CAPITAL CITY CORVETTE CLUB GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES 01/02/02

Phil Hanses, our new president, opened the meeting by welcoming the new officers and thanking the past officers for all their hard work.

SECRETARY: Rich Bratschi, our new secretary, had no report for this meeting.

<u>PUBLIC RELATIONS</u>: Simon Reiffer, our new public relations director, reported that he had reserved Richard's Restaurant for the monthly meeting place through March of 2002 and would reserve it for the rest of the year if the club approved. The club approved it. Simon asked who to contact at Holt Auto since they have been a key supporter of the club.

<u>MEMBERSHIP</u>: Our new membership director, Greg Kapp, reported that he would be putting an ad together to place in the Lansing State Journal and the local community papers to attract new members. Greg suggested it should run in the early spring. He also planned to solicit the Chevy dealerships to have the brochure placed in the new Corvettes.

Mexican Train Night



If you would like to bring a snack or non-alcoholic beverage to share, it would be appreciated. If you don't have time, don't worry about it. There always seems to be more than enough.




Warning - Pay close attention to addresses. We have the first village address. The house numbers jump from 6221 to 832 at our house.
