# C.C.C.C. BOARD MEETING MINUTES 5-15-2001

<u>PRESIDENT</u>: Loretta has sent in our sanction for our low speed events.

We are concerned about getting workers for the events. Participation has been very poor this year. The board discussed several ideas to get club members involved again.

All members are encouraged to attend the June General Membership Meeting. This will be an important meeting, as we will be discussing the focus for our club events for the rest of the year.

GOVERNOR: Minutes from the May Governors Meeting were passed out.

Note: There was no General Membership Meeting in the month of May.

## Capital City Corvette Club Governors Report of May 5, 2001 Meeting

Convention Steering Committee Chairman Jim Harris gave a report on future convention locations.

- ▶ 2003 Convention will be in Maryland from Friday August 13 through Thursday April 21.
- There is a proposal for the 2004 convention but other proposals are still being accepted.

Director of Charity Pat Dolan gave a brief report on the happenings with the NKF.

VP of Membership Paul Bohanon reported the openings for NCCC officers for next year.

- FCOΛ info If someone is giving an FCOA membership as a gift and has a specific date in mind, it is requested that the application be sent in at least 30 day prior to the date needed.
- ► The bylaw regarding membership are being reviewed.
- There are 823 new members since last meeting with a goal of 15,500 total members this year. An effort on getting past members to re-join will be made.
- Paul would like to change NCCC image of being mainly an autocross group. He is suggesting people and clubs submit articles about their non-autocross events to Blue Bars. The new editors seem to very much agree with this vision.

VP of Competition Roger Mitchell gave his report.

- The rebate checks to regions for reimbursement of awards for people with 200 or more points have been sent out.
- New Drag record Group 1LB is now 14.24.
- There was one clarification regarding concourse events. All committee members agreed but I did not get the specifies. I will have them later if anyone is interested.

Secretary Gail Moore presented the minutes and they were approved as printed.

Public Relations and Webmaster Laurie Schwab reported that the NCCC website stats.

There have been over 71,000 hits on the main page at the rate of 4,500 per month which is up over 1,000 from last year.

Blue Bars editors Doug & Mary Hanson reported on Blue Bars.

- They are requesting club newsletters because would like to know what clubs are doing besides competition.
- They are requesting articles about anything that clubs are doing for fun be submitted.
- Deadline for the next issue is June 1 with a mail date in the third week of July.

2002 Convention Director Jim Krebs reported that the planning for the convention in Indianapolis is on schedule.

2001 Convention Director Deb Murphy reported on this years convention.

- As of April 30<sup>th</sup> the registration numbers are as follows: 644 adult registrations, 16 day passes, 356 for banquet, 195 for High Speed, 264 for Low Speed, 70 for Record Drags, 150 for Bracket Drags, 149 for Rallye (old limit of 150 raised to 175), 48 for Concours, 57 for the Car Show, and 89 for the Funkhana.
- ► Hotel confirmations will be made based on your registration number.
- The picnic on Monday has been canceled being that it did not logistically work with the other Monday events.
- Shirt sales at convention will be limited to Golf shirts, T-shirts, and other leftover styles.
- The first car off at the rallye will be at 7:30. You can choose your time out when you register.

I had the opportunity to observe some of the convention meeting on Friday evening. Many things were familiar but I decided to let them make their own mistakes. For example; no early registration on Friday (we used Friday to work out any bugs and lighten the load on Saturday).

#### New Business

Deb Murphy requested that NCCC become a lifetime business partner of the Museum for \$2,500. The motion was tabled and referred to the Finance Committee.

#### Old Business

There had been talk of trying to get the US Postal Service to issue a special Corvette stamp in 2003, the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary. It was suggested that contacting your US Representatives and Senators may help this happen.
