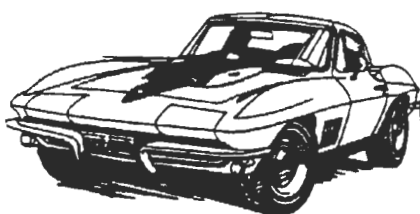

MICHIGAN REGION - NCCC

Since the last meeting, Regional Patches have been distributed and Regional Rebates for 1998 were received.

There have been several drag records set since the last meeting.

Group I - B	13.54
Group I - D	14.17
Group I - D L	14.15
Group II - C	11.96
Group II - A	11.05
Group III - B	10.42

Note: The Record Drags scheduled for September 18 in the Southwest Region has been cancelled. This may mean that we have a larger than normal turnout for the Michigan Record Drags on September 25.

The 2000 Rulebook is still being discussed, and I have a preliminary copy of the changes that have been proposed so far. The July meeting will be the final consensus before presentation to the governors in September. The following items were discussed and need additional work:

- raising the standard for helmets to Snell 95
- increase requirement for High Speed events
- Sectional events - are they needed?
- combining classes A with B, and C with D, and Mod A with Mod B
- Total number of sanctions allowed per club/per day (8 per club and 4 per day)
- clarification of tires and wheels for Group I Street and Group I
- roll bar/cage specs
- aftermarket intake manifolds in Group II?
- aftermarket sway bars in Group II?
- concours classes and rules
- Firesuits for everyone at high speed
- Specs for wheel bearing checks
- Lug nut torque specs
- Method to change the rules after a rulebook is placed into effect.
- National awards were discussed as far as awarding a percentage of participants, rather than a set number. Also are patches still a viable award for regional recognition?

These items are still being **discussed and** are not necessarily agreed upon at this time. A copy of the current 1996-1999 clarifications is enclosed.

One discussion item was a brake rotor that has grooves cut diagonally across the surface. This is not legal for Group II. Another deals with non-sanctioned drag events requiring the extra insurance from K&K. The RCD's feel this is true, but clarification is needed from the Business Manager.

For the C5 car - an OEM type, EMT tire or an OEM type, non-EMT tire will be Group I Street. A C5 car with dual purpose competition type tires would be placed in Group I.

Be sure to check the competition calendar for the due dates for sanction requests, flyers and results. I am enclosing some reminders for guidelines for events.
