
Our next meeting will be 7:00 p.m., April 7 at Richards. See you there!

Welcome to the '99 National Corvette Caravan - Michigan "Leg"

We begin our trip on September 2, 1999 from Jack Cauley Chevrolet, West Bloomfield, Michigan. Our departure time will depend upon the number of participants, you will be notified of that later.

We will follow 175 South with a morning "pit stop" in Bowling Green, OH and lunch break in Middletown OH. The Mass & New York Caravans and Ohio (State) group will join us in Middletown. We will continue our trip down 175 and bypass Cincinnati in an attempt to avoid traffic and possible construction. We will follow 1-275 West around the Cincinnati — pick up 1-75/1-71 South to Louisville, Kentucky. The River Cities Corvette Club will host a party for all 8 Northern Corvette Caravans at the Executive West Hotel in Louisville. We will stage in the State Fairgrounds (time to be determined) on the morning of 3 Sep, meet the 8 Southern Caravans in route and simultaneously arrive at the National Corvette Museum.

The State police will assist with our trip and we ask that you comply with their requests regarding route and Cincinnati bypass.

Plans are being made for a "Day at Waterford Race Course" on 1 September (probably during the hours of 10AM to 4PM) with a BBQ that evening. For alternate plans during the day of 1 Sep we are looking into transportation to the Windsor Casinos; a tour of Meadowbrook Hall; or shopping at Somerset Mall

Local hotels have been contacted and group rates are being established.

There is a list of Bowling Green and Louisville hotels attached that may be of some help.

More detailed route information and plans will be included in the information package you will receive after you register.


