Help! We Need Your Help!

The Capital City Corvette Club has one event each year which raises money to help pay the expenses involved with running the club. This event is the annual Figure 8 Low Speed weekend coming up on Saturday and Sunday, July 27th and 28th at Spartan Speedway in Mason. Racers bring their Corvettes from all over Michigan and the surrounding states for a fun-filled weekend of serious competition. After Saturday's events are complete, we hold a bar-b-que at the track for the participants and workers. The club needs you to volunteer some of your time, even if it is only an hour or two, on Saturday or Sunday (or both days if you can) to help make this fund raiser a success. "What can I do?" you ask. Below I have listed the things we need help with.

Track set up - Several workers are needed to set up timing equipment, set and mark pylons, and make sure safety equipment is in the right place so the events can start on schedule. Set up work is complete prior to the start of any racing.

Registration - Two or three workers are needed to collect entrant fees & fill out required paperwork. Registration work is normally complete before the beginning of each day's racing starts.

Tech Inspection - Two or three mechanically-inclined workers are needed to check cars for safety items such as proper helmets, worn tie rods, etc. Usually some of the participants help out in this area because they know better which cars belong in which class. Knowledgeable help is greatly appreciated.

Timing (in the timing tower) - Two or three workers are needed in the tower to record times at the end of each run and radio the results to the workers at the results board. One of the workers is responsible for zeroing out the timer before a new car is allowed to start.

Timing (at the results board) - Two workers are needed to record the driver's times on the results board in the pit area so the driver can check his or her time after completing their run. The times are radioed to the board from the workers in the timing tower.

Staging - One worker is needed to radio the car number of the "on deck" car to the timing workers. The staging worker is also responsible to direct cars onto the track at the proper time so the event runs as smoothly and quickly as possible.

Starter - One worker is needed to line up cars at the start and wave the green flag to start the run and wave the checkered flag at the completion of the second lap to signal the driver and the timing workers of the end of the run. The starter is also responsible to red flag a car in the event of a problem with the car or a problem on the track. The starter is in radio contact with staging worker and timing workers.

Corner workers - Two to four workers are needed to watch for pylons that have been knocked down by a driver and to signal the timing workers so that the correct penalty is assessed to the driver. The corner worker is also responsible for resetting the pylons at the completion of a run when necessary. They may also be required to sweep sod and dirt off the track in the event of a driver going off course.

Relief workers - It would be good to have a couple of people available to replace a worker if he or she needs a break or has to leave in the middle of an event.

In addition to the above jobs, help may also be needed to set up and prepare for the Saturday evening bar-b-que.

Note: Each event (5 on Sat. & 3 on Sun.) takes from 1 to 1½ hours to complete depending on the number of cars entered. It seems to work best if workers can work a job for a complete event. There will be time to switch jobs or workers between events and at the lunch break. We are partnering with the Huron Valley Corvette Club to host these events, and they will be providing workers also.

A sign up sheet will be passed around at the July 3rd meeting where you will be able to select times and jobs for which you are willing to work. Many hands make light work. Thanks for volunteering your time for the benefit of your club. Please call Phil or Cindy at 989-587-3422 if you can't be at the meeting but would like to placed on the workers list.

What Is a Low Speed Event Anyway?

Included in the newsletter each month are many flyers advertising Low Speed (LS) and Matching Time Trial (MTT) events throughout Michigan. With so many new members this year I thought I'd write this article to try to answer one question I'm sure many of you have. What is a low speed event anyway?

Our club is a member of the National Council of Corvette Clubs (NCCC). NCCC is divided into 16 separate regions, and we are part of the Michigan Region. One purpose of NCCC is to provide a sanctioned competition program to encourage interactivity between individual Corvette Clubs. NCCC sanctions many types of competition events, one of them being a Low Speed Autocross event.

In the interest of space I will limit this article to explaining what a Low Speed Autocross event is. I will write about other types of events in future issues. According to the NCCC rule book, a Low Speed event is one in which the maximum obtainable speed is less than 80 mph. So don't be deceived by the term "low speed" because in terms of Corvettes, 80 mph can be considered "Low Speed"!

Low Speed Autocross events are usually held on a parking lot or a race track. A course is set up using pylons. In order to be challenging, such a course is never easy; it might be full of curves, slaloms, and gates. Cars race against the clock, not wheel to wheel, and a time penalty is assessed for each pylon a driver hits. Safety is always a top priority at any speed event. With that in mind, the driver is required to wear a helmet. Current rules require a SNELL Foundation or DOT approved helmet dated 1995 or later.

Cars are separated into groups and classes as designated in the NCCC rule book. There are four groups: Group I-S, Group I, Group II, and Group III. Each group is further divided into classes. Men compete against men, and women compete against women. For example, I have a 1993 Corvette with no engine or body modifications and keep my street tires on for racing. This puts me in the Group I G-S class. The intent of the classes is to insure that I am competing with drivers in cars that have similar capabilities to determine who is the most skilled and fastest driver. The driver with the fastest time in each class will receive a trophy or other award. In addition to the class winners, the driver with the fastest time of the day is given the FTD award.

This club annually hosts Low Speed events at Spartan Speedway in Mason. Participants bring their Corvettes from across the state and even the country to our events. We rent the track for a weekend and set up a figure 8 course. The course is designed with safety in mind. Pylons are placed in such a way to keep cars from hitting the wall in the event of loss of control. In all my years with the club, I have never seen anyone hit the wall in a low speed event.

This year we are partnering with the Huron Valley Corvette Club to host eight separate low speed events on July 27th and 28th with five being held on Saturday and three on Sunday. Each event consists of each registered driver being given two (or sometimes three) runs per event. In our case, a run consists of two timed laps around our figure 8 course. The fastest drivers at our event can complete a run in the 38 to 40 second range. Depending on the number of drivers, an event usually takes from 60 to 90 minutes to complete.

Entering speed events is a great, fun, and safe way to test your driving ability while competing against other drivers. If this sounds like something you may be interested in, please talk to me at the July 3rd meeting or call me at 989-587-3422. I will be happy to give you more detailed information and offer any advice that I can. If you aren't ready to jump into racing just yet, you could go along on a "fun run". Fun runs take place after each day's events are complete. You have a chance to ride along with another driver to experience the thrill of the low speed event. They are designed to introduce people to the sport of autocrossing by allowing them to either drive or ride in a vehicle on an autocross course.

Even if you're not interested in racing, I encourage you to come out and help work the events on July $27^{\text{th'}}$ or 28^{th} . This is the one big money-making activity that raises the funds needed for club operations. Help is always needed and very much appreciated. I have a separate article explaining the variety of ways to help later in this issue.

I hope you now have a better understanding of what a low speed event is. If not, feel free to talk to me or another member who has participated in the past to learn more.

OUR WEEKEND GETAWAY






