Governors Report

On February 24 I attended my first Governors Meeting as your Governor in St. Louis, Missouri.

The Director of Sponsorship reported that NCCC has a new major sponsor in Zip Products. She talked of the importance of supporting all of the sponsors by purchasing their products. These companies donate a large amount of money to NCCC.

The Chevy website will begin listing club events beginning February 26.

The Convention Steering Committee Chairman reported that after reviewing the financial information from our 2000 NCCC Convention, they determined that the actual loss was \$16,596.29. A previous report indicated a loss of \$5,612.00. It is certainly disappointing that a number of people at the national level are determined to make the Convention look as bad as possible. It is my opinion that the NCCC officers bear much responsibility for the loss of money because many of these people offered little or no support of the Convention from the beginning. As a club, we can be proud of the fact that 94% of the people surveyed rated it good to excellent. It is frustrating that the committee used their "fuzzy math" to try to undermine what was otherwise a very successful event.

The 2001 Convention Chairman gave a report on the upcoming convention in Bowling Green. See the current issue of Blue Bars for more information.

I will have a few samples of 2001 Convention shirts at the March 7 meeting if anyone would like to order shirts.

<u>GOVERNOR</u>: Reported happenings at the February 24 meeting in St. Louis. See the report in the newsletter for more information.


<u>POINTS</u>: Nothing new to report. See the standings in the newsletter.
