WELL...Spring is finally here and we are all closer to getting the Corvettes out of storage and back on the road again. After all, that's what it is all about: Warn weather, sunshine, the open road and your Corvette!

During the past couple of months, we have covered a lot of information and history of the product (the Corvette). This month, I would like to introduce you to some of the people that were involved in creating, growing, and keeping the Corvette alive.

Not all of these folks were G.M. employees. In fact, many of them were enthusiasts that raced in various parts of the country and the world and introduced the performance capabilities of the Corvette.

There was a group within G.M. that was dedicated to the growth of the Corvette. These visionaries consisted of stylists, engineers, marketing managers, product development specialists; all the way up to the top executives in Chevrolet.

Early on, in the 1953 through 1955 models, the Corvette was not viewed as a high performance vehicle; but the styling and newness of the concept got it off the ground.

In the beginning, the use of fiberglass was a hugh decision. A little known fact is, a company that manufactured reinforced plastic bread trays was the company that started making parts for the first Corvettes. This small company was in Ashtabula, Ohio. Also at this time, Owens Corning was interested in helping as well. Robert Morrison and his company, MFA, were the first producers of the 300 sets of body panels for the first Corvettes.

Thomas Keating, Chevrolets' General Manager, and Harley Earl, were the two people that brought the Corvette into existence and had its first showing in New York City.

Harley Earl, within General Motors, had a major impact on styling and, ultimately, product planning. As G.M.'s Vice President of Styling, he had a big interest in international racing.

Onto the scene came a new Chief Engineer named Ed Cole, and a chassis expert, Maurice Olley, that directed the development of the first Corvette chassis.

These efforts, coupled with the styling expertise of Bob McLean and Duane Bohn Steadt, all moved toward the target. The only thing they were not able to achieve was to have a V-8 in the Corvette at introduction. Everything in the G.M. inventory was too big and bulky to meet the design parameters. So the "Blue Flame", six cylinder engine with performance modifications became the power plant of choice.

Thus the beginning, the launch in 1953 with 300 production Corvettes, was destined to end up in the hands of notable people, such as the movie stars and athletes.

Well, this covers who and how it got started. Next month will get us to the folks that enhanced the image and made them go fast!

Until next month, remember "SAVE THE WAVE".

FINANCIAL REPORT

There is a proposal for wheel-to-wheel racing. Results of this will be discussed at the April '98 Governor's meeting. Otherwise, there are minor rule book changes.

CORVETTE MUSEUM

The Corvette museum in Bowling Green is still looking for race cars to be loaned as museum displays.

NCCC ADVERTISING

The NCCC will have an ad in the Corvette Quarterly magazine along with a Kidney Foundation logo.

KEY EVENT WEEKENDS

A calendar of events will soon be published, listing "Key Event Weekends", ie., State Parks, etc.. When there are 50 or more Corvettes, they will be provided special areas for the cars.

DREAM AND DRIVE

Dream and drive is up in the air, but is being discussed. There was some talk about VSI "Ride of your life" program.

NCCC ON INTERNET???


SPOTLIGHT ON OUR MEMBERS
