NCCC Governor's Meeting February 2000

The meeting started with a reaffirmation of the various officers and committees.

Officer Reports

Sergeant of Arms – Door prizes have been donated, cookbooks are still available. The cookbooks can be purchased at a cost of \$5.00.

Treasurer – NCCC has had an increase in revenue year-to-date in comparison with last this time last year. Expenses have decline year-to-date when compared to last year. As of 2/18 the Charity balance was at \$43,191.74.

Public Relations – National has a variety of advertisements running in various Corvette magazines. A few magazines have expressed interest in running articles relating to local events, and car stories. In you are interested in writing a Corvette related article for possible publication in one of the Corvette magazines, please prepare the article (complete with pictures) and turn it in. This year NCCC will have a booth the Chevy Vette Fest, Bloomington, Carlisle, and Bowling Green. A '57 Corvette beer stein is available for \$49 + 6.50 shipping. Call Don Adams of Central City Produce at 270-754-1992, if you are interested in purchasing any.

Pat Dolan – The transplant games will be held at Walt Disney World June 24-25. NCCC is a Gold Level Sponsor for the games. So far Corvette Cleveland and Buckeye Corvette Club are 100% club for the purchase of raffle tickets.

Competition – The competition committee plans to follow the existing schedule and procedure. RCDs have received the final points standing. The standings are also posted on the website. 1999 patch orders are verified.

Membership – As of 02/25 NCCC membership is 13,341. A goal has been set to increase membership to 16,000 members this year. A new membership brochure is being printed.

Parliamentarian -21 clubs are participating in the newsletter contest. The bylaw committee will be accepting bylaw change request up to the convention meeting.

Editor – Send information to Loretta Spinrad for addition to blue bars. To be included in the next issue, information must be in by April. Try to include future events, as to encourage other NCCC members to participate in your events.

Business Manager – If an accident occurs, it should be reported to Dan and the insurance company. Be sure to get the waivers signed for all events.

Additional Reports

FCOA (Future Corvette Owners of America) currently has 1035 members. New application forms are coming out. All membership renewal packages have been mailed out. Please contact Rose if you do not get one within the next month. Also contact Rose to purchase a new rulebook (\$7).

New Business – Renewal packages are currently mailed out bulk mail. A motion, from the floor, has been made to mail renewal packages 1st class. This projected cost difference is approximately \$8000. The change will be reviewed by the finance committee, and the vote is to be held at the next scheduled governors meeting. Based on the vote taken at the Capital City Corvette Club's March General Membership meeting, CCCC will vote NO to mailing out the packet first class. Based on that same vote CCCC, if just the membership card was mailed out, a 1st class vote would be YES.
