President Phil Hanses presented Carol Webster with a check for \$2,000 to the Potter Park Zoo, and Carol presented Phil with a photo album of pictures from the car show.

SECRETARY: No report.

<u>PUBLIC RELATIONS</u>: The car show at Pres Kool had a fantastic turnout. They were happy with the show and expressed interest in doing it again.

MEMBERSHIP: Renewals are due by November 6<sup>th</sup> to the club.

SOCIAL: Our golf outing is October 12, and we have 7 committed teams. We will be starting at 10:00 a.m. On October 26, we will be heading to Alma for dinner and dominoes. We will host BINGO on November 2 at Tamarack Apartments at 2:00 p.m. We will need volunteers to bring desserts and inexpensive prizes. SECRETARY: The ballots for officers will be in the December newsletter.

PUBLIC RELATIONS: Absent. No report.

<u>MEMBERSHIP</u>: Renewals are coming in. Discussion took place about the need to add value to club membership by having discounts at area merchants for club members, free club items, etc. Renewals are due by the November 6<sup>th</sup> meeting in order to get them to the region on time.
