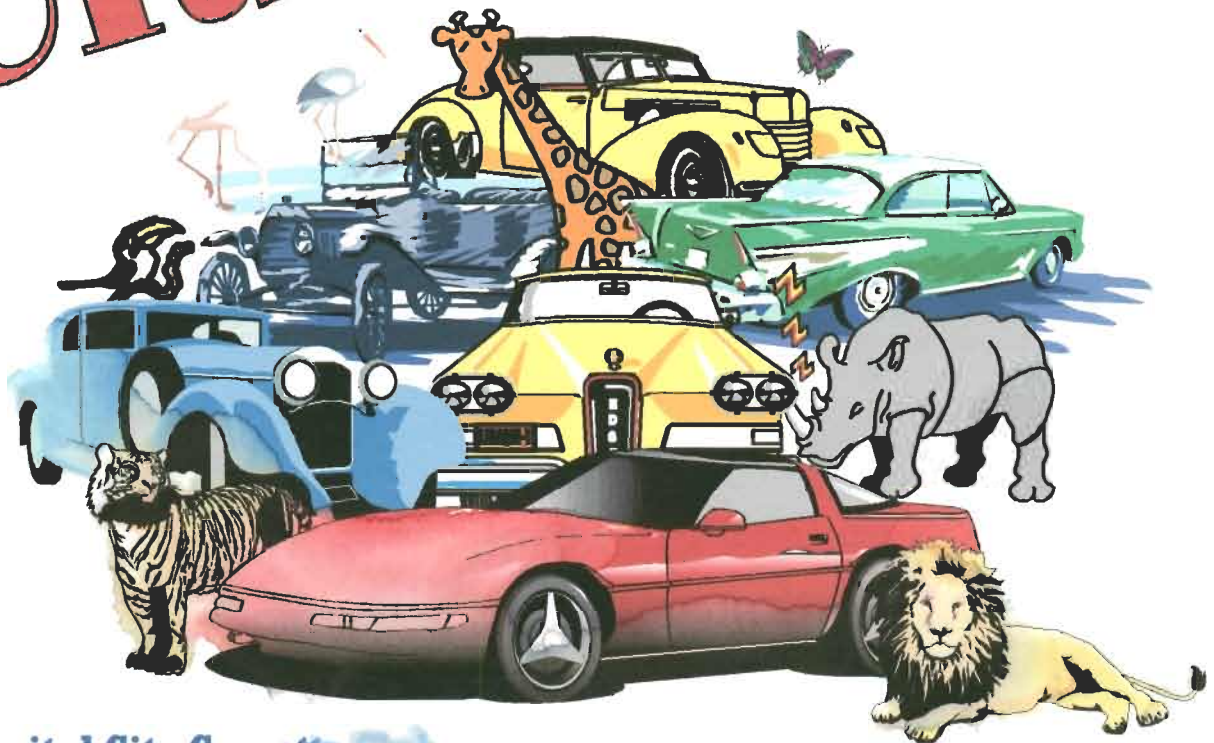

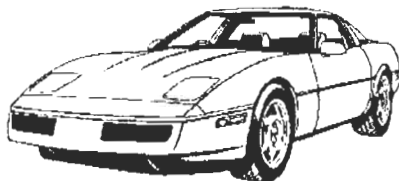

Capital City Corvette Club Governors Report of June 24, 2001 Meeting

The meeting was called to order by President Dick Yanko at the annual convention at Bowling Green, Kentucky.

VP of Competition Roger Mitchell gave his report.

- ▶ Points standings as of June 21 were presented.
- ▶ There are two new drag records. New Group III DPA record is 9.43 and new Group 1 B record is 13.68.
- ▶ There was one clarification requested regarding Travel Points for NCCC members who live more than 50 miles from their clubs home city. The competition committee was asked to define what constitutes a members home. They decided that this was a membership issue and not a competition issue. They were asked if proof is required for change of address and if required, what type of proof of change of address. Their response was whichever complies with the rules of Membership.

Director of Charity Pat Dolan gave a brief report.

- ▶ Tickets for next years raffle car will be printed in July. Hopefully by having tickets available earlier more tickets will be sold.
- ▶ The price for the 2001 Z06 is \$44,600 with the Museum Delivery package.

Convention Steering Committee Chairman Jim Harris gave a report on future convention locations.

- ▶ The 2002 Convention in Indianapolis was briefly discussed.
- ▶ 2003 Convention will be in Maryland from Friday August 13 through Thursday April 21.
- ▶ There is a proposal for the 2004 convention in the Midwest but other proposals are still being accepted.

Director of Sponsorship Deb Lindsay gave a brief report on her activities.

Business Manager Dan Skinner gave his report.

- ▶ A K&K Insurance Representative will be in St. Louis for the September Governors meeting.
- ▶ A spectator was struck by an out of control car at an event in Montana. The spectator was not hurt too badly but had not signed the waiver. No word yet on possible lawsuits. Courses need to be set up so these kinds of things do not happen.

Secretary Gail Moore presented the minutes from the May 5 meeting.

- ▶ Minutes were approved with minor revisions.

Parliamentarian Roger Thomas gave his report.

- ▶ The Newsletter Contest is complete. Awards will be presented at the Banquet Friday night.

- ▶ Paul has a goal of 16,000 NCCC members by the September Governors meeting.

FCOA reports an enrollment of 1369 members.

Blue Bars editors Doug & Mary Hanson reported on Blue Bars.

- ▶ The current issue is at the printers for a mailing in mid July.
- ▶ The deadline for the Convention Issue is September 1.

Treasurer Jay Hommer reported the account balances.

- ▶ The Finance Committee will vote on becoming a Lifetime Business Partner of the Museum for \$2500 at the September meeting.
- ▶ A Treasurers Report was passed out.
