



Capital City Corvette Club Points Program

The Capital City Corvette Club would like to say thank you to the members that have helped make our club a success each year by participating in numerous events through the year. Their efforts not only benefit the club, but fellow entrants and the membership as a whole. We say thank you by awarding points for their participation. At the end of the season we give awards to those that ranked in the top ten. There have always been questions as to how one ranks in the top ten so we would once again like to outline the points program so if you would like to work towards an award next year, you will know how to begin.

If at any time you have a questions about the points program, you should contact the Points Director or the Competition Director.

Points Program Rules for 1999

- 1. All events sponsored by the Capital City Corvette Club (CCCC) or NCCC Regionally Sanctioned will be considered for points. These are the only events which will be considered CCCC sanctioned.
- 2. Thirty days notice must be given before an event. Under special circumstances, the competition director can make exceptions. In most cases, "notice" is defined as <u>an announcement in the CCCC newsletter</u>.
- CCCC points will be awarded on the following basis:
 - A. **Competition Points** Available to NCCC members with their NCCC number through the Capital City Corvette Club.
 - Travel points will not be included in the CCCC totals.
 - Club members participating without a corvette will be awarded points as if they were in a corvette.
 - Points will be award using the tables on pages 9-2 through 9-5 of the National Council of Corvette Clubs Sanctioned Competition Program 1996-1999 (aka NCCC rulebook).
 - B. Participation Points Available to all CCCC members.
 - 2 Attending a CCCC General Membership Meeting.
 - 2 Attending a CCCC Social Event.
 - Additional point for arriving at the Meeting or Social Event with a Corvette (either riding in, driving, or towing it).
 - Spectating at any CCCC or Regionally sanctioned/sponsored competition event (maximum of 4 points per day).
 - Participation in any CCCC or Regionally sanctioned/sponsored competition event (maximum of 6 points per day).
 - Additional participation points if the event is the designated club event of the month (social or competition).
 - 10 Attending the CCCC banquet.
 - 10 Entering your Corvette in any club-sanctioned Car Show or Parade.
 - 20 Holding an elected office.
 - 10 Enrolling/sponsoring a new CCCC master member.

Participation Points continued from previous page

- Writing an article used in the CCCC Newsletter. Article must be ½ page in length (maximum of 10 points per newsletter). Articles published will be at editor's discretion.
- Per hour working at any CCCC event or assisting in the production of newsletter. Maximum worker points earned for each event are as follows:
 - 2 points for newsletter and 10 points for race, rallye, concours, or car show events.
- 5 Attending the Region Banquet.
- 10-25 Attending the NCCC Convention (minimum and maximum). The number of points awarded is dependent on the events participated in.
- 20 Chairing or Co-Chairing a race, concours, rallye, or car show event (no worker points given).
- 10 Chairing or Co-Chairing a social event (no worker points given).
- Working or participating in a convention sponsored planning trip as approved by the Board
- 4. Awards will be presented at the annual CCCC Awards Banquet for the following:
 - Top 10 point totals for participation points.
 - Minimum of top 1/3 of competitors for competition points.
- 5. The competition season will be from January 1 through December 31.
- 6. Each member is responsible for getting points information for non-club sponsored events to the points director in a timely manner.

I have attempted to list those events that counted for points this year. I hope I have everything, but I could have missed an event. The intent is to make members aware of events that counted for points in 1999 so if anyone is interested in competing for 2000, you will have an better idea of what may be required. For a complete listing of 1999 events that counted in the points total you should contact Phil Hanses.

Costs are \$20.00 per person for dinner entree.






