From the President . . .

Well, the Corvette season is already half over now. We have tried to keep you busy with club activities, but we don't have much planned for August. This is partly due to the NCCC Convention going on later this month in Maryland. If you haven't been to a Convention before, I encourage you to try to attend one. Each year it is held in a different location, normally in July, but occasionally, such as this year, in June or August. The Convention is a week of Corvette fun with people from all around the country. I believe next year it will be held in Las Vegas. There is entertainment and parties most nights and trips to area attractions during the day. You don't have to bring your Corvette, but you will need it if you want to enter any of the competition events like rallyes, autocrossing, and drag racing. I've heard people say, however, that they enjoy the week more without their Corvette because they don't commit themselves to a lot of competitive events and it's more of a vacation.

The only planned social event for August is the trip to Mackinac City for Corvette Crossroads. If you know of something happening this month that other members may be interested in attending, just send me an email, and I will forward it to all the members with email.

The Horsepower at the Zoo show planning is in the final stages. Flyers have been printed and are being passed out at car shows. As of this writing, we still have about 600 or 700 left. The deadline for the pre-registration discount and a free T-shirt is August 16th. We need to pass out as many as we can by that date. If you are going to any car shows before then, please pick up some flyers from me at the August 6th meeting, or call me to make arrangements to get some earlier. The more cars we can get to the Zoo show, the more money we will be able to donate to the Zoo, so

please help get the flyers distributed.

One of the biggest expenses the club has is the production and mailing of the newsletter. Over the last three years we have spent over \$2800 on the lease and maintenance contract on our current copy machine. Thankfully, the lease is up at the end of August. At the July board meeting, the board approved the purchase of a Canon D660 copier/printer for an approximate cost of \$600. I have since learned that the operating costs (toner and drum cartridges) may be higher than what the Canon literature led me to believe. Originally, I was researching a Sharp AL-1540CS along with the Canon but thought the Canon was a better machine. I will do some more comparisons between these two machines to determine which will be a better value for the club in the long run. I'm sure that by purchasing either of these machines, we should see significant savings over what we have spent on the current machine.

Another big expense is the postage for mailing the newsletter. I'm wondering if people would be willing to pick up their newsletter at the meeting to save on postage. We would still have to mail to those who are unable to attend the meetings. Depending on the amount of participation, we may be able to save a good amount of money, especially during the summer months when the newsletter is bigger and costs more to mail. The extra work required to keep all of this straight may not be worth the trouble. I will talk more about this at the next meeting.

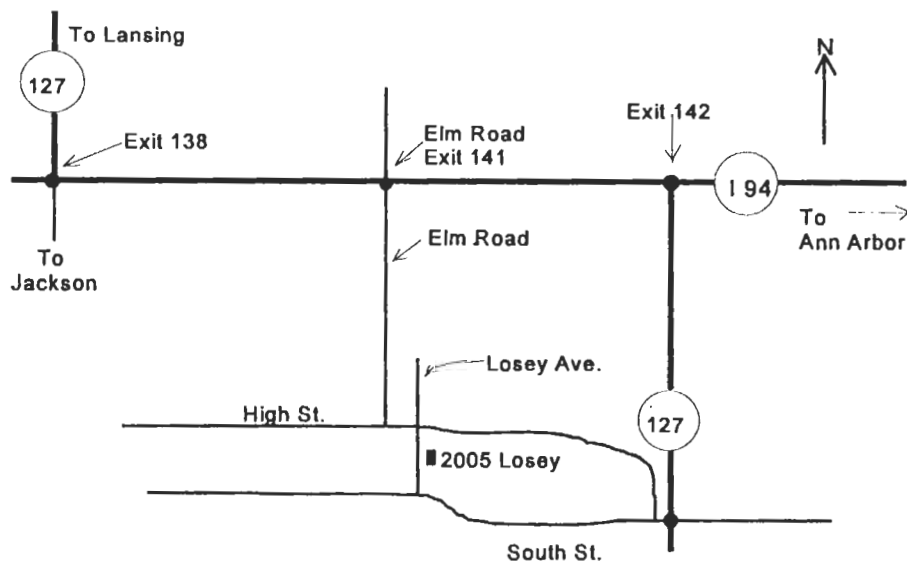

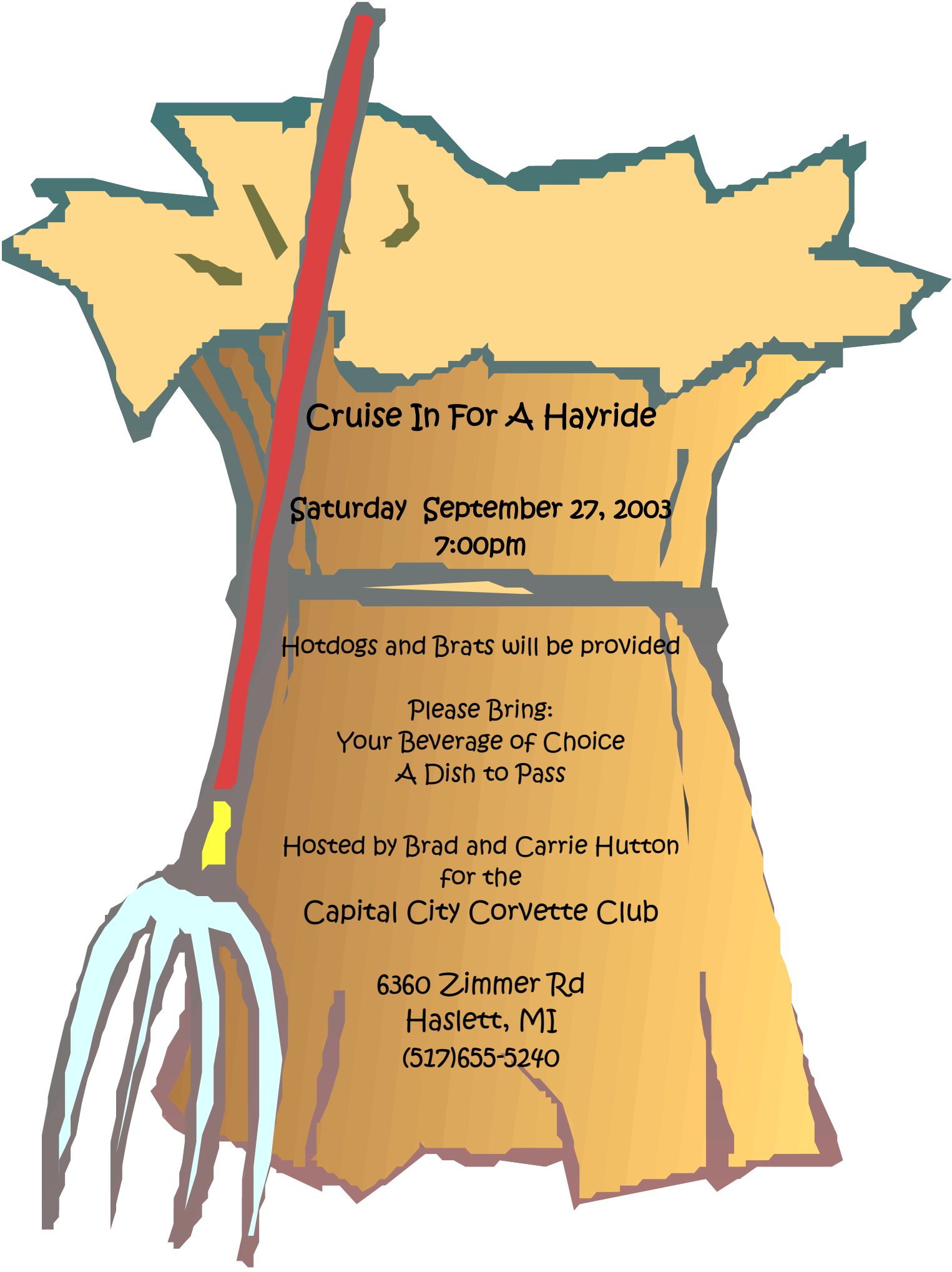
