What Exactly is a Rallye Anyway?

The National Council of Corvette Clubs and its Michigan Region holds many competitive events for its members. Last month I discussed what a Low Speed Event was. This month I will attempt to explain what a Rallye is.

A typical rallye involves following directions, looking for clues, and answering questions to get from a starting point to a often unknown ending point. It takes two people to participate, a driver (of course) and a navigator.

There are three basic types of rallyes. The Time-Speed-Distance Rallye, the Gimmick Rallye (more commonly known as a Fun Rallye), and the Chance Rallye (a Poker Rallye or a Game Rallye). The kind most often found in Michigan are the Fun Rallye and the Poker Rallye.

The flyers for all Michigan rallyes are included in our newsletter. The flyer includes the specific details such as date, time, entry fee, and the location of the starting point of the rallye.

When you arrive at the starting location, you will fill out a registration form, sign a standard NCCC waiver, pay your entry fee, and go through a tech inspection to make sure your car is road-worthy. Shortly thereafter, there will be a short "drivers meeting". Both the driver and the navigator should attend and be prepared to take notes. The drivers meeting is where the rules of the rallye are presented. You will probably be given a set of printed general instructions a/k/a Generals. The Generals describe the basic abbreviations used in the route instructions. For example: TL = Traffic light, SS = Stop Sign. If there are any last minute changes, they are also discussed. The participants have the opportunity to ask questions of the rallyemaster during the drivers meeting.

The most common type of rallye is the Fun Rallye. In a Fun Rallye cars are sent out in one or two minute intervals. At the starting point, each team is given a set of route instructions. The route instructions vary greatly from one rallye to another. What I will describe here is how a typical CCCC rallye is set up. Our instructions are usually quite straight forward, meaning there is not a lot trickery involved.

An example might be:

R at TL (which means turn Right at Traffic Light)

How many ducks? _____ (You would then be looking for some thing or place that has a number of ducks displayed. You would count the ducks and write your answer in the space provided.)

C _ _ B _ _ (You would be looking for sign that had two prominent words, one beginning with C an the other beginning with B. Cold Beer for example.)

S at SS (which means go Straight at Stop Sign)


The two clues fall between the two route instructions. In our case, it means the answers can be found after we turn right at the traffic light but before we reach the stop sign. In most rallyes, clues can be found on either side of the road. An asterisk is commonly used before the clue to note that the clue is on the left side of the road.

Each answer in the rallye will have a point value. At the end of the rallye, all of your correct answers are totaled up. Distance traveled in the rallye is often a factor in your final score. If you go off course or turn around to go back to answer a question you should deduct the mileage from your ending mileage. The difference between your mileage and the rallyemasters mileage is deducted from your point total. At the end of the rallye the team with the highest score is the winner and receives a trophy or other award.

Cindy and I have participated in dozens of rallyes throughout the years. They are all different in the way they are set up and at all levels of difficulty, from very easy to nearly impossible. CCCC rallyes are normally quite simple and enjoyable.

After the abbreviated August 7th meeting we are holding a mini-rallye so our members can learn the basics of rallying. It will start at Richards by 7:30. I promise it will be easy and short with the end point being a nice place for dessert.

If you find that you might enjoy doing rallyes, Cindy and I will be happy to give you tips we have learned from our many years of rallying. We plan on entering many rallyes this year and would love to have fellow members join us.
