From the President . . .

Thanks go out to the Jackson Corvette Club for inviting us to their hog roast after the parade. The food was delicious.

It is encouraging to see the number of people who are participating in our club functions so far this year. Everything we have done has been well attended. It sure makes the effort put forth by our members who organize these activities seem worthwhile. We will continue to strive to offer a variety of activities that will appeal to the interests of a wide range of members. We certainly will offer something for everyone.

We picked up four new members since the last newsletter. John and Sandy Bechtel of Lansing joined at the May General Membership Meeting. They have a red '95 coupe. The Board of Directors voted to make two minor adjustments to the points program at the May 22nd meeting. They are meant to clarify the way points are awarded to participants in ear shows and parades. The changes are as follows:

Ten points will be awarded for entering any car show as a <u>club event</u>. This means that the event must be listed as a club event in the newsletter and not carry a NCCC sanction number. For instance, the Horsepower at the Zoo car show will be

worth 10 points because it is listed in the newsletter but does not carry a NCCC sanction. A show that carries a NCCC sanction number is considered a competition event which is worth 3 points.

Three points will be awarded for entering any parade as a <u>club event</u>. For instance, the Marshall parade is considered a club event because there was organized participation as a club, it was on the Club calender, and a flyer appeared in the newsletter.

The main adjustment to the above is the addition of the phrase "as a Club Event". A "Club Event" can be defined as having a flyer or notice printed in the newsletter, appearing on the Club calendar, and having an organized effort to attend as a club.

I have been asked about the appropriate time to order dinner at the General Membership Meetings. Many people would prefer to eat before the meeting so they may be more involved, less distracted, able to take notes, etc. during the meeting. If you would prefer to come early to eat, I ask that you try arrive early enough to order and eat your meal prior to 7:00 if possible. Please ask to be seated in the meeting room so that the restaurant management knows that having our meetings there is a benefit to the restaurant. For those who cannot or prefer not to eat before the meeting, we will continue to order as a group around 7:15 so we can minimize the interruptions to the meeting caused by the wait staff.

Capital City Corvette Club Points Program

Purpose - The purpose of the CCCC Points Program is to encourage and reward members to attend and/or participate in CCCC and NCCC Michigan Region sanctioned or sponsored events.

- 1. Eligible Events All events sponsored or co-sponsored by the Capital City Corvette Club (CCCC) or competition events sanctioned by the National Council of Corvette Clubs (NCCC) Michigan Region will be eligible for points. Additionally, special events not normally eligible may become eligible by a majority vote of the CCCC Board of Directors.
- 2. Notice of Event Thirty days notice must be given before an event. Under special circumstances, the competition director can make exceptions. In most cases, "notice" is defined as an announcement or flyer in the CCCC newsletter.
- 3. Annual Awards The competition season will run from January 1 through December 31. Members who accumulate enough points to finish in the "Top Ten" of the highest points at the end of each competition season will receive awards. Awards will be presented at the annual CCCC Awards Banquet.
- 4. Additional Awards In addition to the "Top Ten" awards, additional awards may be presented to members who compete and excel in the NCCC Michigan Region Competition Points Program. Additional awards will be presented at the discretion of the CCCC Competition Director or President.
- 5. Member Responsibilities Each member is responsible for notifying the CCCC Points Director of their attendance and/or participation at non-club sponsored events in order to receive the appropriate points.
- **6.** Chairperson Responsibilities Event Chairpersons are responsible for submitting an attendance list and/or workers list to the Points Director.
- 7. **Point Values** Points will be awarded as follows:
 - 2 For attending a CCCC General Membership Meeting or Social Event.
 - Additional point for arriving at the Meeting or Social Event with a Corvette, either driving, riding in, or towing it.
 - For each CCCC or Regionally sanctioned/sponsored competition event <u>attended</u> as a spectator. A competition event is defined as having a Michigan Region sanction number.

- For each CCCC or Regionally sanctioned/sponsored competition event <u>attended</u> as an entrant. A competition event is defined as having a Michigan Region sanction number.
- 10 For attending the annual CCCC Awards Banquet.
- 5 For attending the annual NCCC Michigan Region Banquet.
- 10 For entering your Corvette in any Car Show as a Club Event.
- 3 For entering your Corvette in any Parade as a Club Event.
- 20 For holding a CCCC elected office.
- 10 For enrolling or sponsoring a new CCCC master member.
- For writing an article used in the CCCC newsletter. Article must be at least ½ page in length. Articles published will be at the CCCC Editor's discretion. Articles or reports required by an elected officer are not eligible.
- 2 For assisting in the production of the CCCC newsletter as determined by the Editor.
- 2 For working at each CCCC sponsored or co-sponsored competition or fundraising event.
- 4 For each full day in attendance at the annual NCCC Convention.
- 20 Chairing or Co-Chairing a CCCC sponsored or co-sponsored race, concours, rallye, or car show event. Maximum of 20 points per competition season and no "worker points" for the chaired event.
- 10 Chairing or Co-Chairing a CCCC Social Event. Maximum of 10 points per competition season.

The Capital City Corvette Club Board of Directors approved this Points Program at their May 2002 meeting.

To the Club members too busy to fix a gourmet meal... Tastes great and is quick and easy to make. Must be, cuz I've been making both since about the age of 10....

Hamburger-Hot Potato Salad

2월 lbs. Potatoes

1/4 cup Chopped Onion

1/2 cup Salad Oil

2 Tbsp. Parsley

½ cup Vinegar

1 lb. Hamburger (chuck)

2 tsp. Salt & Pepper

1/2 tsp. Garlic Salt

½ cup Pimento (optional)

 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 1 tsp. Sugar

Directions:

- 1. Cook potatoes till tender in skins cool, peel, and slice (measure 6 cups)
- 2. Combine oil, vinegar, salt, pepper, onions, and parsley with potato slices.
- 3. Refrigerate for about 2 hours.
- 4. Brown hamburger, stirring to keep meat separate. Sprinkle with garlic salt.
- 5. Refrigerate same as potatoes.
- 6. Pre-heat oven @ 400 degrees for 15 minutes.
- 7. In a 2 quart greased casserole dish, layer potato mixture with meat browned (reserve $\frac{1}{2}$ cup meat).
- 8. Arrange reserved meat in rows on top. Then decorate with strips of pimento along side.
- 9. Bake covered for 30 minutes. Makes about 6 servings..

And now for dessert

Wacky Cake

1½ cups Flour

½ tsp. Salt

1 cup Sugar

1 Tbsp. Vinegar

½ cup Cocoa

1 tsp. Vanilla

1 tsp. Baking Soda

1/3 cup Salad Oil

1 cup Cold Water

Raisins or Nuts to suit (can also use cut-up cherries) (optional)

Directions:

- 1. Mix flour, sugar, cocoa, baking soda, and salt.
- 2. Add vinegar, vanilla, salad oil, and cold water. Beat all until smooth.
- 3. Pour batter into a greased 9" square pan.
- 4. Add your choice of either the raisins, cherries, or nuts (optional).
- 5. Bake @ 350 degrees for 35 minutes.
- 6. Remove from oven and let cool. Top with favorite frosting.

Note: You can use some cherry juice in place of some water when using cherries... adds a little flavor! I guarantee that if I can make it (and have since a young lad) anyone can!






