From the President . . .

Wow! What a year its been. Everything we've done this year has been very well attended. I didn't make it to Mackinaw City, but I hear our club was very well represented up there.

Our Horsepower at the Zoo Charity Car Show was a huge success. We attracted 50% more cars than last year. By selling advertisements on the flyers and the back of the t-shirts, we covered our expenses and made a profit of very close to \$2,000! All of this money will go towards the Equipment Fund at the Zoo's Animal Hospital. The folks at the Zoo are very appreciative of our efforts.

At last count, we have 28 new club members this year! With so many new people, I thought I'd take a little time to talk about our Points Program.

The stated purpose of the program is to encourage and reward members to participate in CCCC and NCCC Michigan Region sanctioned or sponsored events. What is a "sanctioned or sponsored event"? The member clubs of the NCCC Michigan Region put on (meaning sanction) race, rallye, and car show events throughout the year. Our members accumulate "club points" by attending these events and are made aware of these events because the flyers are included in the newsletter each month.

Similarly, this club holds many "club social events" throughout the year which are eligible for "club points". These events can range from going out to eat to going away for a weekend trip or entering local parades or car shows. Except under special circumstances, thirty days notice must be given to all members prior to an event to be considered a "club social event". In most cases, "notice" is defined as a flyer in the club newsletter. This is what determines a "club social event" in which "club points" are available.

It has been club practice to offer no more than two club social events per month so our calendars don't become too full of club activities. When possible, we also try not to hold events on dates which conflict with other Michigan Region events. With the use of email, this year, more than ever, club members want to do things together outside of the normal organized "club social event". I am going on record as being in favor of these short notice get-togethers. It's great for the club as a whole. However, in the interest of fairness, these type of things cannot be considered for club points because of the above-mentioned rules.

If you are a new member and do not have a copy of the points program, you can call our Points Director, Jeff McQuade for a copy. He will also answer any questions you may have.

I know this all may seem a bit confusing. Each year, the points program is re-evaluated in an effort to make it less confusing and more fair for all members. I'm sure more progress will be made for next year.

On other subjects, we hope to be ready to take orders for new club shirts at the October 2nd meeting. I expect to have style, color, and pricing information available, so bring your checkbooks. If you know you won't be able to attend the meeting, I will mail you the info if you ask. It will also be available in future newsletters and on the web site.

We seem to have outgrown the available meeting room space at Richards. A committee has been appointed to check out other locations that may be better able to accommodate our needs.

Nominations for Board of Director positions will be accepted at the October and November meetings with the election in December. I have included a description of the responsibilities of each officer in this issue. Be sure to speak up if you are interested in running for an office.

Club Officer Duties

Nominations for club officers will be open at the October and November General Membership meetings. Below I have outlined the main responsibilities and duties of each office. Please consider running for one or more of these positions if you are interested in helping out. All positions are for a term of one year. Election of officers will take place at the December 4th meeting/dinner.

President - The President is responsible to preside over all general membership and board meetings. He/she should be able to attend most club functions, especially those which involve the public. He/she will is ultimately responsible to coordinate the operations and direction of the club. He/she is required to have held at least one club office prior to running for President.

Competition Director - The Competition Director is responsible for coordinating all competition events sponsored by the club. Typical duties include arranging dates and locations for events such as our annual autocross event at Spartan Speedway. He/she is also responsible to select the year-end awards for the Top Ten in the points standings. He/she is expected to attend the Michigan Region meetings and report back to the membership. Currently there are five meetings per year, and they are held at Richard's in Lansing the Tuesday evening before the scheduled NCCC Governors meetings. He/she is ultimately responsible for the points program. He/she will serve as the Club's Vice President and take over the duties of the President in his/her absence. Michigan Region event flyers are sent to the Competition Director and should be made available to the editor for inclusion in the newsletter.

Governor - The Governor is the club's link to NCCC. He/she will receive correspondence from NCCC and distribute it to the appropriate club officer. He/she is encouraged to attend NCCC Governors meetings which occur five times per year. Currently four are held in St. Louis, Missouri, and the other is held at the NCCC Convention. (The meeting location could change to Nashville, Tennessee, in the future.) The club reimburses the Governor for most expenses for attending the meetings.

Secretary - The Secretary is responsible to record the minutes and votes of all club meetings. He/she is responsible to provide a copy of all minutes to the editor for publication in the newsletter.

Treasurer - The Treasurer is responsible for keeping the financial records of the club, making payments of all club debts, and making bank deposits. A report of the financial activity of the club is to be made available or presented at the club meetings.

Membership Director - The Membership Director is in charge of promoting the club at events and recruiting new members. He/she will handle the paperwork involved in enrolling new members and processing renewals. He/she will also handle the promotional items given out by the club and NCCC. He/she is responsible for keeping an accurate membership list and providing that list to the editor at least twice a year for publication in the newsletter.

Social Director - The Social Director is in charge of coordinating or finding people to host all club social events. He/she will select and reserve a location to hold the annual club banquet. If a member would like to host a social event, it is the Social Director who checks for availability of dates on the club calendar before bringing the request to the Board.

Editor - The Editor is responsible for the production of the monthly newsletter. This involves gathering reports and articles, copying, assembling, and mailing the newsletter. The club leases a copy machine for newsletter production, which is kept at the editor's home. He/she is essentially the club "print shop" when copies of flyers and copies of other club information is needed. Knowledge of and access to computers if very helpful, if not essential, to be successful.

Public Relations Director - The Public Relations Director is responsible to help represent the club to the media, businesses, and the general public. He/she is encouraged to find advertisers for the newsletter, handle club sponsorship communications, and generally promote the club in a positive way.

Points Director - The Points Director is responsible for keeping track of member points totals and printing or presenting a monthly report. He/she will answer questions from members regarding the points program. Knowledge of spreadsheet software is helpful but not necessarily required to assist him/her in the job.

Public Relations . . .

The Horsepower at the Zoo car show was a big success. We had 98 cars registered, and everyone seemed to have a good time. Special thanks go out to all of the sponsors and event participants. In addition to raising funds for the Zoo Animal Hospital, the club gained five new members. We were also able to get information about our club out to many local Corvette owners.

We continue to place announcements about club meetings in the local newspapers. Membership has grown this year through a combination of these ads, the club brochure, and the web site. The following chart shows the number of hits to the club website each month this year.
