1958 proved to be a better year for production. For the first year of the quad headlight car, 9,168 came off the St. Louis assembly line.

1959 saw a refinement of styling with the removal of the chrome trim on the trunk, and the fake louvers from the hood. Other options became available, such as stiffer springs, finned brake drums and metallic brakes, to name a few. A nicely equipped '59 corvette would come in at a little under \$5,000. The final production number for 1959 was 9,670. Almost 3 times as many as produced in 1956.

During 1960, there were not any major styling changes. Engine power and handling continued to grow. The production number for 1960 was 10,261.

When the 1961 corvette was introduced, something was missing. During the “re-styling” for 1961, the trademark “teeth” in the grill disappeared. It was the last year the “coves” were painted a contrasting color. The rear end was completely restyled. It was the first appearance of a styling cue that is still a corvette trademark - it now had four tail lights! A look that still exists in the new C-5 corvette.

This was also the first time the exhaust did not exit through the body, through the bumpers or body panel. This was the last year that you could order “wide whitewalls”.

On the performance side, you could order the RPO 354 option and get 315 fuel injected horse power. Total production for 1961 was 10,939.

1962 was the year for subtle changes to the body - much cleaner and less chrome. And the last time (until recently) that a corvette would have a trunk. It was the last year for exposed headlights, and solid axle. But....it was the year for a major first. This was the year for the first appearance of the 327 cubic inch V8. The 327 was available from 250 H.P. all the way up to 360 H.P. fuel injection, Duntov cam, solid lifter, thumper, the RPO 582 option.

The 327 V8 was created by taking a 283, V8 and increasing the stroke to 3.25 and the bore to 4.00 inches. The horsepower came from various combinations of cams, fuel handling systems, and head/valve that produced the horsepower variations.

The result of these improvements boosted the production to 14,531. The picture continues to improve. The behind-the-scenes activity that helped to improve the corvette involved engineers, stylists, racers, lots of money and risk-taking to get us to where we are today. But that is another story of commitment and perseverance.

Remember - SAVE THE WAVE.

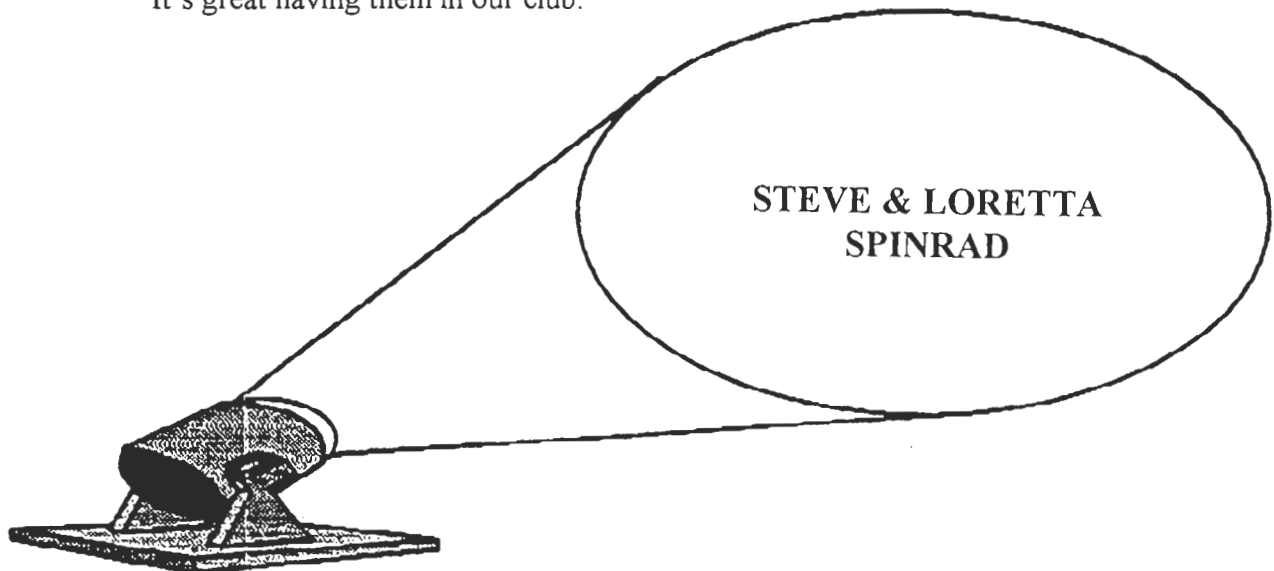
SPOTLIGHT ON OUR MEMBERS
