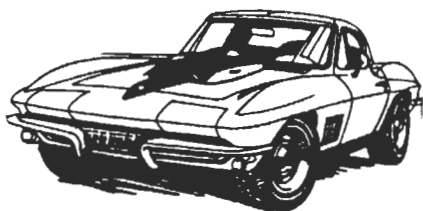

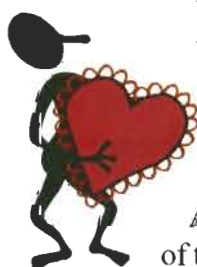

A club calendar survey was passed out to the members present. Everyone was encouraged to mark your preferences from 1-5 for the year. Write in any comments you may have. Also, write if you would like to participate or work the event.

Anyone who attends Governor's Meetings to sell convention shirts will receive 10 participation points. We cannot sell our shirts in Chicago, but we can at the Kalamazoo Swap Meet.

There are 2,019 newly renovated Guest Rooms. Each room is 300 feet and features one king or two double beds.

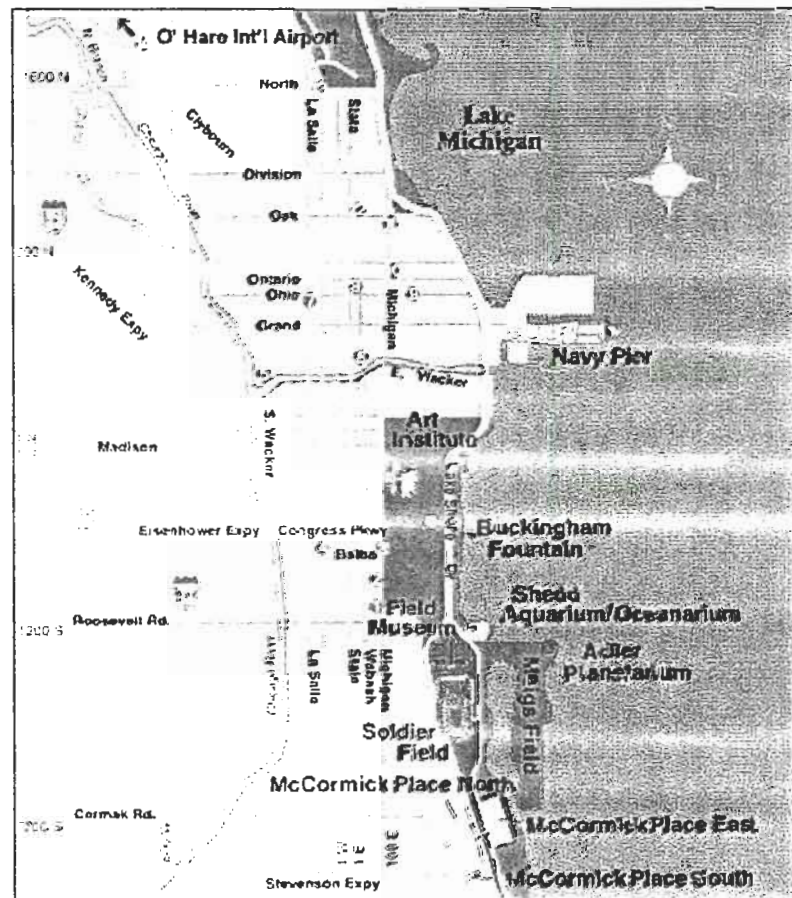
