Loretta reported on the following:

- A DJ has been hired for Saturday, July 8 at the cost of \$375.00
- A Talent Recruiting Agency is working on the entertainment for the remainder of the week and should have proposals ready by the end of this week.
- Angie and Loretta have tentatively selected the decoration materials and put a budget together for the parties
- Loretta spoke with Gary Chapman of Northwest Tours and the following tours are available at these costs.
 - Dunes: \$42.00 per person. 7 1/2 hours (includes lunch)
 - Mackinaw \$660 per 46 passenger coach for 10 hours
 - Wineries \$36.00 per person 6 hours (includes Lunch)
 - Charlevoix, Bay Harbor, Petoskey \$ \$41.00 person 7 hours (includes lunch)
 - Traverse City \$16 to \$18 per person (shuttle options will be available)
 - All tours include guides. Based on the schedule for all events, it was decided to schedule the tours as follows: Monday - Charlevoix, Tuesday - Dunes, Wednesday - Mackinaw, Wineries-Thursday, Traverse City - Thursday and Friday

COMPETITION EVENTS:

Volleyball Tournament

The volleyball tournament will take place Monday Evening. This is a free event, but preregistration is recommended so we can determine the number of teams, awards, and time needed for the games, playoffs and finals. You can choose your own team or we can find a team for you.

Golf Tournament

The golf tournament will be a 4 player, best-ball scramble held on Monday. Carts are included (no steel spikes). You can preregister a foursome or we can place you. Golfers at all levels are encouraged to participate as having fun will be the number one objective. The GM Dealership in Charlevoix has donated a new car for a hole-in-one. Refreshments will be provided. Cost for this event is \$25.00 per person, plus club rental if desired.

People's Choice Concours

Please note schedule change:

The road tour and car show will take place Sunday, July 9. The lineup for the road tour will begin at 4:00 p.m. leaving the resort at 5:00 p.m. We will caravan from Shanty Creek Resort to Turtle Creek Casino which is approximately 25 miles west. Upon arrival at the casino the cars will be placed on display for the car show. Voting will be done by charitable contribution to the National Kidney Foundation's Donor Awareness Program. A donation jar will be placed in front of each car with car number and participants name. As the cars will be on display to the public, additional donations will be accepted and encouraged. Live entertainment, food, and beverage will be provided at no additional charge to all registered road tour/car show participants. Awards will be given at Friday's award ceremony.

Cost for this event is \$15.00 per car.

Low Speed

The Low Speed event will take place at the Antrim County Airport which is approximately 10 minutes from the resort. This will be a pyloned course on the JetPad at the airport. Food concessions will be on site. In order to add the drags to the schedule, the low speed event will only run one day (Tuesday). This will be a closed exhaust event. Cost for this event is \$15.00 per driver.

Funkhana

This event will utilize many of your skills and will be held near the resort conference patio and lawn area. This event will also be held on Monday. Cost for this event is \$15.00 per team.

Fun Rallye

This will be a hundred mile rallye that will be held on Wednesday. The rallye route will take you from Shanty Creek Resort to the Mackinac Straits where you will be able to join the rest of the convention attendees for a day of relaxation. Along the route you will make numerous stops to enjoy the sites and pick up scavenger hunt items. The route chosen will be one of the most scenic shoreline drives in Michigan and promises to offer you a great time. Upon arrival in Mackinaw City you will be able to join the other folks that opted for bus travel or participated in the caravan. Cost for this event is \$15.00 per car.

Drag Racing

Bracket drag racing has been added to the agenda, causing some scheduling changes. This event will take place on Thursday at the Mid-Michigan Motorplex, the site used for the 1994 convention. This is an IHRA track that has undergone a lot of updating and enhancements. The track is located approximately 2 to 2 1/2 hours south of the resort. There will be ample practice time in the morning prior to the event start time. Concessions will be available at the track. Cost for this event is \$30.00 per person.

Day Trips

Revised Schedule of Events

Dunes at Lake Michigan (7 1/2 hours).

The motor coach will depart the resort at 9:15 a.m. on **Tuesday** for Lake Michigan. The participants will travel along Pierce Stocking Scenic Drive through the state park to Leeland at small unique fishing village on the harbor. Lunch will be at the Cove followed by 1 1/2 hours of personal time to shop and browse throughout the village. The motor coach will return to Shanty Creek around 5:00 p.m. in plenty of time for the evening's activities. (\$42 value)

Cost \$15.00 per person which includes lunch.

Charlevoix, Bay Harbor, Petoskey (7 hours)

The motor coach will depart the resort at 10:00 a.m. on Monday for a day of shopping and site seeing in one of Michigan's most elite coastal areas. The tour will stop in Charlevoix from 10:45 to noon. where the participants will have an opportunity to shop, enjoy the harbor, beaches, and draw bridge before boarding the bus for Bay Harbor. The tour will then proceed to the Inn at Bay Harbor for lunch at 12:30 p.m. From 1:45 to 2:45 everyone will enjoy the Marina District at Bay Harbor (an unbelievable sight). Then onto the Gaslight District in Petoskey from 3:00 to 4:00 p.m. The tour will return to Shanty Creek between 5:00 and 5:15 p.m. just in time for the volley ball games and luau. (\$41 value) Cost \$5.00 per person which includes lunch.

Wineries Tour on Old Mission Peninsula (6 hours)

The motor coach will depart the resort at 10:30 a.m. and return at 4:30 p.m. on Thursday. The tour will include two wineries, shopping and lunch. (\$36.00 value)

Cost \$10 per person which includes lunch.

Mackinaw

Wednesday is our Mackinaw Day and there will be three ways to participate. The rallye, the caravan, or motor coach transportation. There are a number of activities to do while at Mackinaw. The historic forts, shopping, and the well renown Mackinac Island. The Island is only accessible by ferry and arrangements have been made with Shepler's for discounted tickets. Once on the Island, no motor vehicles are allowed, travel is by horse, carriage, bicycle, or foot. The Grand Hotel, Mission Point, the Fort, are only to name a few of the sites on the Island. If you prefer to stay on the mainland, there is a state park with a picnic and beach area and plenty of shopping. One of the newest attractions at Mackinaw is the 800 seat theatre that offers two live stage performances each day. This is a professional theatre group of college students and they provide an outstanding performance. The departure times for the motor coaches has yet to be determine. (\$15.00 value)

Cost is \$10.00 no meals furnished.

Traverse City/Casino

Motor coaches will provide shuttle service to Turtle Creek Casino and Traverse City on Thursday and Friday. Traverse City is one of the most popular vacation spots in Michigan and offers shopping, fishing, swimming, and numerous attractions for people of all ages. (\$18.00 value)

Cost is \$5.00 for shuttle service.


