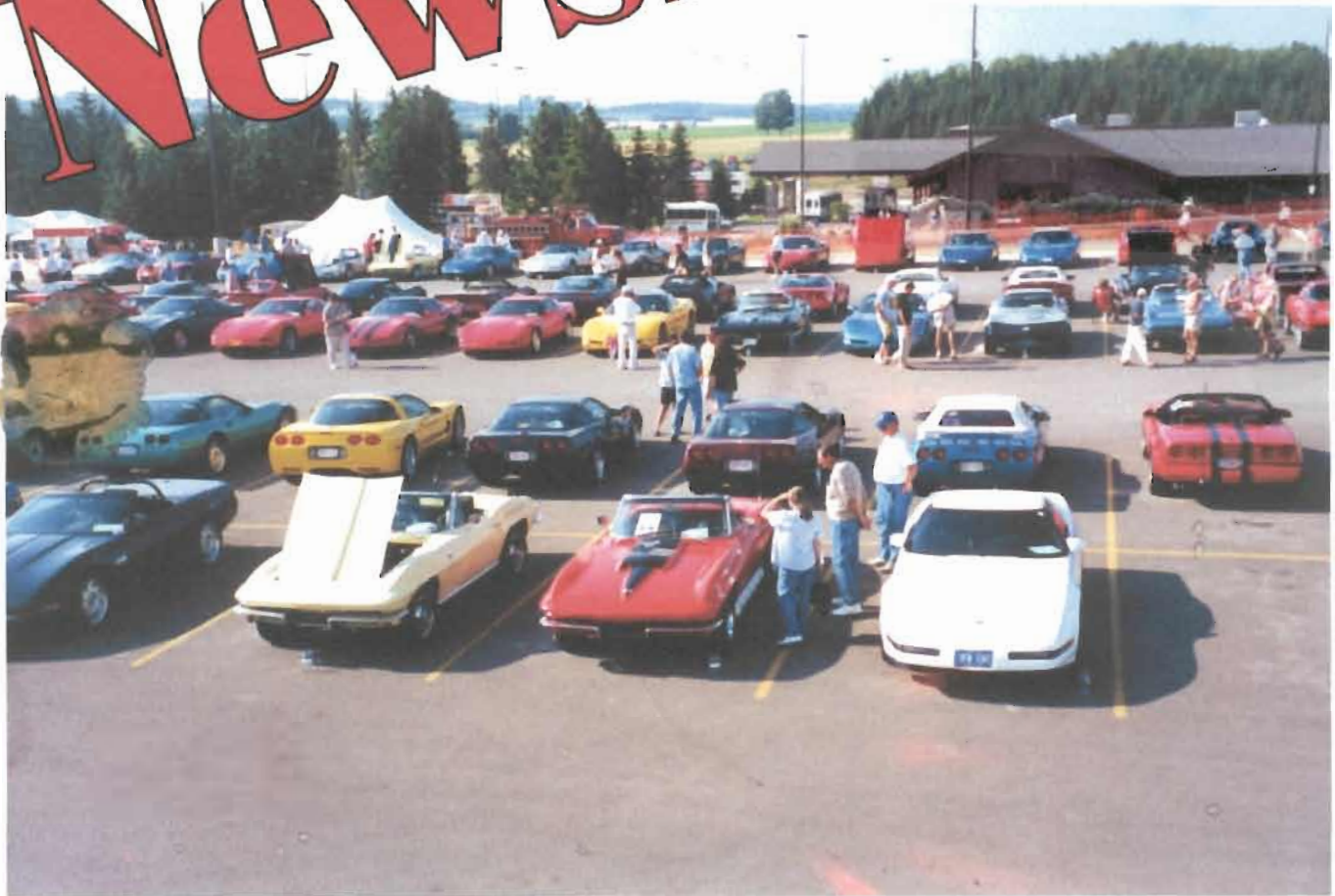

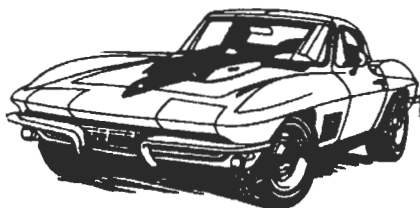

Treasurer – NCCC treasury report given. Please see me if you would like to see a copy. Membership and goals are currently being reviewed.

Sponsorship – We saw an increased involvement with major sponsors, at convention.
