COMPETITION

First place in competition (overall points) for 1998 goes to Corvette Atlanta.

MEMBERSHIP

There are currently 12,389 members in NCCC.

A vote at the April meeting will be taken to decide the location for years 2001, 2002, and 2003 Governors' meetings. The proposed locations are Louisville, Kentucky, and St. Louis, Missouri.

BUSINESS MANAGER

The NCCC web page has been up since the third week in September. As of the date of this meeting, there had been 4,200 hits on the NCCC web site.

K&K Insurance is reorganizing. It was noted that they also cover the cost of club equipment, such as timing lights if they are damaged.

PARLIAMENTARIAN

There have been 18 entries for the Newsletter contest.

DIRECTOR OF CHARITY

A Corvette club in the Florida Keys received a check from NCCC for damages caused by a storm, and a check was sent to a Michigan club member as a result of a heart problem.

There isn't much information on the 1999 raffle car, other than it will not be a convertible.

Applications are available for scholarships. In 1998, there were sixteen, \$500 scholarships given.

If clubs decide to make donations to the National Kidney Foundation, the Charity Committee prefers they go through NCCC. This helps strengthen the relationship NCCC already has with NKF.

STEERING COMMITTEE

So far there has been a low response for attending the National Convention in Denver. This may be due to membership packets not being mailed out yet. It was mentioned that there is free shuttle service from the airport to the hotel 24 hours per day. Also, for competition, 5-point safety harnesses more than 2 years old will not be allowed, per NHRA track rules. (This applies only to Group II and Group III).

In reference to the year 2000 convention at Traverse City, there has been some talk of opposition to the format in that it does not include high speed competition.

FUTURE CORVETTE OWNERS OF AMERICA (FCOA)

There are now 791 FCOA members. The goal for this year is 1,000 members. FCOA packets will be sent out in March.

Check www.FCOA@aol.com. A dinosaur display is at the Corvette Museum in Bowling Green until April 19th. This is there as an educational display so a tax break can be taken advantage of.






